Bible Study

at St. Joseph's has resumed and has a new format. We have a book study that has

a biblical foundation. The book is "Questions that God Ask Us" by Trevor Hudson. The study is led by St. Joseph's graduates of Education for Ministry. A chapter is covered during each session. The first question is, "where are you?" The scripture connection is in the book of Genesis after Eve and Adam are hiding from God after realizing they are naked since they had eaten the forbidden fruit. The question in itself produced a lively discussion from the participants. For example why would the "ALL KNOWING GOD" ask where Adam and Eve are physically when God knew exactly where they were. Was God opening the door for the two to confess? Was it a question

regarding their relationship now that they have chosen to be disobedient? What would be your answer if God ask, where are you?

The second question has a foundation also in Genesis when God ask Cain, where is your Brother? Cain answers with a question, am I my brother's keeper? We first identify who is our brother or sister?
