Rev. Ralph's Corner

It has been about four years since I asked the vestry

what St. Joseph's church meant to them. Many of the answers I received revolved around St. Joseph as a community, and I suppose that is a good answer as the definition of community is:

- a social group of any size whose members reside in a specific locality, share government, and often have a common cultural and historical heritage.
- a locality inhabited by such a group.
- a social, religious, occupational, or other

group sharing common characteristics or interests and perceived or perceiving itself as distinct in some respect from the larger society within which it exists.

So, St. Joseph's Episcopal Church is a community. But what common characteristics bind us together?

There was a time, during segregation, where one of the answers to this question might have something to do with either ethnicity or skin color. But look around the congregation these days and we are a beautiful mix of colors and textures, and we still chose to gather. I would like to think that one reason for the continued desire to gather together is the shared belief in the teachings and preaching of Jesus who we believe is the Christ. So what about our adherence to this philosophy causes us to gather?

The obvious answer is the teaching of Jesus that we are to gather to tell the story, so we gather. We remember the story of Jesus' life and ministry. We remember the stories of the covenant between humanity and God captured in literary form in the collection of writings we call the Old Testament. But we also tell the story since the ink dried on the last book of the New Testament. We tell the stories of our families and our successes and shortcomings and in so doing we see the work of God even today.
