

# Short Platform Stations in Greater Sydney

(Sydney Trains Intercity and Suburban Network)



## RAILFAN'S GUIDE



### Summary

Across the Sydney Trains Intercity and suburban network, some station platforms are too short to accommodate the full length of a train. This means that when passengers are boarding and alighting at these stations, only select carriages or select doors can be used. The arrangements for each station vary, with differences also existing between different types of trains. For some stations passengers may need to press the door button to manually open the door (as opposed to the automatic opening that occurs at most stations).

Some of these stations are also "Request Stations". This means that the train will not stop unless a passenger requests it. Passengers alighting at a request station need to advise the guard of their destination, so the train can stop there. For passengers boarding a train at a request station, a stop can be requested by hailing the train on its approach, with the exception of Zig Zag station where the passenger needs to follow the specific instructions at the station.
