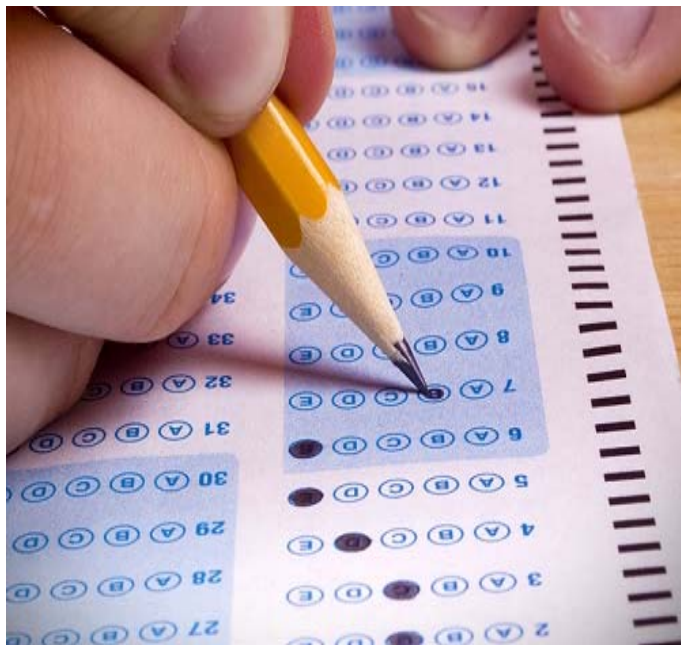


Understanding the Depth of Knowledge in the Indiana Standards and Statewide Assessments



The new statewide assessments will be aligned with the *Indiana Standards for Students*. The Depth of Knowledge required by these standards and associated tests is above that with which many teachers and students are familiar. If students are to perform well on statewide assessments, they must encounter rigor in daily classroom instruction.

In this **Grade 3-5** training, participants will focus upon ways to design instruction that mirrors all of **Webb's Depth of Knowledge** levels. Following a review of each level and associated questioning techniques, teachers will examine samples of test questions and analyze existing lesson plans in terms of student learning expectations and rigor. *(Attention will be given to Level 3 work, which is often difficult to incorporate into short instructional periods yet can be assessed on standardized tests.)*
