President's Message
Jason Platt, Texas



Many of our members are aware that the Board of Directors recently voted to expel a member from the club. This action was not taken lightly. It followed an extended period involving repeated violations of the standards of conduct expected of our members, including harassment, personal attacks directed at club members and Board members, conduct detrimental to the club, and a threat of physical violence.

The events leading to this decision began following Convention and continued over several months. What started as disagreements over club business escalated into repeated hostile communications, personal attacks, and ongoing harassment. Although differences of opinion are a natural part of any organization, respectful discussion must remain the standard. Unfortunately, that standard was repeatedly disregarded.

For approximately six months, the Board has continued to receive nearly daily emails containing accusations, harassment, and inflammatory remarks. In addition, other club members have also been subjected to inappropriate and unwarranted communications. No member should feel intimidated or harassed simply because they hold a different opinion.

The Board's responsibility is to protect the interests of the club and provide a safe, respectful environment for all members. After careful consideration and in accordance with the club's governing documents and parliamentary procedure, the Board voted to terminate this individual's membership. Official notification was issued following the Board's action. The club's official actions become effective according to the timeline established by the Board, not by an individual's attempt to resign or otherwise avoid disciplinary action after the vote has been taken.

Our organization believes in treating others with respect and courtesy. The Golden Rule, treating others as we wish to be treated, remains a principle we hope all members will follow. Healthy debate is welcome, but harassment, personal attacks, and threats have no place within our club.

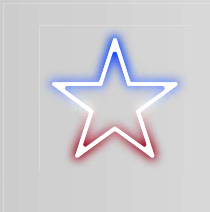
The Board regrets that this situation has consumed a significant amount of time and attention over the past several months, delaying work on initiatives that benefit the membership. We sincerely apologize for those delays and appreciate the patience and support shown by so many of our members during this difficult period.

These decisions are never easy, nor are they made without careful deliberation. However, when conduct becomes harmful to the club and its members, the Board has a responsibility to act in the best interests of the organization. Our focus now is to move forward, continue serving our membership, and devote our efforts to the positive growth and future of the club.

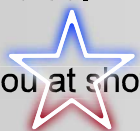
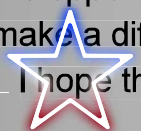

I hope you are all preparing for the show season, which is now in full swing. We have not had the chance to show much ourselves, as I have been quite busy. Many of you know that I retired last year, but I was asked to help grow a very large business in the pet industry, and I simply could not pass up the opportunity or the challenge. I also realized that I missed being part of something where I could make a difference and contribute.

I hope that time permits me to see many of you at shows during the spring and summer months.



Vice President's Message - continued

Over the past several months, many of you have witnessed the conflict and controversy that has taken place within our club. Some may say this is nothing new—that our club has experienced its share of drama over the years. Unfortunately, that is true. However, I believe it is important to provide some context because I feel many members have only heard one side of the story.

The situation involving Bob Donnell did not begin this year. Over many years, Bob has been involved in numerous conflicts within the club. To be fair, Bob has made many positive contributions to the club throughout his time as a member, and those contributions should be recognized. Unfortunately, there has also been a long pattern of behavior that has repeatedly created division within our organization.

Many members have witnessed what has happened when individuals disagree with Bob or expressed opinions different from his own. Over the years, numerous members have felt excluded, publicly criticized, or subjected to personal attacks after expressing differing viewpoints. This has resulted in repeated conflicts involving board members, club members, and others within the rabbit community.

This is not an isolated incident. Bob has previously been removed from the Board on two occasions, nearly expelled from the club in 2018, and has had numerous disputes with members over the years. While Bob can be a generous and supportive individual, there have also been repeated instances where interactions became personal, hostile, and damaging.

This year, the situation escalated significantly. Bob publicly attacked nearly every current board member, with the exception of two, and repeatedly directed personal attacks toward our President, Jason. Megan also became the target of repeated criticism after participating in what began as a respectful discussion regarding the Smut breed that differed from Bob's opinion.

