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WHAT IS AGE PLAY

Age Play is a broad term for the fetish community that encompasses AB/DLs, Littles, Caregivers, and Mommy/Daddy play. Just to be Clear, AGE PLAY HAS NOTHING TO DO WITH CHILDREN. It is not a mental illness or disorder. What it is can be described as a sexual fetish or form of kink play that encompasses an interest or attraction to mentally regressing to a simpler time in life and reliving a part of your childhood. Some Age players are into wearing diapers, in some cases using them, perhaps dressing up in adult-sized baby clothes. The play concerning diapers is referred to as AB/DL. AB/DL is an acronym that stands for "Adult Baby/Diaper Lover." It is no different than a BD/SM (50 Shades of Gray) Leather or Rubber fetish. The activity harms neither the participant nor anyone else in society.

That being said, the fetish may not be considered "normal" by what society says is normal, but it is no body's business what people do with their private lives. The Age play community is a large and diverse group of adults ranging from any career path from doctors, lawyers, independent business owners to what would be considered entry level positions in society. Every kinkster may have varying interests and attractions in regard to play. Not all Diaper Lovers have interests in the Adult Baby aspect of play and there are some Age Players that have no interest in diapers as well. Some age players are not into regressing and may in fact prefer to take on a care giver or Mommy or Daddy role. The fetish isn't exclusively a sexual one. Many participants receive no sexual stimulation from the activity but may find comfort or stress relief. It is different for each and every person.

We hope this brief overview has offered an insightful, and respectful understanding. People tend to fear what they don't know or understand and learning that a loved one is an Age player can be difficult to understand, but the important thing to do is maintain an open mind, remember that the activity in no way involves children or minors. The person isn't mentally ill, and this in no way hurts them or anyone else. If Age play isn't your thing that's okay. If everyone were only into the same "normal" things then the world would be a dull place, but if there is any advice we can give it is to try to understand and accept that person for who they are. If Star Wars taught us anything is the "Fear leads to Anger, Anger leads to Hate, Hate Leads to Suffering" and people always fear what they don't know.

WHY ADULT BABY STEPS PART I

Have you ever just felt so lost in the vastness of the world and you seek answers, but you know that the people around you don't only not know the answers, but they may even reject you for asking? This has been a dilemma for many in the age play community.

The intent of Adult Baby Steps and all of its media produced through videos, written article and other content is to help provide accurate information about the age play and AB/DL community that is safe, informative and can provide guidance that can be viewed privately, discreetly for those that wish to learn not only about themselves, but also about the age play community. A little about Adult Baby Steps... The organization was founded by a lifelong AB/DL who has been active in the community for over 20 years. The founder is "Baby Jp" (Scene Name) or just Jp to his friends.

Okay, enough writing about myself like I'm a pretentious dick... My name is Jp and I've been an AB/DL with an attraction to diapers my entire life. I can't explain why but as early as three years old I've always wanted to be in diapers. I know some psychologists will say that age play is brought on due to childhood trauma, but the family trauma I experienced growing up didn't occur until several years later. I've long stopped questioning the whys... It has been nearly forty years and having that answer will not impact my personal happiness and at this point in my life I've never been happier or more successful... AB/DL doesn't negatively impact my life... it makes my life better and thus I don't view the why anymore as something needing an answer. If I can impart any advice to you in regards to the age play kink it is that if it makes you happy and elevates your life then the "why" isn't important, but I can't help explain the why as that is an individual journey.

As I mentioned earlier, I have been in the AB/DL community for over 20 years and no, I was not in the community before I was 18 years old, that's not acceptable as AB/DL is an 18+ adult activity... which means.... Math sucks and I'm old. In my own personal journey to find myself and explore my kink I met tons of people through the internet via many kink websites that no longer exists as well as some that do, ABKingdom, The Daily Diapers, and Fetlife are all some examples. Through Fetlife I met local AB/DL friends when in college and they introduced me to a group of likeminded friends and over time the group of friends grew to become an organized community.

It was this group of online friends and real life contacts that held me back from falling off the precipice into the pit of despair created by a miserable life situation brought on through a combination of broken promises by the military, chronic depression made worse through the guilt from the deaths of several friends I couldn't save, and being trapped living with an overbearing religious zealot family member. It

As I mentioned at the start I can't answer the "Whys" for myself so I can not help you with finding your "Why" but what I can do is offer advice and insight in a broad overview of the ABDL kink from a technical and informative aspect as well as considerations for things like a 24/7 lifestyle, personal physical health, building a play space or nursery of your own, and helping grow in the community through meeting others safely from everything from one-on-ones, to public munches, to events to attending a Age play convention.

CHAPTER ONE

HOW TO PUT ON A DIAPER PROPERLY

Are you new to diapers, never put one on yourself, wondering how to change in public, or you keep leaking and you'd like to know what you are doing wrong? Then this article is for you! If you are looking for information on diapers in general then check out our article "All Things Diapers" on our website www.adultbabysteps.com.

The first thing to cover is the diaper. Obviously, there are tons of types... cloth, disposable, pull-ups, and various tape, adhesive, connectors... for the purpose of this article I'm going to be speaking in generalities of wing tape type diapers. (Pull-ups operation instructions are in the title) The general parts of the common "Tape" type diaper is a front, back, with wings on both sides and tapes on the back wings. Generally, two to six tapes with four, two on each side being the most common. I know you are probably thinking, "no shit" but you are already wrong. Shit comes after the diaper is on. (Just seeing if you are paying attention). The most important part of the diaper is the leg guards. These are two small fabric strips that will run parallel along the edges of the diaper. These are very important! If you are looking to add thickness to your diaper with a booster, or by doubling up diapers (Explained in the All things article) if the booster or inner diaper is over the leg guard you are more likely to leak as the leg guards act like a slash guard or dam preventing all accidents from leaking until the absorbent material can... absorb... we'll come back to this again.

If you are selecting a disposable diaper, it is important for the diaper to fit properly... just because you can apply the tapes and the diaper stays on doesn't mean it is secure. Ordering samples or two packs before ordering packs or cases is highly recommended to test out. All diaper sizes are not the same. An AB/DL diaper sized medium might be small in comparison to a medical diaper. An easy method to get better fit is to use a cloth measuring tape on your bare waist and use that measurement against the company's size guide chart.

Now it is time to assume the position! But the question is... what position is the right position to put on a diaper. That is going to be dependent on you, your location, your preference, or if someone is changing you. The most common diaper changing position and best in most cases is laying down on your back, legs spread slightly apart, and you lift your butt by leveraging weight on your feet and lifting your pelvis before pulling the diaper under yourself. If you are being changed this is also the ideal changing position. But I can already hear you saying... "Well, I can't always lay down, stupid!"

Like I said, that is the most common way, but not the only way... and don't call me stupid... you butt face!

The method ideal for diaper changing in public or when laying down isn't a possibility is the "standing position". The trick to this method is having a flat stable

surface you can lean up against like a wall, or bathroom stall. After removing the previous diaper, underwear, or pull-up you need to take your diaper and raise it between your legs and then pin it between you and the wall with your butt. This will free up your hands to position the sides and wings and properly line up and adjust before applying the tapes.

The final method I'll mention is the kneeling position. Generally, this isn't a method I would ever use or recommend except in rare circumstances like in a kink scene or making content and it requires the user to be somewhat flexible and limber. How it works is, you open the diaper you are about to put on yourself and you either kneel over it or pull it between your legs when you are already kneeling and then tape the sides alternating between each side.

That covers the positions, but before assuming any position I'd always recommend proper preparations. If you like adding boosters to your diapers, you'll want to insert them between the leg guards first. If you are using barrier creams, powder, lotion, baby oil (I highly recommend these products, especially if you are going to be wearing them for any extended period of time, using the diaper, or will be in diapers consecutively for any period of time) one trick I use is to lightly apply the products like lotion or powder directly to the diaper pad. Barrier cream and lotion I'd recommend applying directly to the body with a light "dusting" of powder. ✨

The last and most controversial topic I leave until the end and that is the "great tape debate" If you ask ten AB/DLs the proper way to do the tapes you may get various answers. My personal preference is to alternate left to right, first doing the bottoms and then doing the top tapes. Again, alternating from the left and right. All the tapes need to be secure, but it is important the lower tapes are not overly tightened to the point that they are uncomfortable or cut off circulation. The upper tape needs to be tight enough, so the diaper is secure and won't slip down over time or from the weight of diaper use.

You now have successfully diapered yourself... but there is one last step I would recommend which separates the experienced diaper butts from the novices and that is "flipping out the leg guards". As I mentioned earlier, the leg guards are a vital part of the diaper and work towards preventing leaks, but that is only if you use them properly. In the diapering process the leg guards often can get rolled up or folded inward which can provide less than ideal leak protection. The easiest way to correct this is to slip your index or middle finger into the inner leg of the diaper and "hook" the leg guard with your finger and slightly pull the leg guard outward working your way from front to the back of the diaper.

With that last step you are properly padded. There are a few cosmetic things you can do... rolling the top inward and tucking any part of the overlap if they are uneven, but that is essentially it. Adding a diaper cover, plastic, or latex pants is another step if you have leaking or smell concerns or if you just like the additional fashion look of them and you are set!

CHAPTER TWO AB/DL RECOMMENDED STARTER SET

So, you are interested in buying your first ABDL gear? As a member of the community for over 20 years, let me make a few recommendations based on my experiences and expansive collection of gear myself.

The Baby Set – Cost \$100 - \$150

- Diapers
- Paci
- T-shirt/onesie

Diapers

Firstly, every baby needs diapers... and although there are a ton of ABDL printed diapers on the market, all the cuts and measurements are not universal, and they are pricy... I personally recommend **Northshore Megamax** for all first timers. There is no better diaper for the price on the market. A pack of ten will run between \$33.50 - \$45 depending on where you get them. Northshore has an excellent website and quick shipping, but you can also purchase Megamax on Amazon at a higher price. The colors come in White, Black, Blue, Pink, and Tie dye currently.

If you are into super thick diapers that last over 12 hours you can add an addition of boosters. They are diapers without an outer shell that will soak through. Northshore and various other companies sell boosters that slip inside the diaper that add more thickness and the “Waddle effect.” Boosters depending on the size and make can be around \$17.00 - \$35.

Paci ✨

When it comes to Pacis, you could get a toddler’s Nuk 5 from any local baby aisle, but for a few bucks more you can get an adult sized paci. My recommendation is From **My Inner Baby** they sell several large sizes for various price ranges. My personal favorite is the size ten which sells for around \$20.00, but there are larger sizes for additional costs. Adding a Paci clip is a fun addition that adds to an outfit.

• Onesie/T-shirt

There is one company I recommend above all when it comes to a Onesie or Romper and that is **Onesies Down Under**. They sell some of the best onesies out there and the sizes are very forgiving as they can stretch quite a bit. It is important to use the size chart when ordering and I recommend adding an inch or two for the average diaper. Their prices are fair for the quality and there are frequently sales and items on discount and clearance. You can find a onesie for roughly \$30-42.00.

If you are a baby on a budget the easiest thing to do is wear a t-shirt and adopt the “Tommy Pickles” look. I recommend getting a smaller sized T-shirt than what you normally wear if you want your diaper on display. A solid color is one way to go, but there are also “nostalgic graphic T-shirt” options available at big name stores such as Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles or Sesame Street.

Once you have your AB/DL basic attire there are always ways to improve your toddling look and add to the growing wardrobe.

The Toddler Addition – Cost \$170-\$180

- **Shortalls/Skirtalls**
- **Knee high socks**
- **Velcro Shoes**

Shortalls/Skirtalls

The shortalls/skirtalls look is the classic in the AB/DL community. My personal recommendation are the denim shortalls or Skirtalls from **Tykables**. They cost \$80.00, but the quality and the fact that they open at the crotch for diaper changes (Shortalls) the price is more than worth it. They also will not hide the onesie you are wearing but to the contrary will feature it.

Knee High Socks

Knee high socks are a great and yet cheap addition to the AB/DL look. They can be acquired anywhere clothing can be purchased. I am personally a fan of Amazon due to selection and options. Socks can be found for a few dollars or more depending on the make and quality.

Velcro Shoes

Shoes may not be an item many AB/DLs think about but for me my shoes are one of my favorite clothing items. Sure, any sneakers could complete the look, but if you want to feel really little, nothing will make you feel that more than Velcro only sneakers and I am not talking about your grandpa’s orthopedic shoes. **Vans** has **Black and White or Blue and White Suede Canvas all Velcro Trainer sneakers** that I personally am on my fifth pair and wear everywhere except the gym as my daily shoes. I have always ordered my shoes on Amazon, and they will run you about \$80.00 depending on the size, but if the shoes are important to you these cannot be beat.

CHAPTER TWO ALL THINGS DIAPERS

This might seem like a waste of time to author this article because you would think a fetish concerning diapers, everything would be straight forward, but in my twenty years in the ABDL community this is something I get asked questions about the most. There are a wide variety of diaper options, there are numerous ways to prepare them, and there are also several tips and tricks that many AB/DLs like to implement so this article is going to go over the basics of everything.

I want to be clear; this is not going to be a review or an endorsement of any products or a particular diapering method. I merely intend to mention options, techniques, and products that some may not know exist. What works for some will not work for others. Some products may fit in an appealing way for a particular body type. It is possible that some AB/DLs are attracted to the materials the diaper is constructed. Given the diverse options and the various things that could be appealing to the wearer I am not going to cover specific brands.

I will say that my advice when trying out a new diaper is to get samples of a particular diaper you wish to try so you are not spending the money on a whole pack. Many companies offer a two-diaper sample pack. Another thing you can do if you attend AB/DL events or meet diaper friends is have a swap meet of sorts where you trade one or two diapers of assorted brands with each other to help experience different options and find something you like.

Diaper Types

Starting with the extreme basics there are two basic categories Cloth and

Disposables. There are sub-categories that exist for both... for instance, cloth can be a terry cloth diaper that is pinned, snap covers that have cloth inserts, hook and loop, or the Japanese folded cloth with an outer cover that ties. Disposables could be considered even more diverse with products like pull-ups, plastic back, cloth back, medical, and even AB/DL targeted products.

All the diaper varieties and options exist to fit the needs or desires of the consumers. There are pros and cons to all... Cloth is expensive up front and labor intensive for clean-up but pays for itself in the long run and disposables can be cheap in the short term and is easy for clean-up, but very expensive in the long term, but this article isn't going to be focused on helping you pick one over the other. Just a broad overview of options.

Diaper Changes

Before you can wear a diaper, you must start at the beginning of putting one on and there are a few ways and products that can assist in that endeavor. I am not going to get into the age-old argument of which tapes you should do first or last... that is all personal preference. Using products like baby powder, lotion, oil, barrier creams or diaper rash ointments are all common. Again, like diapers it is highly recommended to test things out to see what works for you. Purchasing travel sized changing supplies is ideal when starting out and they are also perfect for a diaper bag when traveling if you decide to keep them and you can just buy larger versions for your home or nursery. A warning though: Be cautious when trying a new product as you do not want to have a bad reaction to a product in your intimate areas.

Products like baby powder and lotion not only offer protection from diaper rash, but also the act of applying them can be a powerful mood enhancer as not only the

sense of feel but smell as well. I personally like the smell of baby powder so much that I always have a scented candle in my nursery with the scent of baby powder. My recommendation when starting out is to use baby lotion rubbed into the diaper area and then add a light dusting to the inside of the diaper with powder. I personally also use a “baby powder poof” to directly apply powder to myself and I swear by using one.

Diaper Tips and Tricks

There are many tips and tricks that AB/DLs learn from others or from experimenting along the way. For example, when changing in public bathroom stalls some diaper wearers will implement what I like to call the “Stall wall” changing technique. What this entails is placing the back of you soon to be fresh diaper against the stall wall and then hold that in place with your back side. This will help free up your hands to pull up the front and help adjust the tapes easier.



Diaper Changing Supplies



AB/DL Changing Pad

Using products like changing mats is great and not only adds an additional layer to the diaper change experience but also serves a practical purpose. Many AB/DL companies like Rearz or Little Kink Boutique offer reusable changing mats. Medical companies also offer disposable ones as well. If diaper use and public changes are something that you will be involved in, I also recommend discreet disposal bags. These are small odor eliminating trash bags that are just for disposing of diapers in public. For advice on your daily carry diaper bags please see my

other articles concerning diaper bags.

Manual Fluffing

Diapers fresh out of the pack are stiff and the absorbency material is tightly packed or woven. This is perfect for shipping and packaging, but for most diaper wearers it is less than ideal. Diapers should be thick and poofy and when breaking that material up will also help to make the diaper more comfortable. To accomplish the sought after poof you need to “fluff” the diaper.

The act of fluffing a diaper is an amazingly simple one. You completely fold the diaper out then take hold of the diaper with each hand on either side of the leg guards and then your gently shake the diaper back and forth flexing the material and working your way from the back all the way up to the front of the diaper. This will break up the material and help provide the ideal poof.

Dryer Air Fluffing

The Dryer Air Fluffing method is the easier method to fluffing a diaper and you can in fact fluff several diapers at once, but you need to have access to a dryer machine to use this method. This is something many people do, just make sure you have zero heat on the settings, and you set the dryer to “Fluff.” The general recommended time to do this is between 5-10 minutes. I do recommend only doing this with one diaper to start just to make sure the results are something you want, and the machine can manage it safely.

Boosters

A great option for heavy wetter or individuals that enjoy the “Thickness factor” of their diapers, boosters also sometimes called doublers, are an additional absorbency pad that often has adhesive on one side that is inserted into a diaper during a change between the leg guards. Unlike the technique of “doubling up,” which we will cover shortly, boosters are designed to leak through uniformly so that they make a diaper more absorbent, but they cannot be used as a standalone diaper pad. They are much cheaper than the doubling method and can often be stacked on top of each other to add additional desired thickness. When the wearer uses the diaper, the liquid will soak through one at a time eventually soaking the diaper as well as the absorbency limits are reached.

For clarification, a diaper pad or sometimes called an incontinence pad may have the appearance of a booster but is something completely different. A diaper pad is designed to go inside the underwear and catch minor leaks but is not designed to leak through so if you are interested in investing in boosters or doublers be sure to get the correct product.

Doubling Up

Another thickness option that some diaper users will implement is the doubling up method. There are several ways to double up so I will just describe the most common and effective ways if you are interested in trying this technique. Essentially doubling up is just layering one diaper on top of another for added thickness. If diaper use is intended, you need to cut the outer layer of the inner diaper or poke lots of holes so that the wettings can flow through into the next diaper. I personally recommend using a sewing tracing wheel to poke hundreds, if not thousands of holes quickly and effectively. You need to be cautious if you use something like a knife because too much damage to the outer cover of the inner diaper could result in the absorbency material falling apart in the outer diaper.

Doubling up can be an expensive option in comparison to something like boosters since most AB/DL or medical diapers can cost \$3-\$4 dollars each. To offset the cost some diaper wearers will purchase actual baby diapers to use as an interior insert. Another technique that is common with doubling up, especially for those individuals seeking to post photos of themselves in extra thick diapers but remove the overlap appearance of the tapes is to use a pair of scissors to remove the front and back wings of the diaper and then add the wingless diaper into a proper diaper and tape that up.

