

## April 29, 2023 9th Annual Fundraiser Ride





#### WHO ARE SIKHS?

The word Sikh (pronounced "sickh") means 'disciple' or 'learner'. Sikhism is a divinely revealed religion founded by Guru Nanak Ji (1469-1549), our first Guru. Sikhs believe in the teachings of the 10 Sikh Gurus, the Guru Granth Sahib (the holy scripture), and that all people have the right to follow their own path to God. Sikhism is monotheistic and stresses the equality of all men and women.

Sikhs endeavor to live up to the principles, ideals and the code of conduct as described in the Guru Granth Sahib. Sikhs believe in three basic principles:

- (1) **NAAM JAPNA** Meditating on the name of God (praying);
- (2) KIRAT KARO Earning a living by honest means; and
- (3) <u>VAND CHAKKO</u> Sharing income/resources with others.

## REMEMBERING SHERJUNG S DHILLON



In July of 2023 it was with deep sadness and heavy hearts that we regretfully informed you that we lost a dear brother and SROA member from Florida in an unfortunate bike accident.

He leaves behind his wife and 2 sons. He will be remembered for his smile, caring heart, and love for children. We kindly ask that you please continue to keep his family in your thoughts and prayers.

#### **HOW SIKH RIDERS OF AMERICA STARTED**

Sikh Riders of America (also known as "SROA") is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation that was established to increase awareness throughout the community about the Sikh religion. The organization was born in 2012 after many Sikhs were targets of a senseless hate crime due to mistaken identity. At that time, we saw a dire need to spread education and awareness about Sikhism in order to try and prevent this type of tragedy from happening again. The jarring event that was the impetus for creating this motorcycle group was the mass shooting that had just taken place at the Oak Creek Gurdwara (place of worship) in Wisconsin where 6 individuals were fatally shot and 4 others were wounded. Thereafter, family members of victims testified before a U.S. Senate panel where the government was lobbied to start tracking hate crimes against Sikhs.

Members of this group are committed to educating the public about Sikhism and changing the unfortunate misperceptions people often have about Sikhs. Members are also obligated to participate in seva (community service). To date, in addition to all the hours spent attending fundraisers and other community events and/or functions, the group has donated well over half a million dollars to the homeless and other disadvantaged individuals, veterans, law enforcement, and/or victims of natural disasters both locally and abroad.