During these exchanges, Bob claimed that Megan had attacked Johnny Hopper, which simply did not occur. In fact, Johnny personally contacted Megan to apologize and expressed that he was embarrassed his name had been brought into the situation. Despite that, the attacks against both Megan and Jason continued for weeks. Other board members, including myself and David Cardinal, were also subjected to personal attacks, including memes and other public posts, some of which continue today.

As these events unfolded, the Board received multiple formal complaints regarding Bob's conduct. One complaint alone totaled 76 pages of supporting documentation. Several complaints alleged conduct serious enough that the complainants believed legal action could have been pursued.

Because of the seriousness of these complaints, the Board had a responsibility to conduct a thorough review. This was not a decision based on differing opinions regarding sanction fees, membership dues, or policy debates. Healthy disagreement is part of any organization, and every member has the right to express their views respectfully. **The issue before the Board was conduct, not opinion.**

After reviewing the complaints, supporting documentation, and the club's Code of Conduct, the Board concluded that the allegations were well-founded and that Bob's conduct constituted repeated violations of the standards expected of every member. It was determined that his continued behavior was causing significant harm to the club and its membership.

During this process, confidential Board information was unfortunately leaked, allowing Bob to become aware that disciplinary action was pending. Bob has since stated that he resigned before the Board expelled him. While he did submit a resignation, the Board had already reached its decision to expel him the previous day. His resignation did not change the outcome or the basis for the Board's decision.

Since then, there have been claims that Bob was expelled simply because he opposed increases to sanctions or membership fees. That is categorically untrue. Those issues were never the basis for the Board's decision. Members are free to disagree with Board decisions and express their opinions respectfully.

Bob was expelled because the Board determined that his repeated conduct violated the club's Code of Conduct. The decision was based on documented behavior, formal complaints, and our obligation to protect the organization and its members.

This was not a decision any Board member wanted to make, nor was it taken lightly. It followed careful review, considerable discussion, and a commitment to act in what we believed was the best interest of the National Californian Rabbit Specialty Club and its membership.

Since the decision was announced, many members have reached out privately to express their appreciation for the Board's willingness to address a situation they felt had gone unresolved for far too long.

My hope is that this provides some additional context regarding what occurred and why the Board ultimately reached the decision it did. More importantly, I hope we can now move forward, put this chapter behind us, and focus on what truly matters—supporting our members, promoting the Californian breed, and building a stronger, more positive future for our club.

Thank you for your continued support, dedication, and commitment to building a positive future for our organization.

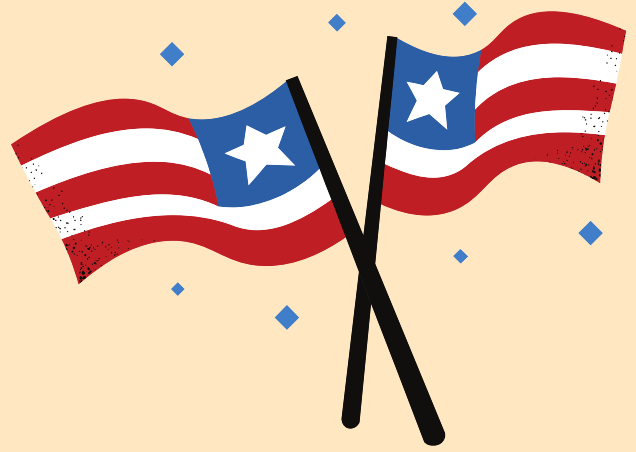

Well, I'm sure most of you know me but just a quick introduction.

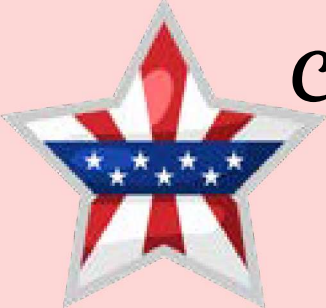
My name is David Klindt from Bettendorf Iowa. I've been raising rabbits for over 40 years raising Cals and New Zealand's showing all over the country.