As mentioned at the start of this article there are many cloth-based options in the AB/DL world and another doubling option is to wear a disposable AB/DL or medical diaper and then wear a cloth diaper over top of that for the additional thickness. This plays to the strengths of keeping costs down, adding the desired thickness, but minimizing the clean-up.

Diaper Covers/Plastic Pants

A product I personally recommend to those diaper wearers that will venture into public, are heavy diaper users, incontinent, or have a high tendency of leaking, plastic pants are a great solution. There are several types of these products, and not all are designed to help prevent leaks, so it is important to check the product before purchasing. Products like Gary wear, old school rubber or latex pants, and plastic pants are all great options for leak protection. The covers will often feature an elastic leg and waist guard and are made of a

waterproof material.

Lastly there is a diaper cover option that is commonly not designed for leak protection but rather offers a BDSM aspect to wearing diapers and that is a “Locking diaper cover” there are various versions of these. Some are simply a pair of plastic pants with a chain sewn into the waist that can be secured with a simple padlock, while others can be far more restrictive and secure like the pair from the Straitjacket shop that utilizes the Segufix magnetic lock system that requires a special key to remove.

CHAPTER THREE

THE DIAPER BAG

Going to your first AB/DL event? Starting your adventure of trying diapers 24/7? A diapered road trip? This article is what I would have liked to know when I started my adventure. This list is what I consider to be the bare necessities.

Starting of the list... the diaper bag... it wouldn't be a diaper bag list if you didn't have a bag! A standard backpack with three main pouches, and side pockets on either side for a drink or bottle is my ideal bag. I personally have two bags... one for regular public use which is just a black military style pack and one for ABDL events and conventions that is covered in ABDL and other fetish affiliated pins, badges, and patches.



Now that we have the bag we need to pack it. Starting off my advice is to pack things in the likelihood that you are going to need them, so I always pack my spare change of clothes. Jeans, shirt, socks, diaper cover in the bottom in the bag in the main pouch. Trust me, you would rather have them and not need them than need them and not have them.

Next is diapers and boosters... if the bag has a laptop pouch, I like to put two of each in this section, so they are a quick and easy grab. It is up to you if you need it more or less. I also like to add a pack of diaper disposable bags in the same section of my diapers. Northshore is who I recommend for these. Their packs are small and deodorizing. The last item I place in the main pouch is my diaper changing mat. The mat isn't always usable in all situations like in a toilet stall, but I like using it over the toilet to place my changing supplies and keeping a barrier between my stuff and a public toilet. (Just make sure you wipe it down with disinfectant wipes when you are done).

Moving on from the main pouch of the bag and focusing on the outside of the bag. I always carry my water bottle on my public bag or a bottle or sippy bottle on my dominant hand side of the bag. In the front exterior bag this is where you want to carry your changing supplies, so you are not fishing around looking for them. I recommend investing in small bottles or going the easier route and getting several small travel sized

bottles that you can just refill. If diapers are a sexual thing for you and you are planning on being active don't forget to pack lube and protection!

The last thing I always pack in my diaper bag is my noise cancelling headphones, a handheld gaming device, (I like rocking my old 90s Gameboy with Pokémon yellow as a conversation starter at events), a deck of playing cards or a Yugioh deck if I know others will have them, and an activity book and pencils.

I hope you find this list and guide helpful to you. This is obviously not the only way to pack your bag or what you may need, but this is a good starting point. A checklist for your diaper bag can be found in Appendix I.



CHAPTER FOUR MISCONCEPTIONS AND FACTS ABOUT ABDLS

1. Age play/ABDL has NOTHING to do with children, minors, or babies
2. Not all Age players are into diapers
3. Not all ABDLs are into regression
4. There are several sub-groups in the age play/diaper play community. Many also are into other kinks such as furies, BDSM, pet play, to name a few
5. ABDL can be a very expensive kink
6. Not all ABDLs are into wetting/messing diapers. Some do, some don't
7. The Age play/ABDL kink has a massive industry with tons of shops selling everything from adult sized printed diapers, clothing, furniture, Pacifiers, and various other accessories.
8. There is an expansive and genuine Age play community both physically in person with groups and conventions like LEAP and CapCon as well as online with websites like Daily Diapers and Diaper-Bois
9. There are several massive Age play events/conventions each year the largest being CapCon. A hotel takeover for over four days with several thousand age players in attendance
10. Diapers were the #1 most searched/paid for porn category according to Clips for Sale in 9 of the 50 States in 2023. Ohio being one of the 9 states.
11. Age play scenes are similar to BDSM scenes and consent is a number one priority
12. Some age players decide to wear diapers 24/7 or even convert their bedrooms or a room of their house into a nursery.

CHAPTER FIVE PERSONAL FITNESS – BABY STEPS TO HEALTH

What's up diaper butts! Don't know if anyone else is going through or has experienced this, I wanted to write this essentially to my past self... if it resonates with you then I want you to know that you can be anything you want and although it may take a lot of work, you can improve yourself if you want... I am not saying you need to. I needed to be mentally healthy and motivated before I was ready... anyway... a little backstory to my situation...

I am a 24/7 ABDL... and two years ago I finished building the bedroom nursery of my dreams, everyday I work in littles attire and diapers (I work from home) and just live the AB/DL life all the time... sounds like a dream, right? But I started having health issues because of my weight. I had been hurt from injuries and coupling that with an office job I became super lazy, complacent, and just wasn't happy. I started to get bothered because all the cute diapers didn't seem to fit and all the cute AB/DL clothes either didn't come out in my size or were limited in options. I had blood tests done and my doctor essentially told me I was a cupcake away from diabetes.

I decided from that moment on I was going to make a change. I joined Planet Fitness... But I was so out of shape that doing anything strenuous was extremely hard for long durations. Baby Steps... I set small goals and went to the gym every other day... I'd do the elliptical because it was low impact, and I didn't want to hurt myself, but I needed to burn calories. Baby steps... my goal was 30 minutes on the elliptical in one go... I couldn't do it... I got to 15 before I thought I was gonna die. But Baby Steps and the next workout I did 20 minutes... maybe a week or two later and I did 30 and hit that goal. Then the next time I worked out I tried to go a little faster and harder. After another couple of weeks, I would get on the treadmill and walk after the Elliptical... just keeping that heart rate up and doing the best I could... more Baby Steps...

Eventually I reached the point where every other day I would go to the gym for an hour and a half and do the elliptical for 30 minutes then walk on the treadmill for an hour. I even did these workouts at Capcon in the early morning when all the babies were still sleeping... I didn't want to, but Baby Steps. I started to lose significant weight. At the time I am writing this I have now lost 70 pounds; I'm down 2 diaper sizes... but it was all Baby Steps. I still need to lose another 40... but it's just Baby Steps...

I'm not writing this to get congratulations. This is to motivate my present self who still has Baby Steps ahead of him... but also to let the past me out there... or someone else who needs that motivation to know that you can do it! It just takes Baby Steps... If you want any advice or a workout routine or dietary advice or what supplements I take I'm here to offer whatever knowledge I am here to help you make your first baby steps...

My System

Each of my workouts are 1.5 hours and I try to work out every-day Monday-Friday. I rotate through three main workouts. Cardio, Lifting and Leg Day... I do often substitute leg day for lifting because I prefer Lifting, and the Cardio workouts really are strenuous. I recommend if you copy my routine, I recommend doing Leg Day on Friday, so it doesn't follow a cardio day or do the stationary Bike for the warmup on that following cardio day.

Personal fitness isn't just about working out. You can't work out all the time and then eat five double cheeseburgers and expect a positive weight change. As I am trying to drop weight, I maintain a calorie deficit. I maintain a 1500 calorie intake and I avoid all pop/soda, fast food, sugars, and any processed foods. If the ingredient labels have a ton of stuff I can't pronounce or say I don't eat it. I also take supplements and vitamins daily that promote digestion. I track all my workouts and food intake in a fitness journal.

My Supplements



I want to be clear, before I talk about this... You do not need to spend a ton of money on gym membership and supplements to lose weight. Just creating a calorie deficit in the long term will lead to weight loss. Burning 1k calories in a workout everyday will definitely speed up the loss, but it is not required. Also, all the supplements I take are backed by actual science and doctors. I do not take any miracle weight loss supplement. That all being said, here is my daily regimen:

1. Psyllium Husk Caps (Fiber)
2. Super Enzymes (Helps with digestion)
3. EGCg Green Tea Extract (Also helps with digestion)
4. L-Lysine (Increase Muscle Mass, performance)
5. Probiotic- 10 (Digestion)
6. Ginger root (Digestion)
7. Biotin (Immune system)
8. Vitamin D-3 (I don't get enough sunlight because I work 3rds)

9. Vitamin C (Immune system and I don't consume enough)

My Routine

1. Cardio

30 minutes on the Elliptical with the highest resistance I can manage with the goal of going a little faster or further each workout.

Immediately after the Elliptical workout, after wiping down the machine I move to the treadmill for a 1 hour walk at the fastest pace I can manage.

2. Lifting

30-minute warm-up on the Elliptical at the highest resistance I can manage. The goal is to get my heart rate up.

I use only machines for lifting due to a severely damaged hand, but these workouts can be done with free weights as well with the right equipment and weights, I do 3 sets of 15 reps to start with small breaks in between sets and increase the weight as I get stronger. After a month or two of lifting I add an additional set. The list of exercises is in no particular order, and I change it up depending on machine availability as well as how my arms are feeling. (I might do the abs or back after a strenuous arm lift)

1. Chest Press
2. Bicep Curl
3. Back Extension
4. Seated Row
5. Triceps Extension
6. Lat Pull
7. Shoulder Press
8. Pectoral Flys
9. Ab Crunches

3. Leg Day

30-minute warm-up on the Elliptical at the highest resistance I can manage. The goal is to get my heart rate up.

For the Leg routine I do four sets of 12 as there are less exercises

1. Leg Curl
2. Leg Extension
3. Leg Press
4. Rotary Torso
5. Ab Curls

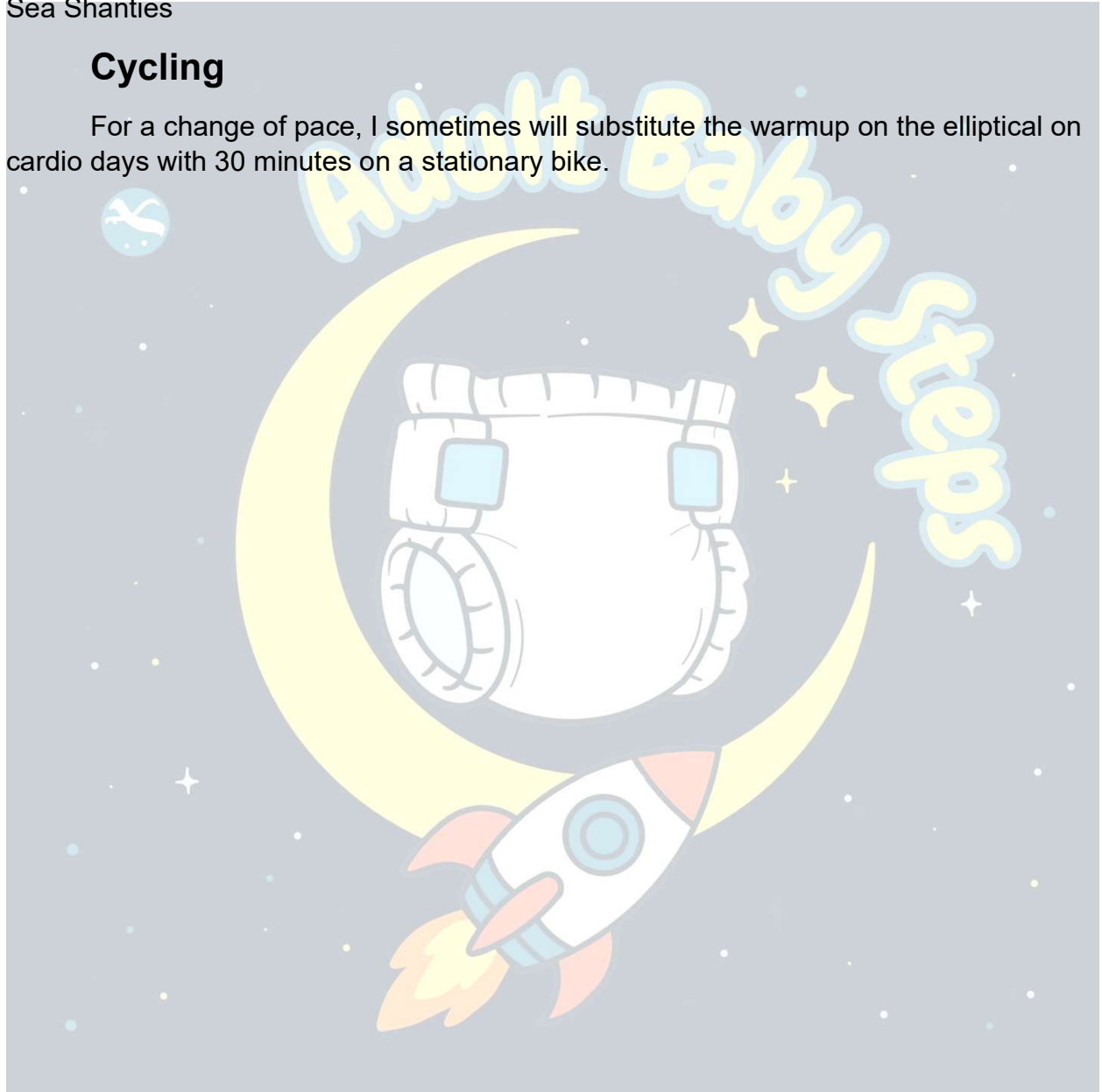
Substitutions

Rowing

For a change of pace, I sometimes will do 30 minutes on the Rowing Machine for the warm-up instead of doing the Elliptical. I particularly love doing it while listening to Sea Shanties

Cycling

For a change of pace, I sometimes will substitute the warmup on the elliptical on cardio days with 30 minutes on a stationary bike.



CHAPTER SIX HOW TO MAKE LONG TERM DIAPERS AFFORDABLE

Do you want to wear diapers more of even 24/7, but don't only because of the cost? This article is my personal experience over the past two years and counting. It may not apply to all but if it helps just one person that wants to wear often or even 24/7 then I will consider it well worth my time.

First a little backstory... I am a lifelong AB/DL. No joke, I was caught by my parents trying to wear my siblings' diapers multiple times as early as three years old and the desire never abated or diminished. Throughout my life I would continue to "hide my kink life" while I lived at home with parents and throughout my military service. I was medically discharged from the military after some horrible stuff occurred and I really struggled just to find a reason to live. Multiple therapists and really powerful anti depressants and I somewhat became a functional drone in society once more, but I wasn't a person... this is where diapers saved me. I started to wear more and for longer periods... what used to be an hour or two became a whole day or several and thanks to the medication and lack of caring what society thought at that point I started wearing in public... and I started to feel that semblance of happiness and being myself started to creep back into my life.

This is when I made the leap to wear 24/7 about six years ago, but that came with a cost. I had started at a great place of work a year before and had a decent career going for me, but 24/7 isn't cheap. Enough said, here's how I went about it:

- First tip: Get a long-term heavy absorbency diaper

My daily diaper is a Megamax with a booster... both at home and in public. That combo will generally last over 12 hours. So, I would essentially change twice a day. A case of Megamax is 40 diapers and the 2XL boosters I use from Northshore also can be purchased in packs of 40. The order comes out to be about \$220. Anything over \$200 from Northshore has free shipping... So based on that you'll have roughly 14-18 orders a year. That's around \$4k (On the high end) •

- Second tip: Investigate and invest in an HSA/FSA account

Many companies have a Medical Account option in their insurance plan. An HSA is a "Health Savings Account" and an FSA is a "Flexible Spending Account" They are both similar in a way but with some minor differences. The options and uses differ based on your insurance program but they can be used to buy quality medical diapers and even some AB/DL brands. (You need to check on this prior to enrollment and purchase because you will have to provide documentation to show this was an approved purchase.) So, in my example, my company limited HSA to only be used for prescriptions and doctor visits so purchasing diapers wasn't an option.

What I did was set up an FSA account. How that works is I decide how much money I want to allocate and as of Jan 1st that entire sum is available to me for the entire year. Every paycheck, a small sum is taken out which is where that money comes from but that advantage of doing this is that it is not taxed so the benefit is you essentially have more money for diapers by doing this rather than using your regular paycheck (That is taxed). I like to think of it as a tax free diaper loan. One downside is you have to use it or lose it... but that isn't ever really a problem.

- Tip Three: Adult Cloth Diapers are a realistic option.

Companies like Rearz has really been creating a lot of cute and viable AB/DL cloth diaper options. I have found and purchased several cloth inserts and diaper cover options off amazon recently as well and I highly recommend this option. There are obviously pros and cons to cloth diapers just as there are with disposable. In the case of cloth the initial cost is high, but after the initial purchase the cost is just laundry costs but as an individual who fully uses diapers I don't want to handle the clean-up with a messy cloth diaper... so like I said... Pros and cons, but although I prefer disposable diapers I have gradually been adding several cloth and diaper covers to my collection because they are both cute, but also are a great option.

- Tip Four: Find a career that allows you to live the life you want to live!

This last suggestion is for those naysayers and can noters who are gearing up in the comments to say that all of this is useless or impossible because of their job... Look, I have literally been there... The military actually has a bedwetting/incontinence policy that could be grounds for discharge. I was also worked as an armored car officer and that job would not have been a possibility for 24/7... I know that some folks have a dream job, and they can't or won't ever wear at their job... for others, diapers are sexual, and they can't wear, or they'd just be humping their desk all day... This suggestion is for people like I was whose life was improved by wearing diapers and they wanted to make that leap. Wearing diapers 24/7 is a lifestyle change... so it might be beneficial to change jobs/careers as well. When I applied to my new job, I went in saying that I wore diapers 24/7 (This was only said to managers and HR) If you are not comfortable with that you can just say you may or may not have a disability that you don't want to disclose and per HIPPA they can not discriminate against you. But my advice is to tell them because if a company will accept you for you then its already a good place to be. I hope you find these suggestions helpful to you. I plan on writing several more articles that I think might help others. If there is a topic you would like me to address or discuss, please let me know in the comments. If you have other ideas of suggestions let me know. Like I said at the start, I'm dedicating my time to discuss this to try and help that one person that needs this, so if that is not you or this particular topic isn't helpful that's fine, but please keep your naysaying to yourself and let me know what topic you'd like me to discuss, and I will.

CHAPTER SEVEN COMING OUT & OUTED

It is ironic that I am writing this article now in the way that I am as I was outed this week and rather than be angry, emotional, or trying to stop the spread of the information or bargaining with those that are now in the know I have decided that in order to be the most beneficial to my audience, you dear reader and friends I will relay to you what's going on in my mind, what I would have done differently, and how I am and will deal with this situation going forward.

