







# Graysburg Hills & Golf Course

If you haven't played Graysburg Hills Golf Course, you're certainly missing a real



treat. This is a 27-hole fourand-a-half-star-rated golf course by Golf Digest that is located in one of the most scenic areas in East Tennessee. Rees Jones, one of America's great golf architects, designed the original 18 holes which opened in 1978. Edward

Lawrence Packard then added the mountain-top nine called "Chimney Top" in 1994. Unlike the other nines - "The Knobs" and "Fodderstack" - "Chimney Top" offers a true mountain golf feel with unmatched vistas. All three nines are beautiful and the highest maintenance standards are met.

There is no pretense here, just great golf in a peaceful, country setting with nature and rolling hills all around. There are 100 sand bunkers and six water

hazards. A continuous cart path winds through trees, hills and around water throughout the entire 27 hole layout.

Located between Greeneville and Johnson City, Graysburg Hills is just five minutes from Interstate 81,



#### Egwani Farms Golf Course originally opened in 1991 after a decades-old

farm was converted into a tournament-caliber golf course to serve both local and visiting golfers. The golf course has garnered numerous accolades, including recognition among Golf Digest magazine's "Places to Play," and has hosted numerous high profile competitive and charity golf events.



The name "Egwani" is Cherokee for "little river." The Little River borders the golf course for over a mile and figures prominently in the strategic makeup of the course. East Tennessee has an abundance of great golf courses. They are scenic, unique, and have a wide variety of slope rating and difficulty. There are over 60 courses found in East Tennessee, and these are some of the favorites that we highly recommend!

#### **CATTAILS AT MEADOWVIEW**



Located in Kingsport, Tennessee at the Meadowview Marriott, this golf course starts with a straight ahead par 5, and continues on the Front 9 with a sense of playing a links style beach resort

course. Then this unique Denis Griffiths layout changes to a mountain course on the back. With picturesque views of Bays Mountain, this is a very scenic, well maintained golf course. The back offers the feel of being in a nature preserve with woods and streams all around. The severe

elevation changes give the player a true mountain golf experience. Beware of holes 11, 12, and 13 known as The Cat Trap. Number 11 starts with a long and very uphill par 5, hard to reach in 2. Then 12 is a scenic downhill short par 3. Lastly 13 is one of the



most scenic on the course, with a long downhill view of this par 4. Stay and plays are offered year round at the Meadowview Resort. **CLINCHVIEW GOLF CLUB** 

We call Clinchview a "hidden gem" out in the country. Located in

Bean Station, between Knoxville and the Tri-Cities, this golf course is definitely worth the drive. If you haven't played it, you will find out quickly on holes 1, 2, and 3 that the greens have a lot of movement,



are fast and always in great shape. This country setting is very scenic with many elevation changes. Much of Clinchview is long and straight, however there are a couple drastic doglegs, blind shots, water, and woods to challenge the player. You have to play it, this is a fantastic course!



#### **CROCKETT RIDGE**

Located in Kingsport, Tennessee this is a very fun Thomas E. Clarke design. Right off the bat you will discover that the greens have plenty of undulation in them. Holes 1, 2, and

3 give you a good taste of that undulation



that you are in for over the course of your round. This is a very unique layout, not too long, but with many challenging shots you will need to pull off. The back 9 starts with a short but severe uphill dogleg left. From there, the elevation changes down to up and then up to down, a blind shot or two and the back 9 gives a true mountain golf experience. Have fun playing Crockett Ridge, it is a fun and unique course to play.



#### **DEAD HORSE LAKE**

Dead Horse Lake has really grown into a very fun and challenging layout with many unique holes and excellent course conditions. The fairways are plush and many improvements have been made over the years. In 2014 all of the course's greens were converted from bent grass to Champion Bermuda grass, and have



become some of the most popular, consistent and playable greens in the Knoxville golf market. Many Knoxville golfers who have played Dead Horse Lake and other area courses say that these are their favorite greens to putt. The Champion Bermuda greens at Dead Horse Lake are also



known for holding approach shots, a very important aspect of rewarding good play and in turn, the game of golf. With renovations to several holes, excellent practice facilities, a new stone patio pavillion for events, and a large drainage project to improve course conditions in wet times, Dead Horse has come a long way from it's inception over 50 years ago.



EGWANI FARMS

Not far from Knoxville, just a couple miles from the airport, you'll find Egwani Farms in Rockford. We highly recommend this golf course as one of our favorites in the Knoxville market. Since construction in 1991 on farmland, Egwani Farms has grown into one of the best options for local and traveling golfers alike. The Champion Bermuda greens are some of the best around. A well maintained golf course with

fantastic bunkers, many beautiful water hazards, new cart paths and

cart GPS to help you navigate this challenging course. By the way, the practice facilities are some of the best around. Check out the well stocked proshop for apparel and all your golf needs. On bad weather days, The Loft Golf Simulator and lounge will certainly keep you entertained as you play many famous virtual courses. Egwani Farms is a top notch course with amenities to match.





#### **GRAYSBURG HILLS**

Graysburg is simply one of East Tennessee's best. The first 18, the Knobs 9 and the Fodderstack 9 were designed by Rees Jones, one of America's leading golf architects. They opened in 1978 and the Chimney Top 9, designed by Edward Lawrence Packard, opened in the 1994. This is a 4.5 star rated course by Golf Digest in a scenic, serene county setting just 5 miles from I-81 between Knoxville and Johnson

City. Graysburg Hills has challenging, undulated bent grass greens and well maintained tee boxes, fairways, and bunkers. This is great golf at an affordable price. A down home, friendly environment and staff, you will definitely have fond memories of playing Graysburg Hills, a diamond in the rough. Once you play it, you'll want to play again.