The Cal breed has given me many opportunities to show all over the country at the state and national levels. The amount of good people I have met while showing Cals is something I truly appreciate.

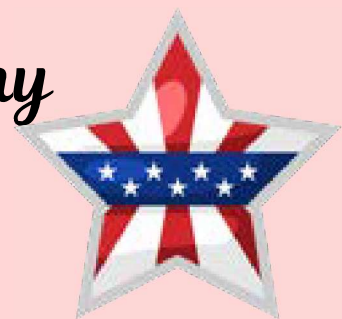

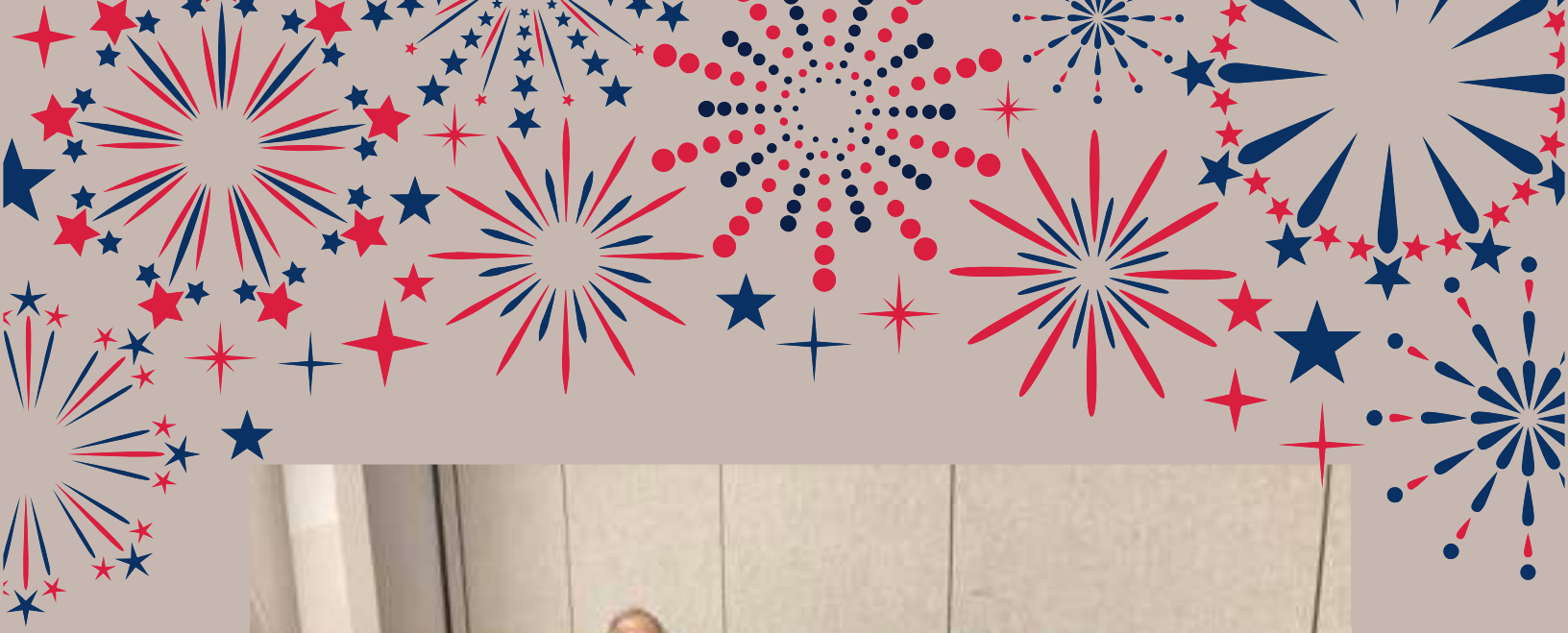