First off, to lay some groundwork. There are generally two scenarios for coming out. The first is when you come out to someone on your own terms and timeline. The second and more difficult of the two is you are outed, either from social media footprints, search history, someone either finds you in a scene, or your stash of scene gear. Trust me when I say this is never easy and in my personal experience acceptance is dependent not on who you are as a person, friend or loved one, but on the person being told. People that view the world in only black and white and generally have strong belief systems may not be as open and accepting. The key thing to remember in all of this is that your goal should not be to “convert them.”

This is all going to be my own opinion, but I have come out to several people in my life, both on my own terms and also being discovered/confronted and also having been in the community for over twenty years I have spoken to hundreds of AB/DLs and offered advice on this topic. The first key thing to discuss is why would you or should you come out in the first place? This is your life, and it ultimately should be up to you if you want to come out, but there is one situation that I personally think requires someone to come out and be honest and that is when in a serious relationship. Hiding something like a sexual fetish or desired lifestyle should not be kept from a serious boyfriend/girlfriend and keeping that secret even into marriage could be viewed as cheating.

Now, that being said, I personally made the decision a long ago to only date within the AB/DL to remove this situation, but I once came out to a partner and although they were accepting, the person was not interested in taking part in the kink and for the duration of the relationship they would tease me with humiliating comments while I was trying to have a serious conversation. I know a few age players that their partners actually dove into the deep end of the AB/DL lifestyle when being introduced to the fetish and I know some who's partners want no part in the kink but they openly know that their partner is attending age play events and conventions and they are supportive.

Coming out is putting your whole being or soul out there to a person and essentially finding out how they will react. There are ways for you to test the water. In

my experience, the individuals that are less accepting of the LGBT community are not going to react well to the AB/DL fetish. For example, in my recent situation of being outed. My parents, divorced when I was four years old are politically similar, both are conservative, one is devoutly religious and has openly made ignorant statements while the other is not religious and has demonstrated an opinion that people should have the right to live their lives as they wish as long as it is between consenting adults and doesn't harm anyone.

When I was outed both of my parents were shown my AB/DL website on the same day and it was the religious one that immediately deemed that I needed psychological help and was living a life of sin while the other parent stood up for me to the other saying, "I don't understand it, but he is a grown, successful adult and what he chooses to do in his private life is his business and none of ours."

One year later -

I waited a year to write the last part of my coming out story. At this time, I have reconciled with both of my parents, but it took nearly a year of my absence from that person's life for them to apologize. There are some family members that I still haven't spoke to and I won't until they too apologize for their bigoted attacks on me and the life, I live that in no way effects or involves them. I can honestly say that although I never intended to come out to all of my family, it was a weight lifted from me and if anything, many of my relationships with family members is stronger because I truly know what kind of people they really are.

One thing I do regret is that some months later, after this incident occurred, a couple of my family members were over at my house and since they knew the truth I showed them my nursery. I am proud of the space I have built and all the craftsmanship it took to build it, but I could see after, that although they were accepting that was a step to far. I wasn't including them in any scenes or play and I was in complete vanilla attire when I showed them the space, but I know now it was the equivalence of showing them my sex toy collection, (which was well hidden) but I wouldn't recommend.

PART II THE NURSERY

This section of the book is devoted to those wishing to create a play space for themselves, but don't know where to start. A play space or nursery and it's surroundings can be ideal for some to help some AB/DLs wishing to escape or regress. For others the play space might not take the shape of a nursery and may be something more akin to a "Red Room" or BDSM dungeon... There are no wrong answers... the space should be reflective to what the individual kinkster desires.

Before getting started I recommend answering a few questions... whether or not this play space will be permanent or temporary? Will the space also occupy or double as another room, such as a bedroom, or will it be entirely independent? Lastly, are there concerns about discovery or the needs for discretion... Answering these questions will greatly help you in deciding how to proceed going forward. This part of the book will assist in helping you completely build your play space. You don't need to build your play space in a single afternoon, and in fact, I recommend doing so over a period of time... remember it is just baby steps. With each completed project you move one step closer in your goals. Doing so will make the process more affordable and is also a major motivator. Starting out small when doing projects and also help you build the skills to tackle a more complicated project next.

It took me over three years to build my nursery and even today, I make improvements and have plans for additions, modifications, and changes. If I were to offer any advice to someone that wants to embark on this monumental adventure, it would be to fully plan out a theme or central idea first and then brain storm exactly what "Big items" you want and where they would go first. Figuring out the paint on the walls or carpet and doing that first would be ideal to do first as for example, in my case, I'd need to hide or move all of my AB/DL furniture if I wanted to change my carpet if I have contractors do it or I'd have to do it myself.

I have no regrets from building my own nursery and I tried to make all of my designs as simple and straightforward for anyone who wishes to replicate them. For the most part they require no specialty tools and mainly all use simple tools such as a basic saw, cordless drill, and clamps. For each build in these chapters I list all of the parts and tools required and provide pictures of the step by step processes to replicate the builds. Trust me, the builds are far easier than you'd think, and they all utilize safe and structurally solid starting points such as a steel bedframe or bar chair that are then modified to become a crib or highchair.

CHAPTER EIGHT DESIGNING AND DECORATING YOUR ABDL NURSERY

You've decided to take the exciting leap that all Littles dream about, and you want to build a nursey of your own. As someone who has done just that I decided to write this suggestive guide to help give you some ideas and learn from my mistakes and benefit from my successes.

Before getting started, I suggest picking a central theme. The theme should be something that is close to YOU and makes YOU happy. That being said, I highly recommend writing down a few themes to brainstorm. After you have a few ideas, I suggest doing a google hunt for products and items that would be a wish list of items to realize the theme. Aside from the ABDL furniture, you need to think about paint, lighting, flooring, wall hangings/decorations, and things like storage. For this run through, I'm going to use my nursery as an example. I'll cover each aspect of the design and what I ended up doing.

My Theme

For my nursery I chose "Space/Rockets" as my nursery theme. I knew from repeated google searches there was a ton of products both baby and adult that made the theme ideal. One method you may want to try in testing/deciding on your theme is can you find a bedding/comforter set for your theme.

Walls

For my personal nursery, I decided not to paint the walls of my nursery. My house is over one hundred years old, and I like the unique/original woodwork and the neutral eggshell color, but that didn't hinder me from decorating the walls.

I started off with several wall hangings: a NASA flag, a massive technicolored tapestry of an astronaut floating in space, a tapestry of the solar system and a final hanging of the ABCs that was space themed. On the practical side of wall hangings I installed some small space themed shelves above my changing table that contains my wipes, powder, lotion etc.... easily within reach of a changer but more importantly I can easily reach them as well when I'm on the table so it helps when I'm changing myself. I suggest looking for corner shelves, stuffie hanging hammocks and other little things that can help tie the room together. Remember, this is your room and a safe space, so your opinion is all that matters.

The last piece I highly recommend is a fun and cheap little project that you can do and that is making and hanging your name, ABDL, BABY, or some other cute phrase in large letters. You can get large letter blanks at any hobby or craft store or even Walmart.

Floors

Carpets are ideal for a nursery/play space. If you are anything like me who loves their tummy time, carpets are necessary, but you can also get things like playmats and also large foam puzzle pieces to your floor. I have two playmats in my nursery. One by my changing table and the second larger one is in my main play space that also doubles as an ABDL Baby Gym. Like I mentioned in picking a theme, I found several space themed playmats in my brainstorming google search and bookmarked them when I got to the phase of the nursery build.

I personally try to keep most of my floor play space clear when I am not playing, but a large corner stuffie or Stuffie pile, bean bag chair or one or two large toys that can occupy a corner out of the way that won't present a tripping hazard are also great for the nursery space. My advice is to try and find the happy medium between cluttered and spartan. The nursery floor should look welcoming and an inviting place an ABDL would want to lay down or sit to play with easy crawl access to nearby stimuli.

Ceiling

This is an area that many overlook, but I highly recommend not neglecting this aspect of your nursery. Ceiling decorations and hanging stimuli such as a mobile, baby gym, glow-in-the-dark stars are many common stimuli found in nurseries.

What I did for my nursery was a number of things that kept with my space theme. The first was I replaced the ever common “salad bowl” light for a large LED “Moon” light that was remote controlled and featured various lighting settings. I'll discuss that item more in the lighting section, but changing the light to a moon dramatically changes the space when laying on your back and staring at the ceiling. The second aspect I added for the ceiling was I purchased a laser star/nebula generator. These nail the space theme for me, but I recommend looking into light show generators for your nurseries as they are cheap, often remote controlled, and require no installation or room modification.

The third ceiling modification I recommend is ceiling hangings. This is an easy way of adding more stimuli but does require minor room modification. What I did for my nursery is I built several Nasa Lego sets, such as the Space Shuttle, ISS, and the Hubble telescope, then using strong monofilament fishing line and a few small eyelet screws, I secured the models to the ceiling upside down and at various angles to imitate them floating in space. These three additions have made lying in the crib or on the nursery floor a stimulating and wonderful experience no matter where I look.

The hangings don't have to make sense like an imitation of space... You could fill the ceiling with floating squish mellores, dinosaurs, barbies, flying superheroes... let your baby imaginations run wild. Hanging a mobile from the ceiling, adding designer light or even ceiling stickers are also a possibility. My childhood room my parents

painted the ceiling to look like a sky with clouds and the ceiling fan had images of fighter jets on the blades. Be Creative! Be You!

Lighting

As mentioned in the ceiling section there are several creative main room lighting options available. The main room light fixture can be an expensive option but really can really help you mentally make that leap from a room to a nursery. The standard salad bowl or “Boob” light just doesn’t have the same feeling as a colorful lighting option. Some suggestions when making a lighting selection: Look for an LED option that is adjustable. Many lighting options today can change colors, intensity, and are dimmable. Another suggestion is to look for something that is remote-controlled. The “Moon” lighting that I installed in my nursery has a remote option and I can’t tell you how nice it is to be in the crib and be able to adjust the lights to my liking.

If buying and installing a new light fixture isn’t a possibility... no need to build a blanket fort to cry in... do build a blanket fort though... A creative option for lighting a nursery and also adding more fun elements is to get a basic smart home device and some smart lightbulbs. Many smart bulb options offer color changes, dimmability, and can be controlled through a phone app. You can also link smart bulbs with a smart home device to add a voice control option to your lighting.

Other creative lighting options to think about are things like: An end table Lamp, night light, LED strips, and wall or ceiling light projectors. There are tons of themed options for each of these lighting options. One option I want to touch on is the LED lighting strips. Creative installation of LED lighting can really make your nursery unique and a wonderful place. I placed LED lights along both the top rail and underside of my crib and also on the underside of all of the shelves of my changing table and diaper storage. The lighting not only adds mood to the room, but it also is a functional improvement as it lights all my diaper storage.

Storage

Having a place to store toys, packs of diapers, clothing, changing supplies, and other play gear is a must have for any nursery space. It also can offer tabletop space for various décor items like a night light, lamp, stuffies, toys or even offer more storage.

When I was looking at storage for my nursery, I first accessed the majority of my toys so I could have a better idea of what my needs were so I could get the ideal toy storage. I have a lot of blocks, toy RC construction toys, wooden train sets along with some hand puppets and large wooden playsets. I want something that would both display some toys but also could hold all the blocks and smaller toys that had lots of pieces. I found the perfect large toy box/shelf combo on Amazon.

My advice when selecting something is get the dimensions of the furniture piece and make sure that not only does it fit in the space in the room, but that it also can fit the toys that you want to place. All dimensions should be listed on websites. Other storage ideas can be under your bed/crib... most bed frames are fourteen inches off the ground which is the standard height of a diaper pack. Something else I have done is I purchased two large Rubbermaid containers designed to go under the bed. I can place loose diapers and boosters inside for storage. Small hanging shelves by the changing area are great for diaper changing supplies and a stuffie hammock are great for babies with a lot of little stuffed friends.

Amazon and Ikea are really solid places to look for storage options if you are looking for something in particular. Thrift stores are another great budget option that offers great DIY potential.

Toys

What AB doesn't love their toys? Well, toys can be used in more ways than just playing. Some ideas to try: Stuffedies strategically stationed in special areas of the room to protect you, wooden alphabet blocks spelling out fun phrases, Toys hanging from the ceiling, completed Lego models, maybe a wall full of Funko pops, action figures, my little pony, troll dolls, barbies, squishmellows... Your nursery, your imagination, your dream manifest! Make it happen!!!

Furniture

AB/DL nursery furniture like a crib, changing table, baby gym, play pen, rocking, and highchair are what a lot of folks may dream of having. I can tell you they are all possible, and I plan on writing articles on every single one of my DIY build ones for each. I will include the links to the base items I used for those builds in the meanwhile if you want to try to design your own. More to come on those article, but I suggest if you plan on one day adding these elements to your nursery to account for them if you are making a nursery space.

Crib

For a crib I recommend a canopy steel bed frame. The rails offer great support for rails and the bed frame is absolutely solid and you will avoid some of the issues when you try to convert a standard bed frame into a crib for my crib. I have built cribs in all three sizes, but my personal crib is full. I built the wooden rails four inches apart with a swinging gate. A box spring and mattress will place the crib bed at the perfect height.

Changing table

A changing table is something I use every day, and it was actually one of the easiest additions to my nursery thanks to inspiration I got at CapCon. I purchased a massage table which was available as changing tables at the Age player's Convention. I have included the link to the one I used but I wouldn't recommend it if you aren't planning to rebuild the table. It is a good table, but since it is a travel table for around \$100 it isn't the most solid unless it is rebuilt. I took the original legs off the table and built new legs with a shelf out of six 4x4s and some plywood. [Amazon.com: BestMassage Massage Table Portable Massage Bed Lash Bed 2 Fold SPA Table 24 inch Wide Adjustable Salon Bed with Non-Woven Bag for Spa Footmassage Facial CareSpa Tattoo,Black : Beauty & Personal Care](#)

Highchair

Right up front I will say that my highchair build was pretty expensive, but that is because it is not the first time, I have built a highchair and there were serious issues with stability, and I want to create builds that others can replicate. For this build, I purchased a garden bar chair from amazon. [Amazon.com: POLYWOOD® Traditional Garden Bar Chair, Black](#) The cost was \$350. I then cut a tray from a sheet of MDF. The tray clips on to the chair with genuine highchair clip hardware from amazon. [Amazon.com: Highchair Tray Hardware, baby toddler kid child seat stool antique vintage old retro : Baby](#) I also added a go kart harness for baby's safety. [Amazon.com: Yakitoko Universal 4 point Safety Harness Set 2" Fits Go Kart,UTV,ATV,Racing Blue : Automotive](#) and I used seat cushion foam, fabric, and a staple gun to add some padded upholstery. The last two things weren't really necessary, but the fabric was space themed to tie into my nursery and it was a challenge I thought I could accomplish.

CHAPTER NINE BUILDING AN ABDL BABY GYM

- 5' 3/4th inch PEX pipe - x4

The ABDL baby gym is built in four sections that will ultimately pressure fit together. The sections are the Mat, End caps, Cross connector and arms. It can be taken apart and stored in a matter of minutes. The mat can be kept out permanently in the nursery as the modifications required are hidden underneath and as long as the mat is thick, the buckles are metal, and the mat is located on carpet it is not a danger if stepped or crawled on.

The Mat

Prep: Poke a small hole 2 1/2" from the edge of each corner of the mat. Then cut the Nylon strap into four 3" strips. Use a lighter to burn the ends so it won't come unraveled over time. Fold the four straps in half and use the scissors to cut two small holes where both ends overlap so you can pass the Rivet screw through. Repeat four times. Use the lighter to seal the edges around the hole.

Assembly: Put a washer on the female side of the screw rivet and then push the rivet through the hole in the mat. Flip the mat over. Place the male buckle in the 3" strap and fold over so that the two holes line up then insert the rivet through both holes. Add a washer on top then screw down the male side of the rivet into the female. Repeat this step four times and the mat is finished.



The End Caps

Prep: Drill a hole through the center of each of the caps with a 1/4" Drill bit so that you can pass the 1/4" Bolt through. Paint the End caps (With the X connector when finished) This step is optional but recommended. Just like with the Mat, Cut 4 strips of the nylon Strap, but this time 4" lengths and repeat the step of folding them over and placing a hole where they over lap and sealing all the cuts with a lighter. Repeat four times

Assembly: Place a washer on the bolt then place the female end of the buckle on the 4" of strap and then put the screw through the hole on both sides of the strap. Then insert the bolt into the drilled hole of the end cap add a washer to the bolt on the opposite side and the locking nut and then tighten the nut. Repeat Four times and the end caps are finished.



- **The Cross connector.**

Prep: Make sure that the couplers fit snugly on the end of the PEX pipes and that the other ends can fit into the PVC Cross connector.

Assembly: Add a Bead of glue around the fitting of the PEX coupler that will fit into the PVC and then insert all four into the Cross Connector. (Make sure that you don't get any glue on the other side that will connect to the PEX Pipes. Paint the PVC Cross connector and the four couplers (This is optional but recommended)



The Four Arms

Prep: Cut the insulation (Pool Noodle or plumbing insulation) roughly 13 inches off the insulation if it is 6 foot. If not, cut the foam so that 1 Inch of the pipe is exposed if the pipe is inserted into the foam sleeve. Cut the Fabric with enough material to be able to fully wrap the foam. (I recommend Sewing, the material together into a sleeve but if you don't have the ability or access you can glue or double sided tape, but Sewing is recommended for best results.)

Assembly: Place the 5 foot pipe in the insulation then add the cloth cover over. (You do not need to glue the pipe. It will slightly move in the insulation when the pipe is bent and flexes.)

