
Isadore Pineau was one of twelve children of Leopold and Veronique Pineau. Three of the twelve emigrated PEI to live in the Lawrence, Mass. area. They were Uncle Gene, Aunt Sicily who had two daughters (of whom one was a per emigree nun) and a son. The third was Isadore A fourth PEI Pineau sibling, Aunt Mary came to visit Isadore and Veronice Pinezu in N. Woburn, as did Uncle Angus, Isadore's younger brother who was married to Melina. A further PEI Pineau sibling, Father Joseph Pineau, was an older brother of Isadora who became a delayed vocation priest and who lived with Isadore and Veronica in Maryland
during seminary years. Altogether, eight or nine of Isadores brothers and sisters had children totalling several dozen who spread out over other Cenzaliza provinces.



Veronica Arsenault, Alma's mother, was born 5/9/1891 in Tignish, Prince Edward Island, a Canadian province. She was orphaned at an early age and was raised by her older sister, Obelind. Veronica was 18 when she emigrated to the Lawrence, Mass. area, accompanied by Obelind, to work in the American Woolen Co. in 1909. She met young 21 year old Isadore Pineau in the summer of 1909 and they were married 12/27/09. They had nine children and spent most of their living in N. Woburn, Mass beginning in 1926 to 1968 Obelina lived with them for some fifty years.

Alma was their sixth child who later became a Registered Nurse, President of the WHS class of 1940, first of her family to graduate from college, mother of six children, and First Lady of Nathoniel Hawthorne College, N. H. On 12/27/50 she married Vincent Fulmer, a graduate student in economies at M.I.T., from Ohio. Alma