#### **PINE OAKS**

Pine Oaks is a fairly straightforward golf course with beautiful scenery and a very unique layout. There are several fun Par 4s among the 18. Numbers 1, 8, 9, 16, and 17 are birdie holes that may be reached with a wedge or short iron for many players. Then there are several Par 4s that require both length and accuracy to manage a par on numbers 3, 4, 7, 10, 12, and 15. Each of these healthy Par 4s will challenge golfers no matter their handicap or ability. Pine Oaks has 3 Par 5s that can be very scorable if the player hits the ball



straight and has better than average distance from their respective tee. The only Par 5 on the front is the Road Hole which plays longer than the two found on the back. The uniqueness of Pine Oaks is shown by the two elevated Par 3s found on the back, numbers 13 and 18. Each features an exhilarating drop of over 100 feet from tee to green.

Scenic, unique, fun, yet challenging describes Pine Oaks to a T. An estimated annual total of 60,000 rounds per year are enjoyed by city residents, regional and traveling golfers. #### RIDGEFIELDS GOLF & CC

Donald Ross, the legendary golf course designer was hired in the 1940's to design what became Ridgefields Golf & Country Club. When playing the course and just being on the grounds, there is a definite sense that you are surrounded by history. This was the last golf course that Donald Ross designed. The legendary man grew up in Scotland, came to the US as a young man, was a pretty fair player and ended up designing over 400 seurces in




up designing over 400 courses in the US alone and many more worldwide.

In 1948, the year of his death, he put the final touches on Ridgefields Golf & Country Club, which opened the first 9 in 1949 and the Second 9 a year later in 1950. His portfolio includes Pinehurst, East Lake, Seminole, Oak Hill, Augusta CC, French Lick and Oakland Hills to name a few. Holston Hills and Cherokee CC in the Knoxville market are pretty fair courses too. When you play, the course you will discover several very unique golf holes. Ridgefields has amenities galore, a wonderful swimming pool, great tennis courts, a fitness club, and with Fusion, the Restaurant & Bar are unbeatable with the food, drinks and relaxing atmosphere. # 1963 - HISTORIC PINE OAKS



 $\mathcal{P}$ ine Oaks Golf Course opened it's doors and fairways to the public in 1963. In the 50s & 60s, Presidents Eisenhower and Kennedy helped to make golf a popular pastime of American Life. Thousands were members of "Arnie's Army" as Arnold Palmer was made famous on the black and white

televisions of the era. A group of Johnson City citizens approached the city Parks and Recreation Department with an idea: Help develop a public golf course for enjoyment of the "common folk." After selling the idea, in addition to the help of an urban renewal grant, the original budget was set at \$243,000 to start Johnson City Municipal Golf Course. Construction began in the Spring of 1962 with golf course architect Alexander G. McKay overseeing the project.

The back nine opened first on March 23, 1963. Daily green fees in those early days were \$1.50 and yearly passes were only \$50. By 1964, construction of all 18 holes was completed. In 1970 a contest was held and Johnson City resident Jack Lewis suggested a name that would live on for years to come: Pine Oaks Golf Course. Pine Oaks has become one of the most popular public courses in the region. With quality conditions, challenging layout and affordable prices (not to mention beautiful scenery as pictured.) The course



definitely achieves the original vision of it's founding patrons by providing a place for the "common folk" to enjoy playing the game of golf.



# A Place Called Graysburg Hills



IF you ask anybody who knows about Graysburg Hills, they will tell you that it is well worth a little drive thru the country to discover this "diamond in the rough!"

In 1977 Fred Stewart was helping investors look for places to build a golf course.

They stumbled upon on the 1,100 acre tract of farmland that became Graysburg Hills, an ideal serene setting near the beautiful East Tennessee foothills in the little community known as Chuckey.

The Stewart family themselves started construction and an architect was hired. Rees Jones, the son of the famous historical architect, Robert Trent

Jones had started his own company and Graysburg Hills became one of Rees Jones first designs. He went on to design or renovate over 260 golf courses. He worked on famous courses to host Major Championships and became known as "the Open Doctor."

The first 9 holes opened in April of 1978 and they called it The Knobs. The second 9, Fodderstack, opened several months later. The



names came from what the locals called the areas starting many years ago. The Country Course grew in popularity thru the 1980's into the 1990's, word spread of this Masterpiece out in the East Tennessee hills and valleys.


In 1994 Graysburg Hills Added another 9 to make 27 holes and a Golf Digest 41/2 star rating. Larry Packard was called on to design Chimney Top. Mr Packard lived to be 100 years old and designed or renovated over 600 golf Courses. He lived in Tampa at one



of his favorite courses, Innisbruck. He designed the Copperhead Course and 3 others there plus played a part in TPC SAWGRASS. The Chimmneys 9 plays as a mountain course with several up hill shots, tee boxes looking down toward the fairway or green and beautiful Mountain and Valley scenery all around. Graysburg Hills is in such a tranquil setting, peace and quite all around. The undulated

greens are bent grass, the fairways are riviera bermuda, 100 sand bunkers, and 6 water hazards and the course is always in great Shape. This is Country Club quality with no pretense, just great golf at an affordable price