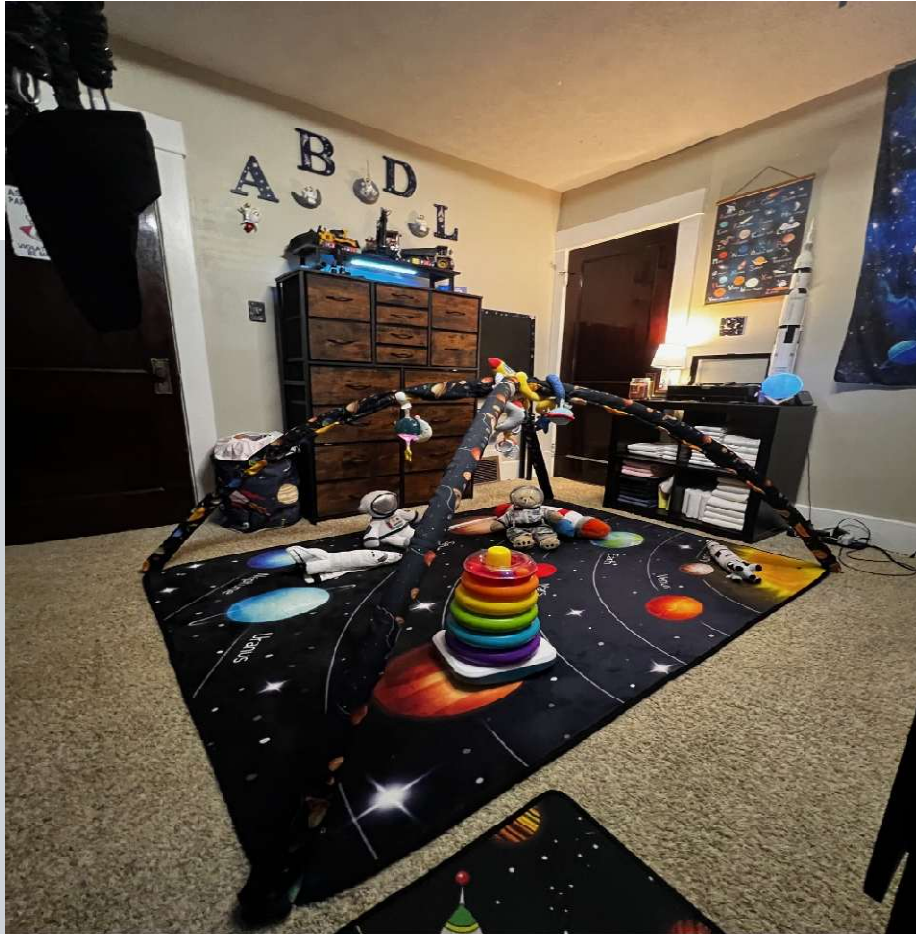


Total Assembly

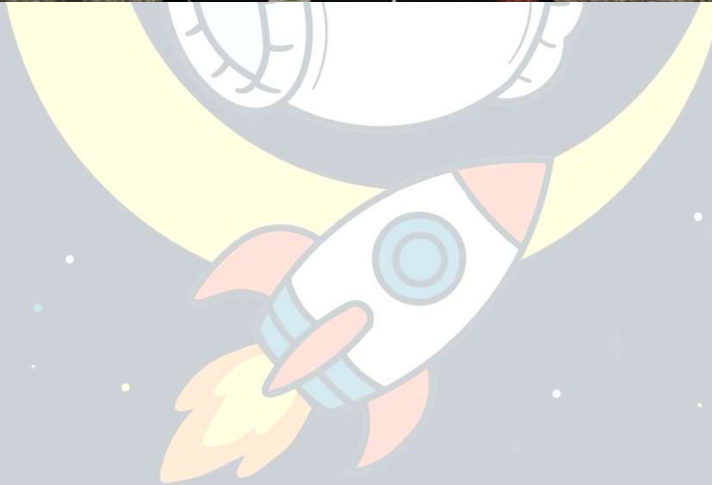
Add the End caps to one end of the pipes. (DO NOT GLUE... If you do and something breaks you'll have to replace the whole section rather than just a small piece because you won't be able to remove the bolt.)

Connect All four end caps to the buckles on the mat. Then one at a time insert the open end of the pipe into the Cross connector. Add some hanging toys and enjoy.

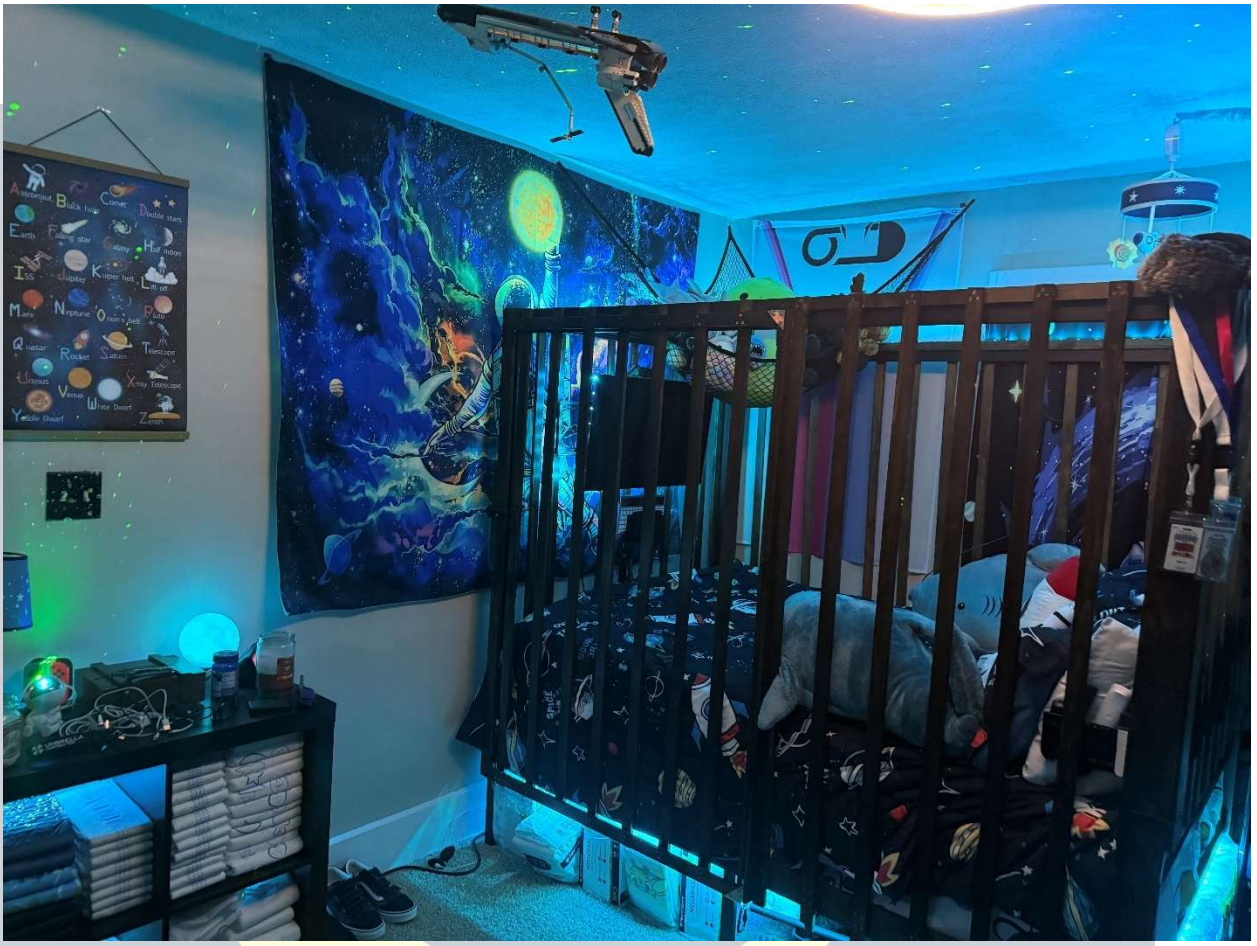

CHAPTER TEN BUILDING AN ABDL CRIB



This is my AB/DL crib build. A few things I want to address before I go forward because I have gotten feedback on some of some of my other designs from individuals that do not seem to understand what my designs are intended to be... I have created a design the requires the bare minimum knowledge, skills, and tools and I am releasing all my designs completely free. If you have opinions of how to make it better or things you do not like about the design, then I suggest you design your own nursery furniture set and give it away to the community as I have. I have a full woodshop and space and can design something far more complicated with joinery, engravings, etc. But that is not the intention of my work or these designs. This is so any AB/DL with \$500 - \$750 can build a crib of their own. So please understand that and be respectful.

Now, with that out of the way, this crib features a swinging gate rather than the slide rail. Although there are several ways to accomplish a lift up gate design when I did my original research on the crib I looked into and talked to several other AB/DL that I knew have cribs and there were several struggles with it for all of them and although I

know I could engineer a design that would work the cost and difficulty of the build would go up in that sort of implementation, which defeats the whole point of making this crib design simple and as uncomplicated as possible.

I personally have built this crib in a twin size, double size and in a queen size. I have a friend that also built her crib entirely on my design off just pictures and my CapCon presentation, so this is very doable. The crib utilizes a steel curtain bedframe that costs on average \$200 from amazon and is rated for 700 lbs. You will not need to modify the frame, so the integrity is 700 lbs., and the completed rails weigh less than 70 lbs. Another benefit of this crib design is that it is fourteen inches off the ground, which is perfectly suited for storing packs of diapers underneath the crib. I also personally used to underbed Rubbermaid tubs, one for loose diapers and the other is used for booster packs. Installed under glow LED lights both above and below the crib and I hung a TV inside the crib on the footer with a Nintendo switch hooked up as well.

The lumber I used for this build was simple construction lumber from Home Depot. I own a planer and so I ran all the wood through the planer to keep the costs to a minimum, but friends who have built this design substituted lumber from alternative sources that was of nicer quality that did not require that step.

All of that is not necessary, but they are options you could implement if you decide to build the crib. That being said... on to the build!

Note: Although the bedframe advertises that a box spring is not needed to achieve the proper crib height, I highly recommend investing in a box spring. I thrifted for one myself.

- 4 x 2 in corner brace (Used to strengthen the gate frame)



(Above samples of some of the hardware I used to build the crib. I did not use everything pictured but I did list everything that I used)

Tools Required

- Saw
- Drill
- Phillips head drive bit
- 1/4-inch counter sunk bit (These are great for predrilling holes that will counter sink for the screws.
- Measuring tape

- Cloth measuring tape.
- Several spring clamps in varying sizes (I purchased a lot at harbor freight Recommend at least eight of the largest size and 6 - 8 of the medium size. The more you have the easier some of this is)



For this build I cannot give direct measurements for cuts because I do not know what size crib you will being, and I did not keep records when I built two of the three cribs. But the build is very straight forward.

(Important: You should pre-drill and countersink every single screw. Also, it is especially important to make sure you do not over drive or screw and make sure you select the appropriately sized screw, so it does not come out the other side. I believe on average the shorter screws work best on the lower rails and the longer screws work best on the upper rails, but that is something you will need to access and decide on as you are working.

Step 1. Build the bed frame

All your measurements will need to go off the bedframe, so the first step is to build the bedframe. I recommend not installing the mattress slats as it will make moving around in the crib easier.



Step 2. Building the top rails

Cut the 2 2x3 boards so that they run the full length above the Header and footer of the frame. They need to be flushed against the metal so the rails can connect. Next measure the distance length wise between the header and footer and then cut the 2 1x1 boards so that the entire top of the crib has the four boards sitting atop of the upper rails.



Step 3. Cutting the Lower rails

Using four of the 1x4 boards you need to cut lower boards for the header, footer and lengthwise. These boards should be inside of the corners and flush against the bottom rails. Use the medium clamps to secure them in place.

(Note: The Header is shorter I placed the board on the second rail from the bottom as pictured below)



Step 4. Cutting and Enclosing the Crib frames

Using eight of the 1x4 boards you need to measure from the top rail down to the bottom rails and cut the boards. Next, I suggest using clamps and doing one side at a time you are going to create a “Picture Frame” by screwing the side boards to the upper and lowers. Repeat this on all four sides. See pictures below for examples.

(Note: See in the photo below of how the two corners meet. This is important to do the same)



Step 5. The Rails

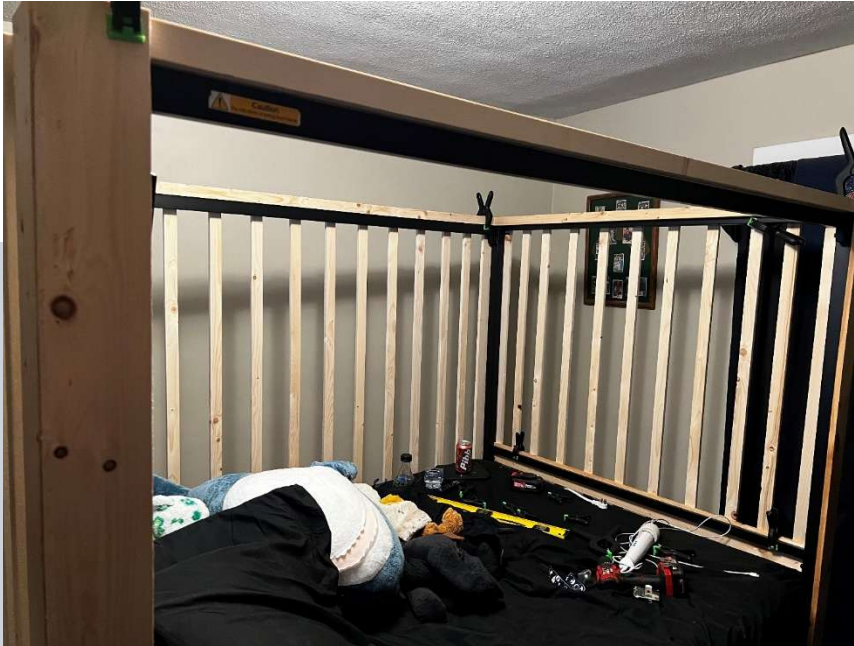
Now the fun begins! First you need to decide where you want to place the gate. So, you need to know which side of the crib will be against a wall etc. and make sure there will not be obstacles stopping the gate from swinging open. Once that is decided I recommend doing the Header, Footer and then the Lengthwise not gate side rails first. This process is repeated so it is not too technical.

First, cut the rails so that they will extend the length from the top rail to the bottom.

(Remember: The Header is shorter so do not cut all your rails to the header length)

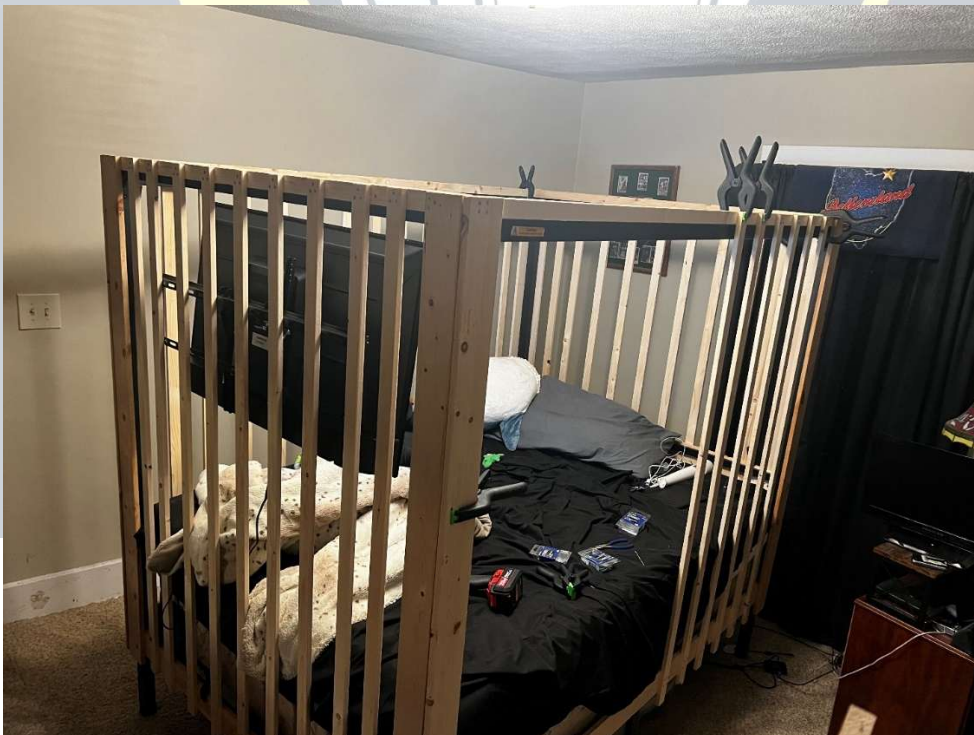
I personally hate math and did not try and figure out the perfect spacing to make them all exactly equal. What I did and recommend if you do not want to do that either is to find the exact center and your will start by placing one rail directly in the middle. Then using the cloth measuring tape you will measure four inches from the end of the middle and place a rail. Repeat that step until there is less than 8 inches from the end and place that final rail in the middle. Depending on the size of the crib you are building, that spacing will be roughly 3+ inches and is not very noticeable and will look like a feature. I am going off memory, but I believe the queen and Double crib sizes have the same number of rails on each side nine on the header and footer and thirteen on the non-gate side. The length side is the same process as the header and footer... just longer.





Step 6. Rails on the Gate Side

As mentioned in Step 5 you need to know what side you want the crib gate to open. In this example the gate is on the left side and swings open to the right. This is something you will have to figure out for yourself but is not too complicated. How I started the gate side is exactly how I did all the other rail sides. I first found the middle and I installed a rail in that spot. I then installed rails on the non-opening side.



Step 7: Installing the Gate Hinge

Taking one of 1x2 rail pieces you need to place them perpendicular to the middle rail. This rail should be cut short so that it is under the top rail (**Note: See in the image the example. Figure out where you want the three hinges to be. I personally cut and recessed my hinges. Some hinges do not need to be done this way, but I thought it looked better doing it that way.**)

Place your hinges and cut an identical rail to match up to the opposite side of the hinge, but do not secure it.



Step 8: Completing the Gate

A way to make creating the gate easy is to first figure out the length of the upper and lower of the gate and cut those two pieces. Then using the clamps and measuring tape, measure out four inches and secure the first rail of the gate, then the second, third etc. This will give the gate rigidity for you to use the four corner braces to finish off the gate. Using a scrap piece of rail place the piece at the end on top of the 1x4 corner piece so that the gate can rest flush. On this piece install your gate lock or latch. Install the gate handle at the end of the gate.



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Step 9: Stain or Paint

At this point you should have four completed crib sides. Take each side off, sand, prime or prep, and either paint or stain the rails as to the look you prefer. I personally think stain is easier and looks nicer, but I have friends that painted their cribs as well.

(Note: If you do decide to stain make sure you add a protective coat of Polyurethane or some other finish)

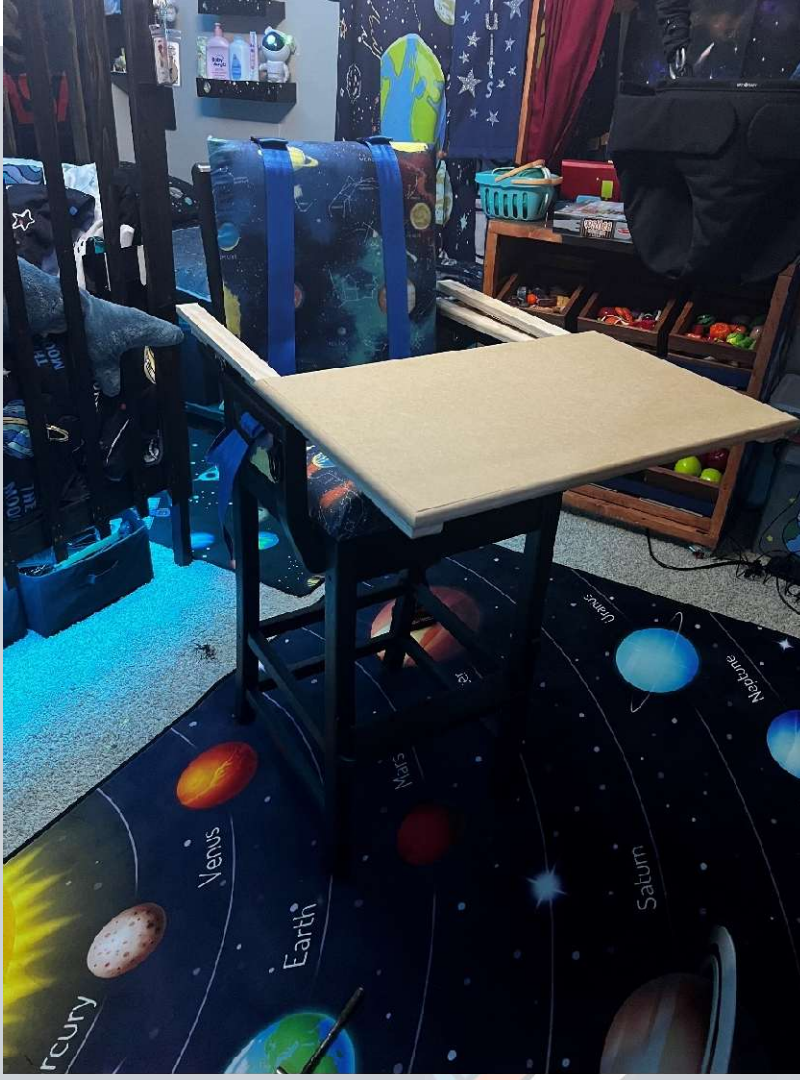
Step 10: Final installation

I recommend putting the box spring and mattress on the bed frame before you even begin to put on the rails for the last time, but you can technically wait until putting on one lengthwise rail. Once you have all four rails on you are going to use the twelve 4-inch corner braces. I just eyeballed their placement, but there will be three on each corner. One at the top, middle, and bottom. These braces will effectively hold the four sides in place and the top bars, thanks to gravity, will keep everything secure.

CHAPTER ELEVEN BUILDING AN ABDL HIGHCHAIR



Before Purchasing Anything Please look over this whole build! There are several options, upgrades, and ways to build this highchair. This is my third iteration of building an AB/DL highchair and with the first one I just used a wheelchair tray and a highbacked bar chair. With the third build I had added anchor points, a custom tray that uses genuine highchair tray hardware, as well as an upholstered seat and back. I also added a harness to secure squirming babies and anchor points for more kinkier scenes.

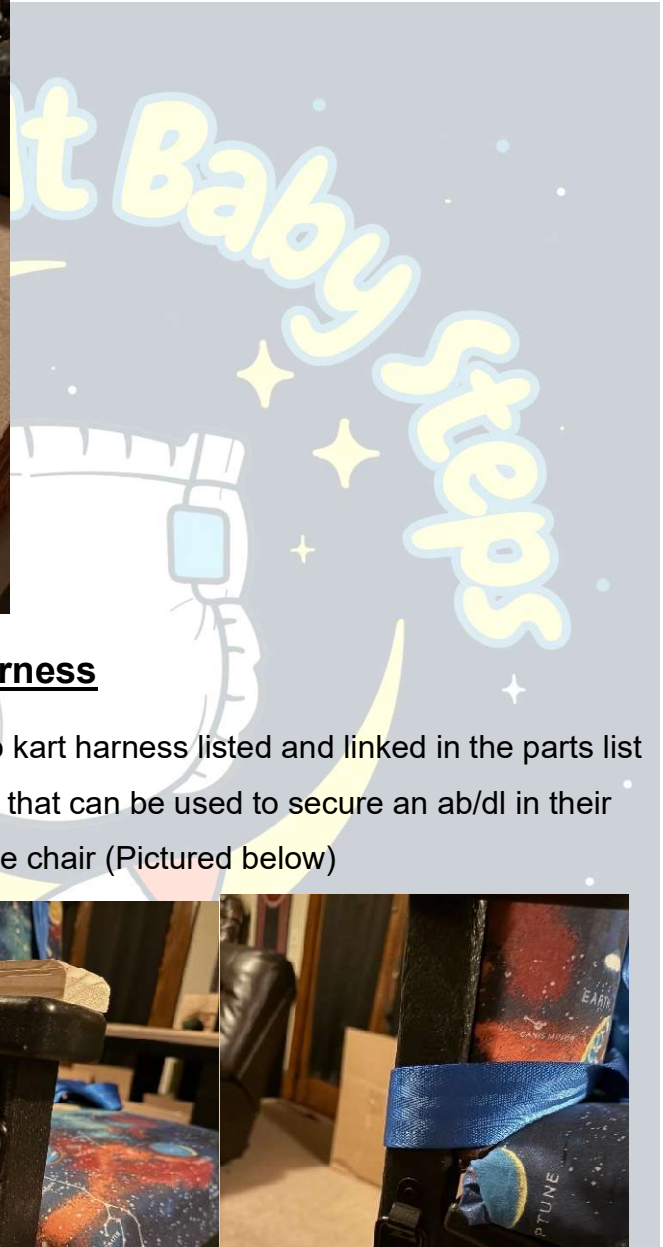

This can be the easiest build or a complex one depending on what you are wanting to create. You can also always upgrade the chair as you go.

Basic build

For the basic build you only need two components. A high-backed bar or deck chair that has arms and a wheelchair tray. This build requires no tools at all. Simply use

the Velcro straps on the wheelchair tray on the arm rests of the chair.



Adding Anchor Points & Harness

Using the anchor points and the go kart harness listed and linked in the parts list you can add a harness and anchor points that can be used to secure an ab/dl in their seat. I placed six total anchor points on the chair (Pictured below)



The first set are at either side of the footrest. The second set is just below the front arm rest and the last set is at the back of the chair just by the seat. To install the harness, you will need to pre-drill the hole roughly three inches, six inches apart from the middle back post of the chair. I recommend taking one of the bolts supplied with the harness to a hardware store to find a drivable screw that will fit the harness. (Make sure it is not going to go through the seat back).



Building an Upholstered Chair Back and Seat

To upholster the chair, first, I highly recommend watching a couple of videos on YouTube. The process is very do-able and easy but watching someone do it first will make it far easier. To start you are going to need to have a piece of MDF cut to fit the chair back as well as the seat. You will also need upholstery foam, a staple gun and fabric. For mine I chose an outer cover (Space themed cloth and a back cover (Solid Blue)

To upholster the seat and back, place the fabric that will cover the seat. (Outer side down first) then the upholstery pad then the MDF on top. **Recommendation:** Have several extra inches of spare material. You will be covering it with the back cover later.

I personally found it helpful to kneel on the MDF board. Compressing the padding with the weight as you staple the material to the board will help remove creases and will keep the material tight. Secure one side at a time. Once all four sides are stapled you can cut excess material and then add a back cover material to clean up your work. Then use screws to secure the cushions to the chair.



Building a Custom Highchair Tray

To start, you will need to secure a piece of wood to the armrests with screws. This will add height so that your legs will not hit the tray if you add cushions and additionally it will give you a place to mount the hardware. (See below)



To build a custom highchair tray you will need to cut a tray either from a plywood sheet or you can use a piece of plywood or MDF cut into a 16" x 25" sheet and add runners with screws to make the tray. Both examples are shown below. **Note:** I cannot give exact measurements of where to put the hardware and runners because you will need to line everything up. I suggest using clamps and marking things with a pencil as you figure out how everything lines up.

Lastly, you **MUST** seal the tray with a clear coat, polyurethane, or some other product otherwise it could seriously warp or absorb any liquid.



CHAPTER TEN BUILDING AN ABDL CHANGING TABLE



Recommendation: Although this build worked out for me, I would not repeat this build and would not recommend it unless you already had one of these massage tables and wanted to convert it into a changing table. There are several options on amazon that are the same product, and the cost of the table is the same it all the labor materials and time it would take to build this table.

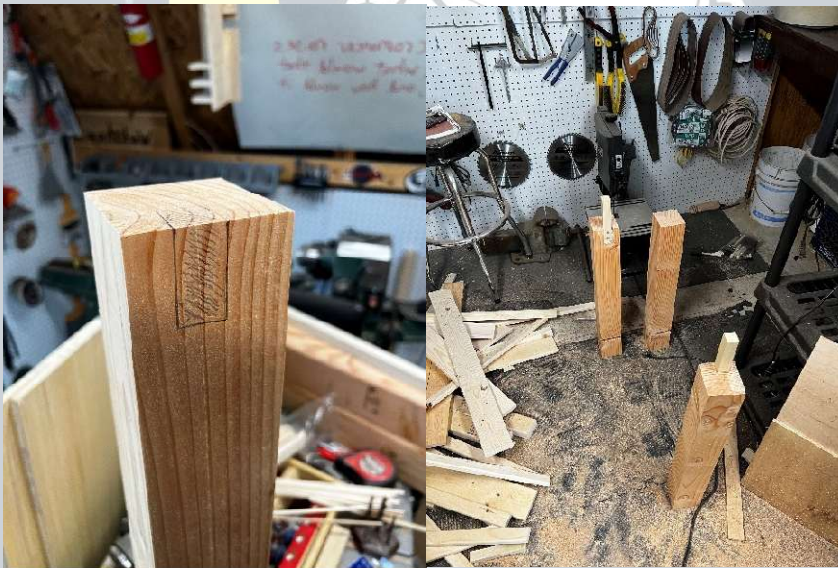

Starting off, this build can be completed without any DIY or modifications depending on what massage table you select to be your starting project. I produced this build concept after attending CapCon for the first time and saw that all the changing rooms had a foldable massage table to be used as a changing table. It was such a brilliant idea for me that I decided to buy one as we were driving home. That being said... if I were to do it all over again, I would not have gotten the table that I purchased. I am incredibly happy with it now after the modifications I made, but I had purchased the cheapest table available on Amazon. It had skinny wooden adjustable legs and never felt very solid unlike the ones at CapCon.

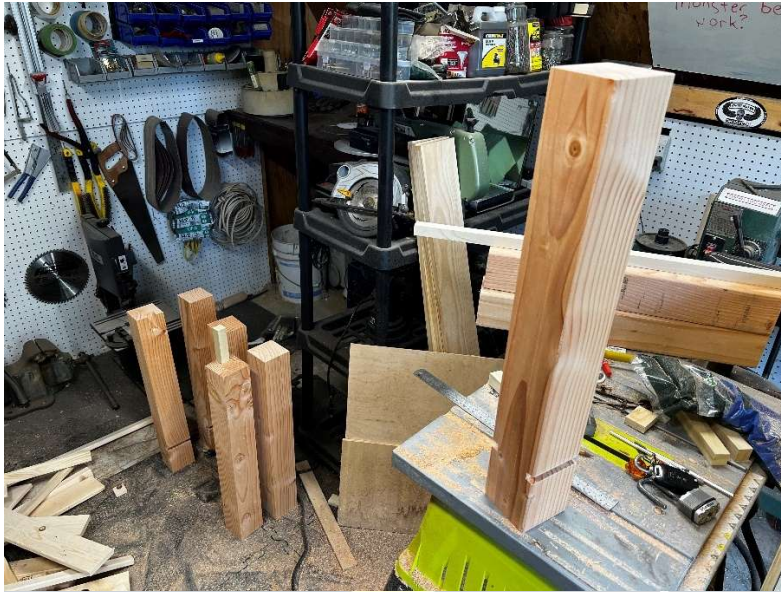


Improving the table was easy enough. I removed the original legs by unscrewing the single screw that secured each leg and then I cut six 4x4 pine posts to my desired leg height. I then marked where the 1x1 inch legs had been on each of the posts and then using a router I removed a two inch long by 1 inch channel in each post so that it would match up with the leg slots. I then glued in the one-inch dowel rod.



To add an under shelf and to add more stability to the legs I cut a 1/4-inch groove using the router in each of the posts on the left and right and two on the two middle

posts so that I could slide two MDF sheets between them to act as shelves.



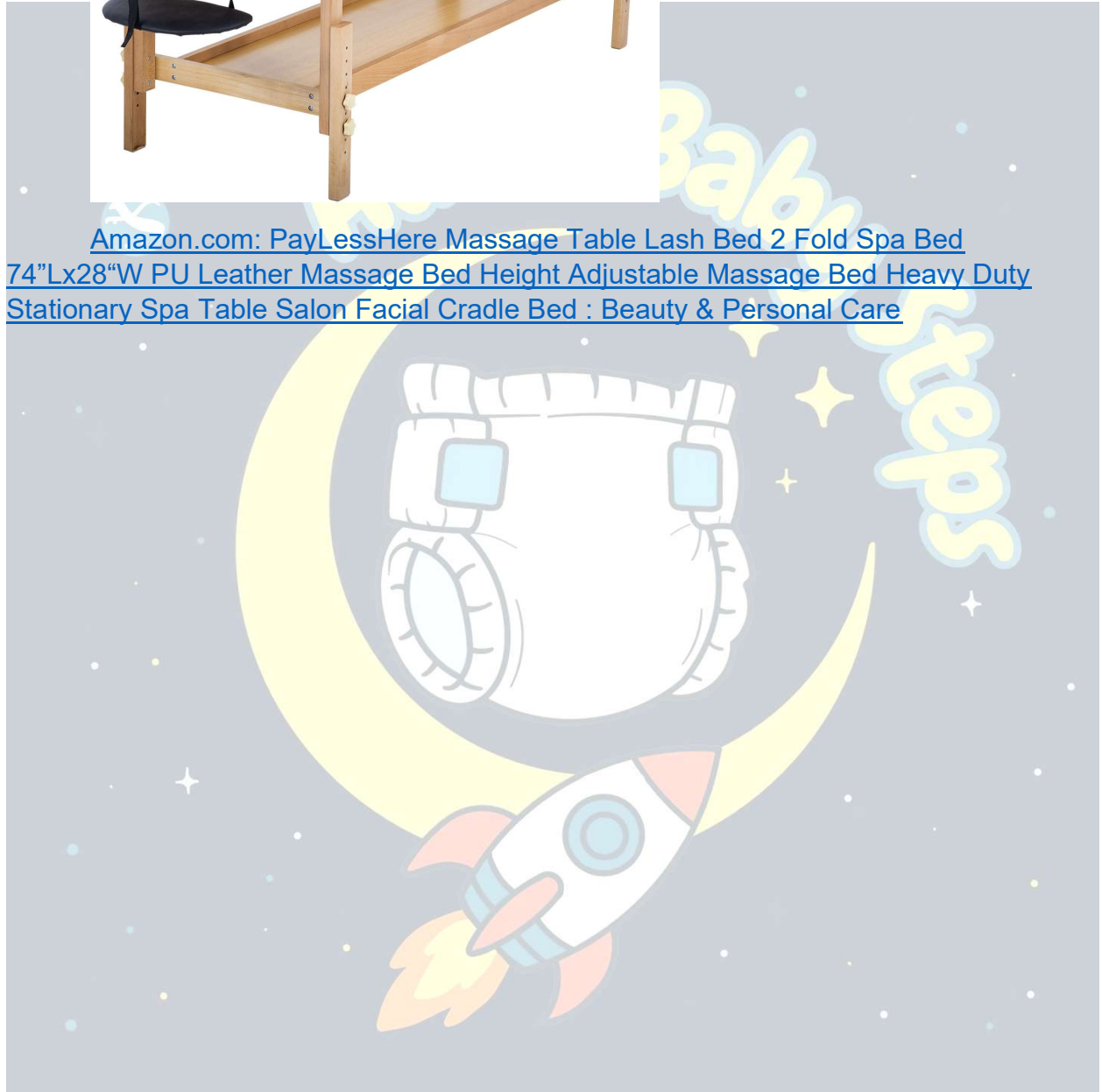
Lastly, I added a strip of the 2-inch boards, one at the point of the shelf and the second at the top just below the tabletop.



My recommendation to someone looking to have a changing table of their own is to purchase a better quality and designed massage table. You could potentially find a rock-solid table and just put shelves underneath it or even simply slide a shelving unit under the table rather than having to build it.

CHAPTER BUILDING CUSTOM DIY BABY BLOCKS STORAGE SHELVES



As with most of my designs, this project is meant to be simple and does not require a great deal of tools, skills, or talent. Just to be clear, if you followed my building process on this project on social media, I did use a laser cutter to cut the letters for the blocks, but that is not necessary. I originally picked out letter cut outs that can often be found in most crafting stores, Amazon, and even at Walmart. I didn't personally use this option myself because I wanted the letters to be in "Baby Block" font and it was a simple task to download that font on laser cut it since I have a laser cutter.

That being said, if you feel up to the challenge and wish to also make that extra step and do not have a laser cutter the simple work around is to download the Baby Block Font, (or whatever font you wish to use) then Print your desires letters at roughly 12 inch height, then use the printed letters as template to mark it on 1/4th inch plywood (I personally prefer Basswood) and then use a hand saw, jigsaw, band saw, or scroll saw to cut it out. Or you could outsource to someone to laser cut your letters. The font download is below.

Build Instructions

For this build, first you'll need to build the shelves following the instructions as included with the product. Once the shelf is built, we are going to move on to paint.



Make sure you are in a well-ventilated area, and you just need to flip the shelf so that the back is facing up. (If you don't trust your skills, you can mask the sides to avoid overspray with masking tape) Paint the entire back of the shelf white as well as each of the letters if they are not primed. Let the paint dry according to the recommended directions.

Once the white paint has dried. Select one of your letters, one acrylic paint color, and one of the cube shelves. Simply paint the lip (outer edge) of the cube as well as the letter. You may need to apply multiple coats. Once the acrylic craft paint has dried, use the glue and apply it to the back of the letter and apply it to the back of the cube as centered as you can. Add books or some minor weight to provide pressure and leave for the adhesive to dry as the product recommends. Repeat using different colors and letters.



Optional: If you want, you can use clear spray paint to seal everything in. I recommend a flat clear paint as the building blocks don't have a glossy finish usually. The shelves should be light enough to easily move around, but for an added effect I placed them on a 12-inch lazy Susan rotating table I got on Amazon for \$12 so I could easily turn the stacked blocks.

CHAPTER DIY A SPREADER BAR

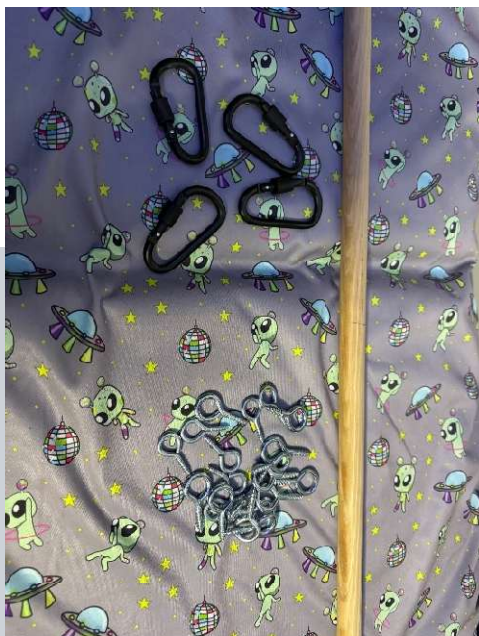


This isn't the cutesy build of a crib or rocking horse, but it is a great build to get started with and amazingly simple to do. The spreader bar can be made in various lengths and depending on how it is employed it can cause the wearer to crawl or waddle or be incapable of placing their hands together. There's nothing wrong with having several spreader bars of various lengths and more than one can be used at a time and they can even be connected to causing various bondage/punishment situations.

You will need to get some sort of padded cuffs, restraints, or rope to incorporate a spreader bar, but if you are looking to experiment with those, a spreader bar is a great item to complement those for play.

Tools

Power drill
1/4 inch drill bit
Saw

Build

This is one of the simplest builds and a great item for the BDSM scenes. The first step is to cut the rods to whatever lengths that you desire. Then drill a hole at either end and then screw in the eye screw. (Optional) You can also drill a pre-hole in the midpoint of the rod and add an eyelet there as well to be used to link the rod to other rods, rope, etc.... your imagination is your limitation. Add the locking carabiners to the eyelets and you have an excellent spreader bar.

(Optional) You can paint the bars in your choice of color if you decide to do so. I recommend removing the hardware before painting as the carabiners will scratch the eyelets quickly if you decide to paint them.

CHAPTER MONKEY ROCKER ROCKING HORSE CONVERSION BUILD



This build is intended for those AB/DLs and age players that want a rocking horse in their nursery that also doubles as a toy for more “adult purposes.” What this design does is convert a Monkey Rocker sex machine into a more nursery looking rocking horse. The only modification needed for the monkey rocker is to drill three holes into the hand hold. Everything else is just building the horse head that will make up the rocking horse. I recommend reading the whole build instructions before attempting otherwise you may have issues. (Like using too much double-sided type then can’t separate the pieces)

Disclaimer: Although I always try and use basic tools for my builds, I did cheat a little bit, and I used a laser cutter to cut out my initial template. This is not required at all, and you can simply blow up and print the image I will link to what I used. My template was sixteen inches long, but you don’t need to be exact.

The rocker I have and recommend I got on Etsy from BeKinky Gear. Link Below:

Tools Needed

Recommend a jigsaw, scroll saw, or a band saw (Cutting out the horse) You technically could use a hand saw but that would take forever.

Drill

¼ inch drill bit

7/8th spade or Forster bit (For drilling the handle hole)

Scissors (Cutting Yarn for Mane)

Double sided tape (Try to get something with a low adhesive weight. Mine was 15 lbs. strength and separating the two pieces later was a struggle for 10 minutes. I have tips on how to make it easier to separate if you can't find a lower strength)

Sander

Sharpie

(Optional) Router with a ¼ round over bit

(Optional) Glue (If you choose to add eyes)

A couple strong clamps

Metal wire coat hanger or thin bendable wire (For the mane)

7/8th dowel rod cut down to 14 inches (Handle)

(Optional) Eyes for horse head

(Optional) Paint for painting if you choose.

Build Instructions

To start as mentioned in the introduction you will need to create a template or find one online. The one I used was:



As I mentioned earlier, I used a laser to create a template, but you can simply enlarge the image to be roughly 15-16 inches long and print it out.

Once you have a template, traced two mirror images of the template in the ½ MDF board with the sharpie and cut is out using whatever saw you have available/prefer. I'd recommend cutting most of the large pieces out first before going in to do the detailed edges.



Once the two pieces are cut out, also cut your 7/8ths dowel rod to be 14 inches long and then set it aside for later. That should be all the cutting you need to do on this project. Use a few strips of double sides tape to adhere the two pieces of the horse head together. This will help with making sure everything lines up and will make doing the work twice as fast and easy (Caution: don't use too much tape as it will make it exceedingly difficult to separate the two pieces the more you put on).



I recommend sanding the edges of the head to make them nearly identical and you can use a router (Optional) or the sander to round over the outer edges. While sanding you can use the sander to round over the handle rod ends. Once the shaping of the head and handle is entirely to your liking, take it to the monkey rocker along with your drill affixed with the 1/4 drill bit,

the 7/8ths bit, a sharpie, and the clamps. (DO NOT SEPARATE THE PIECES YET)

You need to line up the head where you want it to be over the hand hold. Place the head to the left side of the hand hold of the monkey rocker and clamp it in place so you will be drilling into the monkey rocker first. Drill three centered holes. I placed a bolt through each so I could adjust the clamps to drill the next hole. Once the three holes are drilled and the head is mounted you need to mark the location for the handle.



I recommend sitting on the rocker and placing your hands where you feel they would naturally rest on the handle, the mark that location. (Be sure that there is at least an inch and a half of material between where the handle hole will be and the edge) Next, mark seven places roughly an inch from the edge roughly where I placed my bolts (ignoring the 3 for the handle. See image to the right) These seven will be what holds the horse head together. And serve as the internal support for the mane. Once everything is marked, remove the head from the monkey rocker and drill out the holes for the handle using the 7/8ths bit and the 1/4 bit for the support holes (Caution: Be careful as you drill through the material as going too fast or adding pressure can cause blow out or tear



out. Taping the opposite side with masking tape, drilling a pilot hole at a smaller diameter so you can accurately drill from both sides, and/or slowing down when nearing the opposite side and slowly exposing the bit and then drilling that side are all recommended)

Now that all the holes are drilled, test fit the bolts and handle before separating the pieces. (Helpful Tip: You may need to use something to pry the two apart like a flat head screwdriver. Another helpful method I used was to use a putty knife or a long thin piece of metal and tap it into the areas that the double-sided tape was effectively separating enough of it so that I could pull the two pieces apart with my hands.)

With the pieces now separated put the head temporarily together using a washer, then bolt through the panel then add a spacer in the middle then the other side followed by a washer and finally the nut. Only hand tighten everything. Now either use your coat hanger or the thin metal rod and you are going to wrap it around the spacer at the nose, then the spacer by the ears, and around the last two spacers down the back. (Example pictured:



The wire doesn't have to be neat or very tight, it just needs to be secure enough that it isn't exposed when the head is assembled and secure enough that it won't easily be pulled out if someone tugs on the mane.

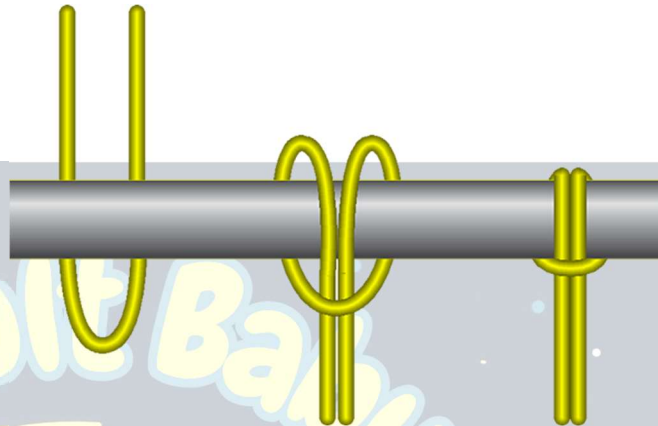
Creating the Mane

At this time, you can take the head apart but just one half and add the bolts on top of the spacers so that the bolts remain sticking upholding the mane wire in place. Once you have done that you can set the head aside for a time while you prepare the materials for the mane. What you will need is our yarn, scissors, and a book that is roughly 6-7 inches across. I used my hardcover copy of the cat in the hat for this. You then will wrap the yarn around the book until you have wrapped the whole spool of 65 yards or whatever you can manage. You can do this step multiple times if you need to. (Tip: You'll want to try and wrap the yarn evenly and not bunch up too much in areas otherwise the mane strands will not be somewhat equal in length.)

Once you have your yarn wrapped around the book, place the spine on a desk or table so that the page ends are facing up and then using the scissors cut the yarn so that you create a pile of hundreds of 12-14 inch strands depending on the book you chose to use. (Helpful tip: Using a hardcover book will provide you with a small separation in between the cover and pages to fit the scissors making cutting easy)

Now with your pile of cut mane strands you can start attaching them to the wire. The method is quick and simple, but tedious. Grab a strand, fold it in half and then secure it using a girth hitch (Example pictured:

This will take quite a bit of time, and you'll want to work your way from one direction all the way to the other. I went from the back and worked my way to the ears. (Hint: If you are doing assorted color patterns, you'll want to have some sort of plan as you affix the mane strands.)



After what feels like an eternity you will finish and now you are nearly done! I suggest test fitting everything one last time. At this point you can be finished, but I will recommend that if you are happy with how the MDF looks then at least add a couple of layers of clear coat. (MDF can expand and absorb liquid and by adding several layers of clear you can possibly avoid those issues.



Regardless of whether you opt to clear or paint you'll need to disassemble everything (the mane comes off easily on the wire, so you won't have to re-tie everything. You can also add eyes to your horse using adhesive after painting if you want to go that extra step. Just be sure if you are using enamel paints to give it a couple of days to

fully cure. I personally decided to paint the monkey rocker seat the outer parts as well. If you purchased an unpainted/natural rocker that is also an option to tie everything together, so it doesn't look like a disembodied horse head on a sex machine. Once the clear or paint has had time to cure you can assemble everything and enjoy.

CHAPTER DIAPER SCOUTS UNIFORM BUILD



Disclaimer: This build has nothing to do with any official scouting organizations as they involve minors and although have a bad reputation already. I sourced the merit badge sash, generic unit numbers, and shoulder tabs from the BSA organization, they are general uniform pieces that I could have sewn or created myself and do not have any identifying marks that directly tie to the organization. It was cheaper and faster to just order them than to make them myself but if you don't want to order from them these could be made or found elsewhere. None of the merit badges or pins are directly tied to any scouting organization and were sourced from places like Etsy and Amazon and are novelty merit badges. I DO NOT recommend wearing this outfit in any public spaces and made it specifically for events like CapCon, AB/DL events, and private role play scenes.

This is a somewhat expensive build depending on how many merit badges and pins you want to add to the uniform. But the basic Beret, neckerchief, shirt shorts, socks

and belt is also an option. As a former military officer, I wanted to have a lot of items and greeblies on the uniform. As with most of my builds, I wanted to make this as easily replicable as possible so nearly all items are iron all and not needing sewing.

Build Instructions

Before starting this build, I highly recommend figuring out how far you want to go with it and pricing out things... You can always add to the uniform, so you don't necessarily need to pay for everything upfront.

(Roleplay Option: If you have a caregiver or are apart of an AB/DL group you can make arrangements that you have to "Earn" each adulting badge if you want to make a fun dynamic and game out of the scouting uniform)

The Basic Uniform pieces to start are the Shorts/Skirt, Shirt, Socks, Beret, belt and your choice of shoes. You could also consider a green or tan dress if you'd like a different female scouting option but that will make pin and badge placement up to you.

Before Ironing anything on I recommend pinning everything first, so you get a general idea of how and where you'd like to place everything.

Ironing Items on

If you have a Cricut Press I personally used 275 degrees for 20 seconds, I directly pressed the badge and then flipped the item and pressed the opposite side for the same time and temp and let it cool down. I did not have to sew most of the pieces with this method. If you have an Iron that is not adjustable set it to the Dry setting and I'd recommend trying the same times on only one badge to start as a test and check the results following letting the item cool. You may need to do longer or less depending on your iron.

Item Placement

I'm going to list each piece and where I placed it one at a time so if you opt to not use or want to wait on getting something you can either skip that section or go back to it if you decide to add it.

Sleeves

ABDL Pride Flag: I wanted the flag to "fly forward" (It's a military thing) so the AB/DL pride flag is on the LEFT arm one inch down from the shoulder seam and the Left edge of the flag lined up on the Left shoulder epaulet. I was able to Iron on the flag that I purchased and is linked in these instructions, but I did sew it on with white thread in addition to the iron on. It was the only badge that I felt needed to be sewn.

Unit Number Badge: Using whatever numbers you select, (I chose 069) Line-up the 2-3 numbers so that they essentially mirror the flag on the opposing arm. The numbers are one Inch down from the seam on the RIGHT arm and the first number lines up from the edge of the epaulet and the remaining numbers follow behind butted up behind.

Shirt/Pockets

Name Tag: Whether you get the get a magnetic name tag or have a pin on one, the name tag is placed on the left pocket flap centered.

Little's Pride Pin: The Little's Pride pin is centered above the pocket roughly ¼ of an inch above the pocket.

Diaper Merit Badge: The Merit bag is ironed on 1/4th inch over where the Little's Pride pin would be or the bottom edge of the badge is one inch above the pocket. (Hint: On the male version of the shirt the badge completely covers the two officer badge stitches above the pocket.

Shoulder Loops: These simply slip on the epaulets and are centered (Note: If you have a merit badge sash the right Loop will not be visible.

Mini diaper pins: These are added on the collars centered and one inch up from the bottom of the collar point.

Merit Badge Sash

Whatever badges you chose to use, I recommend trying the sash on first to know how things will line up and then placing the badges out, two per row, and ironing them on in batches. I used 18 patches on mine and that nearly completely covered the front of the sash when worn.

Beret

Having worn a Beret in the military, I have some recommendations for wearing and conditioning it. First, if the beret is very “fuzzy” you can use a safety razor to shave it smooth. Secondly, I recommend soaking the beret in warm water and then putting it on to shape it so that the beret naturally folds over smoothly to the right. The beret that is listed in the links has an internal patch backing built in. The Large enamel diaper pin is centered on the beret in line above the wearer’s left eye.

CHAPTER JOINING THE ABDL COMMUNITY

Part 1: Safety

Diapers, age play, feeling little, or maybe being a caregiver is your thing, but you want to make the leap to meet with others to play and start relationships with like minded individuals. This series of articles is for you.

The AB/DL community spans the globe with a large number of littles, caregivers, subs, and doms. Finding individuals, organized groups, play parties, events and even conventions, all comes down to knowing where to look, but before we talk about networking, safety is the first thing to discuss. As they say... Safety first!

Safety First

Please read this next section and know that meeting other AB/DLs and attending events carries with it the same risks as dating or going to a bar does. If you act safely and do your due diligence, then meeting other like minded individuals is a pleasant and normal experience. I personally have met with hundreds of AB/DLs over nearly 20 years in the community as well as attended several age play conventions and I would recommend it for all, but you need to do so safely and also feel safe doing so. Showing others your little side is when you are most vulnerable and so it is important to establish trust early on.

Never Never! Never!!! give out your private information. Use a scene name. Something easy to remember, spell, and say. Giving out your personal name and personal information such as your occupation, zip code, or other identifying details are what phishers, blackmailers, and doxers are trying to gather on you. Revealing your state or country can help find genuine AB/DLs in your area. If you live in a major city it may also be acceptable, but just remember the more information you give out, the better possibility someone could try and take advantage of you.

If you are meeting someone for the first time it is always a good idea to have a few safety precautions in place. First, always have a “secret keeper.” What this means is you tell a trusted person or group who you are meeting with, where you are going, when, and make sure they know you will check in after the meeting. If you only have vanilla friends that you are uncomfortable telling, Let online AB/DL friends know. (We will talk about how to meet and make those friends shortly) The point of having a secret keeper and letting the person you are meeting know that someone knows were and when you are meeting as a deterrent. This is a normal safety practice when dating for the first time or going to areas you haven’t been to or are unfamiliar.

The second safety practice you should follow when meeting someone for the first time is to meet in a neutral public space. Although many ABDLs may want to rush right

into do a scene, at someone's place or a hotel room it is important to meet the person first and make sure they are someone that you not only feel safe to be around, but also passes what I like to call the "Smell test" The smell test not only refers to the literal BO aspect that may be a turn off, but also refers to any metaphorical issues or behaviors that may make you not wish to proceed with a future relationship.

Another safety practice that is important to follow when you are planning on meeting someone is to keep the hormones under control and never participate, agree to, or plan anything while you are either intoxicated or blindly horny... You must be sober and clear headed or lines could be crossed that either party didn't understand existed. Save the hormones for later when you have built trust with each other and have a clear understanding between the two of you of safe words, consenting, and what are your dos and don'ts. Having these conversations will ensure you have realistic expectations moving forward and there are no miscommunications that would cause a feeling of being unsafe.

"If it sounds too good to be true then it probably is!" I am sorry to say this but there are several fake mommies/daddies, littles and downright scammers that exist that try and prey on desperate AB/DLs looking to play with someone. I have mainly experienced these scammers on social media accounts like Instagram, twitter and blue sky. The conversation nearly always occurs the same way. An individual will private message asking basic info like "Are you a baby or into diapers" and "where you are from." Information that most people would already know if they looked at your bio. The conversation will then move on to "Do you have or want a mommy?" These are what I call pay to play scams.

There are individuals that do run a paid escort type of nursery but those individuals do not blindly reach out direct and offer their services. What generally happens with these scams is you will pay the person and they will either ghost you when the money hits the account or they will schedule an appointment and then offer excuses why they couldn't make the meeting or some other BS.

Another scam that has recently been reported is people offering a "Official membership" in the ABDL community for a fee and you will receive a "official membership card" or some "potty training card" This is also a total scam. Potty training license cards do exist on Etsy, but they are just for fun and the seller is not a part of this scam.

A scam that occurs during a particular time of the year to avoid is the Convention ticket scam. Conventions like CapCon do not have ticket scalpers or a way to purchase a ticket off of an individual that can no longer attend. The only way to get a ticket to CapCon is through their official website when their tickets are on sale. Every single year there are always several sad stories of some AB/DL who was not able to purchase a ticket when they first went on sale and is dupped into "buying a ticket from someone who can't go or has an extra ticket." Those situations can't and don't exist as all ticket

sales are strictly controlled through the official website and also all attendees are vetted by the convention.

Consent Agreement

As mentioned before, it is important to have conversations prior to play to make clear what all party's intentions are, to plan scenes and establish things like safe words, gestures, and dos and don't lists. Consent is the most important part of a scene or meet-up. My personal philosophy in regards to potential play partners, the most important thing for me is to establish a rock solid friendship foundation and build trust before doing any major scenes or kink play, especially any bondage scenes.

Establishing a consent agreement or contract is something you can do in person or through chat to set ground rules, preplan a scene, and also establish limits, safe words and create the vital communication piece to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all participants. A consent agreement doesn't need to be a physical and literal contract, but that is something that exists and is a vital tool to ensure safe play is experienced by all.

CHAPTER ADVICE FOR AGE PLAY CONVENTIONS

Before getting started, there is some information and advice I cannot give. The main convention I will be discussing is CapCon as that is the convention I am familiar with and have frequently attended. Locations, hotels, dates, pictures, and things of that nature are not allowed to be given for security purposes. Like fight club, the first rule of CapCon is you do not discuss those details of CapCon. That being said, there is still a ton of information I would have liked to have known prior to the trip that would have improved my experience. In this article I'm going to cover various aspects, how to get information, purchasing tickets and costs, verification, packing, travel, the convention, itself and how to avoid or handle con drop and the dreaded CapCon Crud.

So, the first question to answer is why should you attend an AB/DL age play convention? The answer will vary from person to person, and I promise my answer is not a cop out. I will go over a few motivations. The first reason is obviously it's just an amazing time. Imagine an entire convention hotel being taken (Hotel Takeover) over by thousands of age players. All of the public spaces are themed and filled with toys, décor, and activities for various different age play brackets. For people looking to learn, the convention is a true convention that offers panels, lessons, and advice given by experts and creators in the community. Attending an age play convention is a great way to meet other like-minded individuals. If you are feeling like you are feeling alone or that lone strange person in society there is no faster way to dispel those feelings than going to a place with thousands of individuals around, you with common interests for days.

Staying informed – For individuals looking to attend a kink convention you need to first know what events exist, when they are, where it is going to take place, and what the costs will be so you can plan ahead. The only way to stay informed is to join and follow the convention's social media and subscribe to their website. Most, if all, kink conventions do not have the same event dates or times from year to year and ticket sales do not always fall in the same time period so it is important to follow the social media and announcements so you don't miss out. CapCon for example maintains a website, <http://www.capcon.club> and there a potential attendee can find information, create an account for verification, (We'll get to that) and subscribe for the email announcements when information and ticket sales are scheduled. Aside from CapCon there are two other well-known and active AB/DL conventions. They are Littles Jamboree and Baby Fur Con. Baby Fur Con, like CapCon, is a hotel takeover, but according to their website they are a 21+ or older event while CapCon and Littles Jamboree are both 18+ according to their website. If you are interested in attending any AB/DL it is the best advice to follow their social media, make an account on their website and be prepared if and when tickets go on sale. As already mentioned the

website for CapCon is www.capcon.club and the websites for the other two are www.LittlesJamboreeee.com and www.babyfurcon.com.

Costs – This aspect of attending a kink convention is entirely dependent on the attendee, but the basic ticket package for a standard room and pass for the entire convention is roughly \$1200.00. That cost only covers the convention pass and the hotel for the duration of the convention. There are various options a potential attendee to go about, which will either increase or decrease the costs.

First, we will cover ways to make Conventions more affordable. Having roommates and splitting the cost of the hotel is the first and possibly largest money saving options. How this works is when tickets first go on sale through the website one member of the planned group purchases their ticket and room reservation. This is called a “Room Captain” Attendee tickets go on sale generally the following day or days later and there are instructions how to show as a roommate under the room captain on the CapCon website. Other age play convention options may differ. Another potential cost saving measure is to forgo purchasing meal plans from the convention. The meals in the past have had a fixed menu and serving times and some of the food options may be foreign and not to the liking of an attendee. I personally would purchase breakfast but would go out or order for lunch and dinner. The last large money saving option is to volunteer at the convention either as a presenter or as a volunteer working part of the convention in various roles like setup, tear down, security, bag check in, or various other positions. In order to volunteer, in the case of CapCon, an announcement is made via email accepting applications and applicants can apply. This process has changed recently, as applications were taken before tickets were on sale and volunteers and percenters, if selected were guaranteed a host hotel room option and a discounted ticket, but that has recently changed so it is currently unknown if this option will remain in the future.

Aside from making large purchases and meal plans, costs can increase by purchasing larger rooms, upgrading a room to have a crib in it instead of a bed, and other accommodations like a VIP package. There is often “field trip” add on options as well in which many attendees will be bused from the convention and attend some sort of little’s outing like a zoo. These options are not required but they do come with an additional cost. Just to be clear, additional cost options are not hidden fees, but are all clearly explained out on the websites as to what the packages are, what they include, and what the additional charges are for that option.

Purchasing Tickets – Ticket sale dates are announced via emails for all subscribers, so be sure to review the “Stay Informed” section of this article so you don’t miss the announcement. THIS NEXT PART IS KEY: If you want to attend a convention like CapCon you have to be ready to purchase tickets the second they go on sale. The host hotel always sells out on the same day, and recently the spill over hotel was also sold out on the same day. In the case of CapCon, tickets can ONLY be purchased through the official CapCon website. So, anyone offering to sell you their tickets or any

other site or source is a scam. Tickets are verified for the purchaser only, so it is not possible to buy and scalp tickets. BEWARE OF SCAMMERS.

Verification – If you are planning on attending CapCon there is a verification process. I have heard other venues also vet potential attendees, but I haven't attended those, so I can't speak as to what exactly to expect. One of the newer additions and improvements the CapCon planners have implemented in recent years is the creation of a personal account on their website. This account is part of the initial verification process. The verification process is essentially a background check of all potential attendees. Background checks, and a review of social media and/or FetLife accounts are all done to ensure that you are not only who you say you are but also not someone trying to attend the convention in bad faith such as a journalist seeking to "break a story" or someone with differing political, religious or lifestyle views that which to attend as a bad faith actor in order to disrupt or stage a protest or scene in the middle of the convention.

Some of the advice I have for anyone planning on attending is to create and verify a FetLife account. This will not only provide you with access to the several various FetLife forum channels concerning CapCon such as channels devoted to looking for roommates or social groups discussing CapCon plans. The verification process for FetLife requires you to provide a picture of your ID and information. You may need to repeat a similar process with the CapCon organizers. I know some people are uncomfortable providing this information, but I can assure you both are a professional organization with a steadfast dedication to privacy. If you have AB/DL social media accounts, you may also be asked to provide that information as well. Again, this is just a verification measure.

Packing – The advice for this topic is dependent on your travel plans. If you are planning on flying to the convention, then you will be greatly limited by what you can bring. My advice is to order diapers at the convention to save on packing space. There is sometimes a possibility of shipping things to the convention so looking into that is also a good idea. You may also want to look into costs of having a second bag, but if that is not an avenue that you'd like to take I'd highly recommend investing in vacuum seal travel bags which will help optimize space. You'll want to have a main suitcase in the largest size, and you can use your diaper bag as you carry on.

If you are planning on driving this greatly reduces some of the packing constraints but every year I have attended CapCon I have carpooled for the trip and even with just three people in a KIA Soul, space was so limited that my friend in the back seat was squished up against the door for the duration of the road trip. The three of us just completely overpacked. The following year I installed a roof rack on my car to try and alleviate some of the issues, but even then, we had brought a lot of things that we wish we didn't. So here is some key advice from what I have experienced. Don't bring food, diapers, changing supplies (other than basic travel sized if you wear in public). This isn't a Disney World vacation. Most items will not have a dramatic mark up,

and one of the first trips my friends and I make upon arriving and checking into our rooms is to do a trip to the nearby Walmart. If you are set on bringing a stuffie... bring only one (I know they are our friends, but we literally had a stuffie suitcase the first year and it was such a bad idea.) For more advice on packing for an AB/DL convention please see my AB/DL Convention Packing List in Appendix III.

Travel considerations

Road Trip

For those planning on attending a convention via a road trip. Here is a list of things I recommend doing weeks prior to departure.

☐ **Complete Car Maintenance/Pre-trip**

(This includes oil change, tires/rotation, topping off fluids, air filter etc....)

☐ **Update/Verify insurance, License.**

(Have an updated copy of Proof of insurance, Registration, and License easily available in visor or console in case of pull over)

☐ **Pre-Plan packing**

(If you have several Littles/CGs you need to have a solid idea of how many bags everyone has and where they will be going in the vehicle.)

☐ **Pre-Plan the route and Drivers**

(It is a good idea to have an estimate of where you are going, if you plan on swapping out drivers and if you are planning on making any rest stops or breaking the journey into multiple days where you plan on stopping)

☐ **Discuss Car Rules/Roles**

(To ensure safety and fun it is a good idea to have a discussion of some basic rules or roles in the car. Some examples that my friends and I implement are: The front passenger is there to assist the driver if something is needed. All occupants need to use headphones if they are playing something to not distract the driver or wake up the co-driver who may be sleeping before their driving shift starts. The rear passenger controls the cooler and snacks and distributes them when asked. When exiting the car at stops, pants must be worn and not overt AB/DL activities should be visible or obvious (Paci use, bottles, public diaper changes)

Some things to consider and lessons I have learned from multiple convention adventures.

- Increasing your storage for the trip is well worth the money and investment. For my first trip to an AB/DL convention me and my friends overpacked and just didn't make the best use of storage and as such the trip was somewhat uncomfortable. The following year I invested in a roof rack and travel rack for my car (I have a KIA Soul), and the trip was much more comfortable. I have since added a trailer hitch and a back storage rack as well to make free up as much space in the car as possible.
- Only pack the diapers that you will need for travel and plan on buying them at the convention.
- Vacuum travel bags are an awesome investment for all travel. Harbor Freight sells four packs of vacuum bags for roughly (\$7) and you can get a small vacuum from there as well for around \$30.

- The Ideal Packing goal is every occupant has one large suitcase and one diaper bag. Vacuum bags are helpful for this.
- Aside from road snacks, drinks, and travel sized changing supplies it is recommended to not purchase any toiletries, trash bags, food, etc.... One of the first convention stops you should make after arrival is to purchase basic toiletries, food, trash bags, and diapers for the convention.

Air Travel

For air travel, it is recommended to have one carry-on bag and one large suitcase. Much of the previous advice like vacuum bags, purchasing all toiletries and diapers is very important for the air travel Littles and CGs. The ideal packing situation is to choose a carry on that will double as your diaper bag at the convention. If you are a diaper wearer, I'd recommend having one spare diaper in your carry on and a set of clothing as well as your important travel documents and electronics. You could always have an additional bag for the cost.

The Convention and Taking the Leap

Making the most of the convention is what everyone hopes to do. Knowing the rules, and game planning ahead are ideal for making the most of your time at a convention. You will not be able to do everything that is going on so you'll have to sometimes decide between two things that are ongoing at the same time. For example, the ABDL Casino might be open at the same time as the Nerf War or a dance party might take place during a karaoke event. Printing out the schedule and setting a reminder alarm to help you plan out your day are a great way to make the most of your time. If there is only one thing I can suggest to newcomers, it is to Take the Leap... get involved in conversations, plan on going to several of the activities, and network... I personally have custom business cards made that have all of my ABDL social media contacts on them. It is easy enough to hand these over to people I just met and then have conversations not only during the convention but after the convention is over. It is better to try something new or start a conversation than not make the attempt at all and regret it later.

Sleep and Hygiene

• This is going to sound counterintuitive to what you'd want to do on a vacation... but you need to ensure that you are eating healthy, getting enough sleep, and doing everything you can towards maintaining proper hygiene. To quote "Neeko" in the Community. You must follow the 6, 2, 1 rule... That is 6 hours of sleep a day, have at least two proper meals, and at minimum 1 shower per day. There is stuff going on with the convention all the time and unfortunately you can only do so much, so it is very important that you plan ahead, but you have to get enough sleep. If there is a night

party, you want to attend you need to plan in a nap. Sleeping in the day is okay... just as long as you get the must needed rest.

Hygiene should also be a top concern for all. The “A” in ABDL stands for adult and you may not know it... but body odor is a real issue and can drive people away from wanting to be around you. Deodorant, brushing teeth, mouthwash, and frequent showers and diaper changes are a must! Although some folks may be into long term wet diaper experiences you need to be mindful of those around you. (Messing is not permitted at the convention space. If you have a medical condition that may cause a messing you need to change immediately in your room.)

Post Con... aka Con Drop

“Con Drop” or “Con Crud” are real situations you want to prepare for if you are going to be attending a convention. Personally, I take additional days off work to help get over the drop... What those terms refer to: Con Drop is the sad depression that sets in after the convention ends. Most are not immune to it, and it is not uncommon to shed a tear or feel an overwhelming feeling of emptiness upon the conclusion of the convention. Everyone has their own ways to overcome this... personally my friends and I will tell stories on the drive home from the convention and we will even start planning out the changes we want to make for the next year, thus planning the seeds of longing for the next convention. Con Crud or Con Flu is a literal sickness that sets in following the convention. This isn't unique to Age Play conventions but is a phenomenon that happens when gatherings of people from all over the world gather in a confined space for extended periods of time, for example cruise ships. Staying hydrated, proper hygiene measures, and plenty of sleep are good steps towards working towards preventing Con Crud, but it is a common occurrence no matter the preventative measures.

CHAPTER COMMUNITY ADVICE FOR ABDL CONVENTIONS

- Plan your outfits ahead of time with wiggle room for comfort!
- This means setting out each outfit and assigning it to the day of the trip, with a piece or two extra just in case the planned outfit isn't gonna be it. overalls on Thursday. the pink dress on Friday. sweater and leggings on Saturday.
- Don't forget about special events like dances, and vanilla options for leaving the convention space.
- You're also going to want a sweater, and pajamas if you wear them.
- make a spare parts kit!
 - little care items and repair/junk drawer stuff you might need in a pinch. a couple of elastics and safety pins go a long way!
- plan time to grab essentials early on. Going to a store with your friends is a great way to make silly memories, as you tease them about which kind of pureed fruit, they're gonna need. and you can grab Gatorades and cheaper snacks.
- dollar store travel kits are awesome. a waterproof bag with little refillable bottles so you can wash up with your usual products.
- hotel stuff kinda sucks tbhhhhh.
- pick some medium-decibel-blocking earplugs if you find that you get tired being in loud places. something like Loop Engage dulls noise while letting you hear people talking to you.
 - <https://www.loopearplugs.com/products/engage?variant=48379456749903> lots of other brands exist too though and bring earplugs anyways!! even on quieter floors, you'll hear doors closing and people talking. comfy earplugs make a huge difference.
- I wouldn't recommend the above loops for sleep, they're hard plastic.
- The rooms have microwaved this year.
- Hotel is not providing trash bags, bring your own!

Max

- Wear wear wear vanilla clothes outside the hotel!!! So many people don't

JAZZ

- Buy healthy snacks for your room like fruit or oatmeal.
- Also Drink Water

Wooness

- I always recommend getting snacks and other essentials, so you don't have to spend as much \$\$\$
- I saved a lot by buying breakfast bars at side quest.
- Also, don't feel bad if you need to rest in the middle of the day. Also, I recommend bringing any meds you MAY need, I always have a stash of Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Allergy meds, other random meds that may be needed.
- get trash bags for diapers.
- Makes cleanup SO much easier

PinkPaperClipGuy (Neeko!)

- Follow the 621 Rule! It's more than just a funny number!
 - 6 - hours of sleep!
 - 2 - meals a day!
 - 1 - shower per day!
- I thought of another thing, some folks (like me) prefer to walk around the con without shoes, but since you can't have bare feet, I recommend REALLY thick socks or house shoes that are just super comfy.

Nemo

- (Regarding the no bare feet rule) Grippy Socks, Booties or Slippers
- I always hit Walmart before the con and have a mobile electric tea kettle.
- Also, I do suggest having a dirty clothes bag, even a trash bag or something. They can get ripe.
- Also, I always suggest having some Pedialyte on hand, good for con crud and hangovers as well as dehydration.
- Instant coffee and tea are something I bring to every con, this is why I have a travel kettle that collapses.
- My diaper bag always has moist towelettes, glasses cleaners and binkie wipes. They take up next to no room, weigh nothing and can make a world of difference. I like my binkies sterile.
- Binkie wipes are a sterilizing food safe wet wipe.

Ruka Puddlegum

- Essentials I look for first on any trip:
- meds. Get a little day of the week thing to save space,
- phone charger! You don't want to have to buy this on-site. If you are from overseas, having your own adapter can be wise!
- paperwork! At a minimum, your ID/license, but if you are traveling from out of country, your passport (and any necessary travel visa paperwork) is great to have in a little zippy bag easily accessible!
- means of payment. This is big for out-of-country people, but not all bank cards work in all countries. Make sure however you pay for things is accepted where you are going, or make plans with friends to trade currencies.,

For CAP specifically:

- Every single room in the host hotel has a fridge and a microwave. Great for storing temperature-controlled meds, leftovers from eating out, a cold bottle of water, or cheap meal items you can snag at the grocery store. Pb&j, instant oatmeal and nature valley bars go a long way!
- CAP does not allow glass containers on the con floor, so leave those nice glass bottles at home and bring a plastic sippy cup instead! ✨
- Many people bring their favorite plushies, and as we know they can mean the world to you. Consider using an air tag or similar on them just in case you get too involved in playing and accidentally let them wander,
- for the bigs/caregivers in the room, I can't recommend a small carrying bag enough for holding sippy cups, snacks, pacis, trinkets your kiddos find, etc.,
- It's been said before, but blackout trash bags. The hotel/CAP does not provide these, and we want to make cleanup easy and non-eventful for hotel staff! Pack some or buy a roll at a local store to share with friends!

CHAPTER ABDL GAMES

Bad Baby Bingo

Do you feel Lucky? Do you need an interesting game to break the ice at your next AB/DL Play party? Or you want to randomize a scene, punishment, or pleasure... Then Bad Baby Bingo is the game for you!

The Game Rules are simple enough. Before the game begins every player will make their own bingo card or they can use a card from a set. All of the players will also submit Punishments, Scenes, or Pleasures that everyone would consent to participate in.

Fourteen consequences/awards are to be chosen then assigned to each “win.”

- Five, one for each horizontal line
- Five, one for each vertical line
- Two for each diagonal line
- One for four Corners
- One for a filled card

Some suggestions are:

- Wear a Paci/dildo gag for X period of time.
- Force feeding of Baby Food (Good or Bad could depend on the line)
- Spankings (Number could depend on the Line)
- Enema or suppository insertion
- Body writing/shame/humiliation
- Magic Wand time
- Locked in mittens.
- Locked in booties.
- Secured in a straitjacket.
- Forced to drink a bottle of castor oil.
- Awarded Candy
- Win a coloring book.
- Playing to fill the card should deserve an extra special prize.
- Chastity – and every uncalled number remaining equals the days locked up.
- 247 diapers – and every uncalled number remaining equals the days in diapers
- Daily Spankings – and every uncalled number remaining equals the days the spankings go on and the total count of numbers called equals the spanking count.

Playing

Unlike in a normal game of Bingo where the player retains their card, if you are playing a version with many punishments the players will trade cards with each other. Each player will score the other player's card. If a bingo is called that owner's card will endure the appropriate punishment, but if a scorer calls "Bingo" and it is not a genuine "Bingo" they will receive the punishment that would have otherwise been intended for the card's owner.

If a "Bingo" is declared and validated the punishment/prize can be conducted immediately or following the game but it is recommended to do so immediately, then after the punishment is dealt, the game may proceed further.

Making Homemade Bingo Cards

If the players are going to make a homemade bingo card all they need to do is Write: BINGO at the top of a piece of paper.

- Under the B column write five numbers 1-15
- Under the I column write five number 16-30
- Under the N column write five numbers 31-45
- Under the G column write five numbers 46-60
- Under the O column write five numbers 61-75

Bingo Numbers Generator

If you do not own a bingo set, you can use a phone or computer to access a **Bingo Game Numbers Generator** to call the numbers for free.

Don't Wake Mommy! (AB/DL Card Game)

Game plays 2-4 Players (Addition Decks can be added for more players)

How to Play

For this game all you need is some friends and a deck of cards. The point of this game is to create two four- of-a-kind sets (All of one number or face cards in all four suits, Excluding the Aces) Once a four-of-a-kind is made the four cards are discarded separately and removed from the game. Once you have two full sets you have won, And Mommy can't get you and the game is over. If you have an Ace (Sleeping Pill) in your hand and you draw the dreaded mommy card. The Ace is set beside the draw deck face up, and the Queen is placed back in the deck along with the drawn and discarded cards. The whole deck is then reshuffled, and the next baby will draw from the top of the reshuffled deck.

If you draw the mommy card and do not have a sleeping pill in your hand you are to be punished with a spanking. The number of spanks is equal to the total numerical value of your hand. (Face cards are worth 10 each)

If a Sleeping Pill card is in play and you draw the Mommy card and do not have a Sleeping Pill your punishment is increased based on the Sleeping Pill. (See Below)

Ace of Clubs – Spanking Inflicted with a Paddle
Ace of Diamonds – Double the Spanks
Ace of Spades – Spanks Inflicted with a Flogger
Ace of Hearts – Spanks Inflicted on Bare Thighs or Ass

Setting up the Deck

Before the game starts you need to remove three of the four Queen cards and put them back in the box. Set the fourth Queen aside.

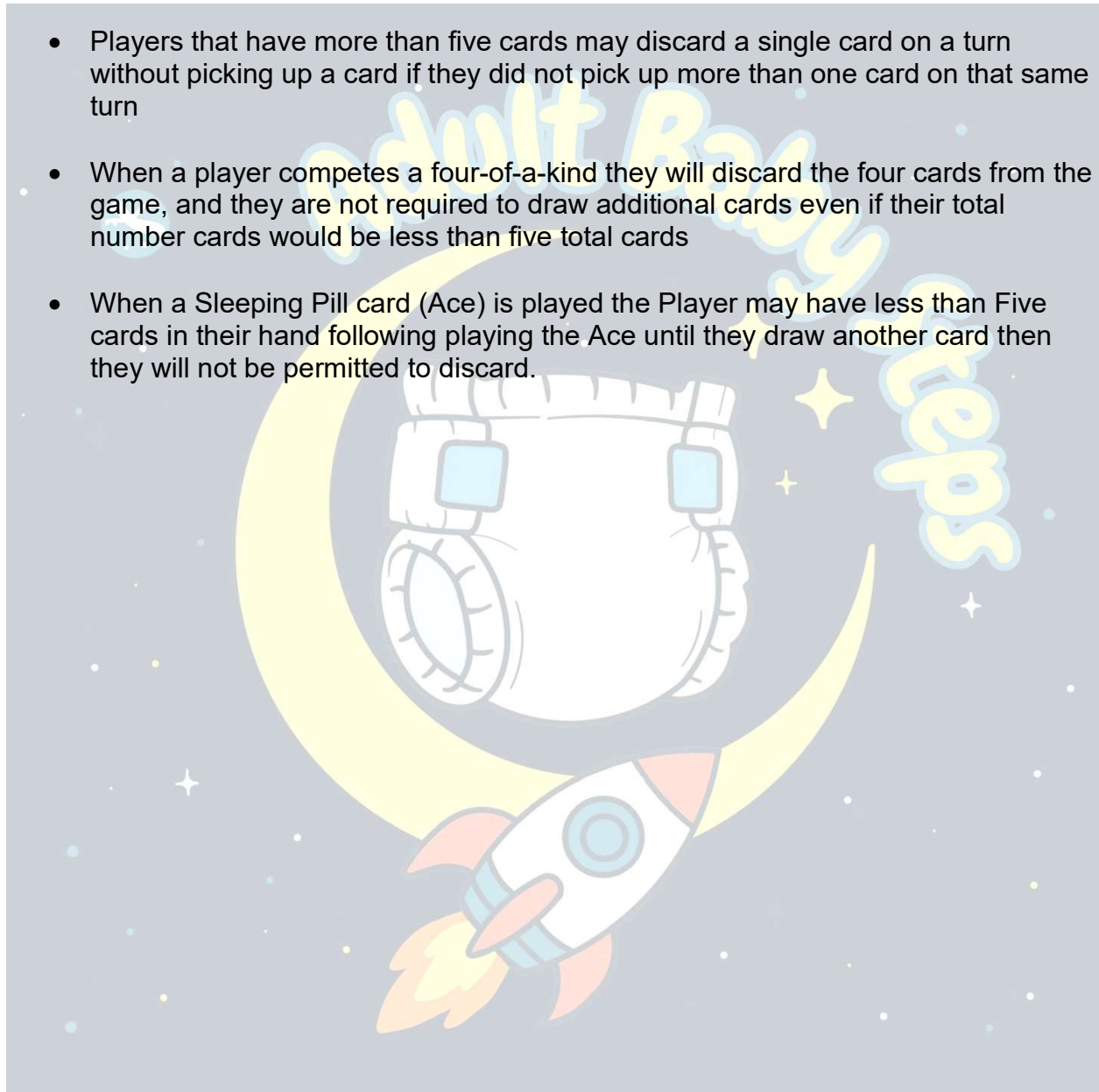
Starting Out

At the start of the game all the players will sit around in a circle. To decide who deals everyone draws a card and the closest to the Ace is the dealer. If there is a tie draw another card as a tie breaker. The players will be dealt five cards face down. Once all the players have their cards, "Mommy" will go to sleep, and the Queen will be inserted into the remaining cards in the deck and shuffled several times.

Rules And Turns

The first person to the left of the dealer will flip up a card. They can decide if they want to take it or leave the card. If the player decides to take the card, they may discard one card if there are five total cards in their hand, but they are not required to discard, but the more cards in you hand the more potential spankings if you wake mommy.

- If the player rejects the flipped card or discards one of their cards, the next player may take the card rather than drawing a new card.
- If the player wants a card that is buried under two, three, or four other cards they **MUST** pick up ALL those cards and they are not permitted to discard until their next turn.
- Players that have more than five cards may discard a single card on a turn without picking up a card if they did not pick up more than one card on that same turn
- When a player competes a four-of-a-kind they will discard the four cards from the game, and they are not required to draw additional cards even if their total number cards would be less than five total cards
- When a Sleeping Pill card (Ace) is played the Player may have less than Five cards in their hand following playing the Ace until they draw another card then they will not be permitted to discard.



Candy Poker

Game plays 2-8 Players

How to Play

This isn't some wild and crazy kink game, but this was how I learned to play poker as a child when I didn't even know it was gambling or what gambling was and it was always a great time at birthday parties and other gatherings... It is the standard game of poker, it doesn't have to be five card poker, but that's how I originally played so that is the example I'm using. All you need to play is a deck of cards, a group of littles, but since littles and babies have no concept of money the currency of play is bags of their favorite candy!

Starting Out

1. The game starts with each player placing an ante of candy in the middle of the table (the pot) to start the hand.
2. Each player is dealt five cards.
3. A round of betting ensues and the players can check, bet, or fold.
4. After the round of betting, the players request up to three cards from the dealer and discard the number of cards they request. The dealer deals each player the requested number of cards.
5. Another round of betting takes place, starting with the player to the left of the dealer. Once everyone has check bet or folded the player that is being called shows their hand and the best poker hand wins the pot of candy.

Poker Hands by Seniority

ROYAL FLUSH

This hand contains five cards in sequence, all of the same suit.



STRAIGHT FLUSH

This hand contains five cards in sequence, all of the same suit.



4 OF A KIND

This hand contains all four cards of one rank and any other unmatched card.



FULL HOUSE

This hand contains three matching cards of one rank and two matching cards of another rank.



FLUSH

This hand contains all five cards are of the same suit, but not in sequence.



STRAIGHT

This hand contains five cards of sequential rank in at least two different suits.



3 OF A KIND

This hand contains three cards of the same rank, with two cards not of this rank nor the same as each other.



2 PAIR

This hand contains two cards of the same rank, plus two cards of another rank.



1 PAIR

This hand contains two cards of one rank, plus three cards which are not of this rank nor the same.



HIGH CARD

made of any five cards not meeting any of the above requirements.

Many AB/DL refuse to interact or communicate with blank or lacking profiles. There are some that block those without a profile picture.

If you join a website, take the time to make a profile, write a bio, let people know what you are interested in, and it is always a good idea in chat to ask for permission before direct messaging.

The Daily Diapers



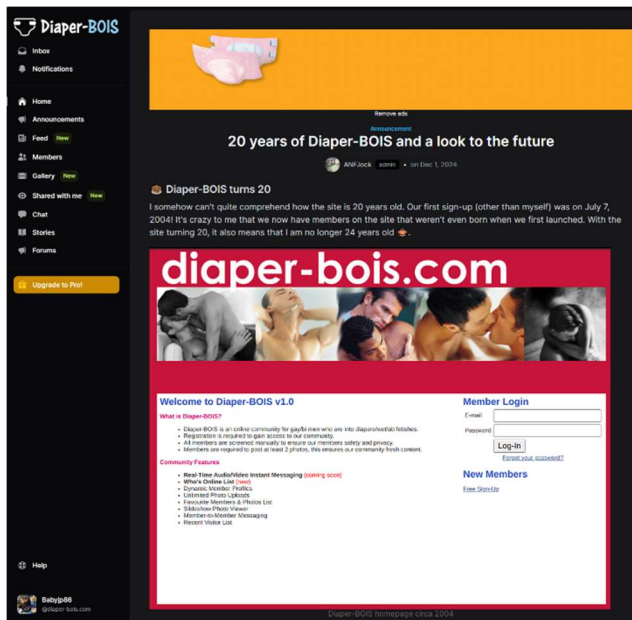

Diaper-Bois

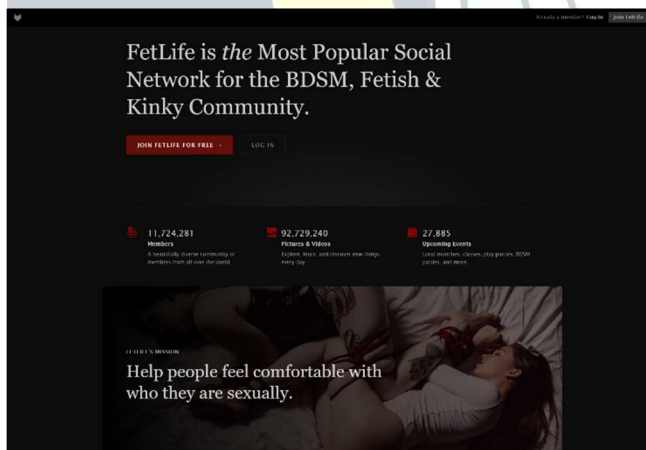

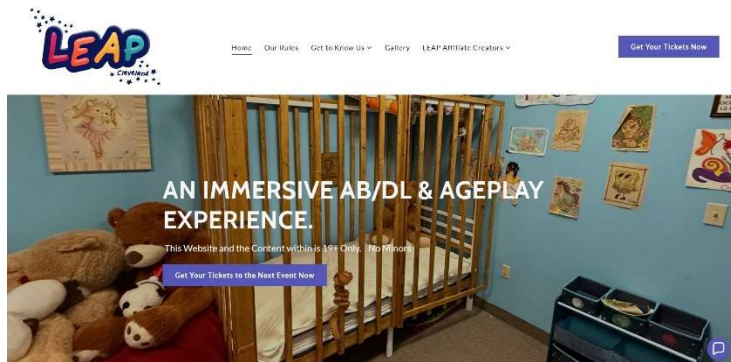

II. ABDL CONVENTION CHECKLIST

This convention packing list is meant to be a helpful tool for anyone planning on attending an AB/DL convention. This isn't a catch all be all list... but this is what I take and how I break down my packing. I personally road trip to conventions with two friends so my packing is based on that aspect, but I will try to offer suggestions for anyone who is flying. This list was originally inspired by Mommy Black at LittleBabyBooNursery.com but over the years has become my own breakdown.

ROAD TRIP

For those planning on attending a convention via a road trip. Here is a list of things I recommend doing weeks prior to departure.

- ☐ Complete Car Maintenance/Pre-trip
(This includes oil change, tires/rotation, topping off fluids, air filter etc....)
- ☐ Update/Verify insurance, License
(Have an updated copy of Proof of insurance, Registration, and License easily available in visor or console in case of pull over)
- ☐ Pre-Plan packing
(If you have several Littles/CGs you need to have a solid idea of how many bags everyone has and where they will be going in the vehicle.)
- ☐ Pre-Plan the route and Drivers
(It is a good idea to have an estimate of where you are going, if you plan on swapping out drivers and if you are planning on making any rest stops or breaking the journey into multiple days where you plan on stopping)
- ☐ Discuss Car Rules/Roles
(To ensure safety and fun it is a good idea to have a discussion of some basic rules or roles in the car. Some examples that my friends and I implement are: The front passenger is there to assist the driver if something is needed. All occupants need to use headphones if they are playing something to not distract the driver or wake up the co-driver who may be sleeping before their driving shift starts. The rear passenger controls the cooler and snacks and distributes them when asked. When exiting the car at stops, pants must be worn and not overt AB/DL activities should be visible or obvious (Paci use, bottles, public diaper changes)

Some things to consider and lessons I have learned from multiple convention adventures.

- Increasing your storage for the trip is well worth the money and investment. For my first trip to an ABDL convention me and my friends overpacked and just didn't make the best use of storage and as such the trip was somewhat uncomfortable. The following year I invested in a roof rack and travel rack for my car (I have a KIA Soul) and the trip was much more comfortable. I have since added a trailer

hitch and a back storage rack as well to make free up as much space in the car as possible.

- Only pack the diapers that you will need for travel and plan on buying them at the convention.
- Vacuum travel bags are an awesome investment for all travel. Harbor Freight sells four packs of vacuum bags for roughly (\$7) and you can get a small vacuum from there as well for around \$30
- The Ideal Packing goal is every occupant has one large suitcase and one diaper bag. Vacuum bags are helpful for this.
- Aside from road snacks, drinks, and travel sized changing supplies it is recommended to not purchase any toiletries, trash bags, food, etc.... One of the first convention stops you should make after arrival is to purchase basic toiletries, food, trash bags, and diapers for the convention.

AIR TRAVEL

For air travel, it is recommended to have one carry-on bag and one large suitcase. Much of the previous advice like vacuum bags, purchasing all toiletries and diapers is very important for the air travel Littles and CGs. The ideal packing situation is to choose a carry on that will double as your diaper bag at the convention. If you are a diaper wearer, I'd recommend having one spare diaper in your carry on and a set of clothing as well as your important travel documents and electronics. You could always have an additional bag for the cost.

I'd personally recommend having at least a couple of vanilla outfits for wearing outside of the convention and then having three to four little outfits for each day of the convention. There are usually AB/DL events that are preannounced like dance and room parties, preschool events, Convention classes as well as other events like nerf battles, casino nights, emo party, karaoke, so having outfits for those events is something you can preplan. Often what I do is do a layout for each outfit including all the required pieces and parts and I have an individual checklist for each, but if you don't have a combination outfit then you want to ensure you have enough clothing to cover the entire convention)

III. ABDL CONSENT AGREEMENT

This contract dated _____ is the complete and entire agreement between the signatories. I _____, being of sound mind and body (hereinafter referred to as the “Caregiver”), and _____, being of sound mind and body (hereinafter referred to as the “Little”). The terms of this agreement will begin on _____ at _____ [AM/PM] and will remain in effect for a period of _____ ending on _____ at _____ [AM/PM].

This contract shall also become null and void immediately upon request of the injured party following any material breach of the contract or in such situation that a “Safe word” is used and any or all parties wishes to halt any and all activities. Should the injured party agree to continue with the contract following any material breach, the broken clause shall still remain in effect for the remaining terms of the contract.

Caregiver Agreements

1. Caregiver shall be responsible for keeping Little safe at all times.
2. Caregiver will not allow or make Little scene with any minors, animals, or in a public place involving nonconsenting public at anytime.
3. Caregiver will do everything within their power to nurture, educate, train, shape, and mold Little into the best Little possible.
4. If diapers, pull ups or any potty training implements are used in play the Caregiver will ensure the Little is checked regularly and if it is determined that a change is required Caregiver will facilitate a diaper change or potty visit.
5. Caregiver will ensure that Little receives proper nourishment regularly and is always properly hydrated.
6. Caregiver will make sure Little is mentally, emotionally, and physically stimulated at their discretion and will ensure the Little’s best interests are the Caregiver’s Primary concern.
7. Caregiver will receive pleasure from the activities outlined in clause 6 above.
15.
8. Caregiver shall pick out the entire wardrobe of Little when they are going out in public, however, Caregiver may instruct Little to pick out said wardrobe and punish Little for selecting an inappropriate outfit after Little has received proper training on appropriate outfits for public display.

9. Caregiver shall respect and honor the invocation of the Safe Word (“_____”) by Little. If verbal utterance of the Safe Word is not possible (Paci gag, Nonverbal, or other cause) the Safe Gesture is (“_____”).
10. Caregiver will push Little’s limits to help Little grow in the life and position.
11. Caregiver will respect all hard limits of Little.
12. Caregiver agrees to help Little on any new interests that Little discovers.
13. Whereas both parties will be working outside the home, Caregiver and Little shall share in housework as enumerated by Caregiver.
14. If Little violates rules clearly set before them in the Caregiver’s expectations, misbehaves Caregiver shall inform Little the reason for any punishment. Periodically during the punishment Caregiver will remind Little the reason for the punishment although that can come from the Caregiver in the form of “Why are you being punished?” with an appropriate response from Little.
15. Whereas either party believes that family is important Caregiver will not keep Little from staying in touch with their family and will not unreasonably withhold trips for Little to visit their family. The same goes for the Little in not restricting the Caregiver should they wish or choose to stay in touch or visit family.
16. Should the Caregiver allow the Little to scene with anyone the Caregiver shall be present during the entire scene in order to assure that the Caregiver is unharmed and not forced to do anything on Little’s hard limit list.

Little Agreements

1. Little agrees to maintain body by regular bathing and all other routine body care (e.g. brushing teeth, etc.).
2. Little shall respect Caregiver at all times.
3. Little shall never remove or attempt to change diaper at any time.
4. Little is to be in diapers.
5. Little shall make themselves available for play by the Caregiver in anyway the Caregiver desires, within the terms of this contract.
6. Little shall not have any sexual contact at any time without permission from Caregiver.

7. Little shall not orgasm without permission from Caregiver.
8. Little shall not invoke the safe word unless absolutely necessary.
9. If Caregiver and Little are present at an event and Little witnesses something they desire to experience Caregiver will not unreasonably withhold permission of Little to participate.
10. Should Caregiver and Little find a mutually agreeable partner(s) who fits into the family dynamics well, Little agrees to accept said partner(s) into the family. Caregiver, Little, and potential new partner(s) will sit down together to draft a mutually acceptable contract between all parties involved. The new contract may or may not replace this contract.
11. Little shall count each stroke when being punished by flogging, caning, etc., and also must thank Caregiver following each stroke.

(At the time of approving and signing of this contract. Both parties need to discuss and document any Hard Limits in the below sections. Caregiver and Little need to document any hard limits that exist for each of them and the opposite initial to affirm understanding to the limit.

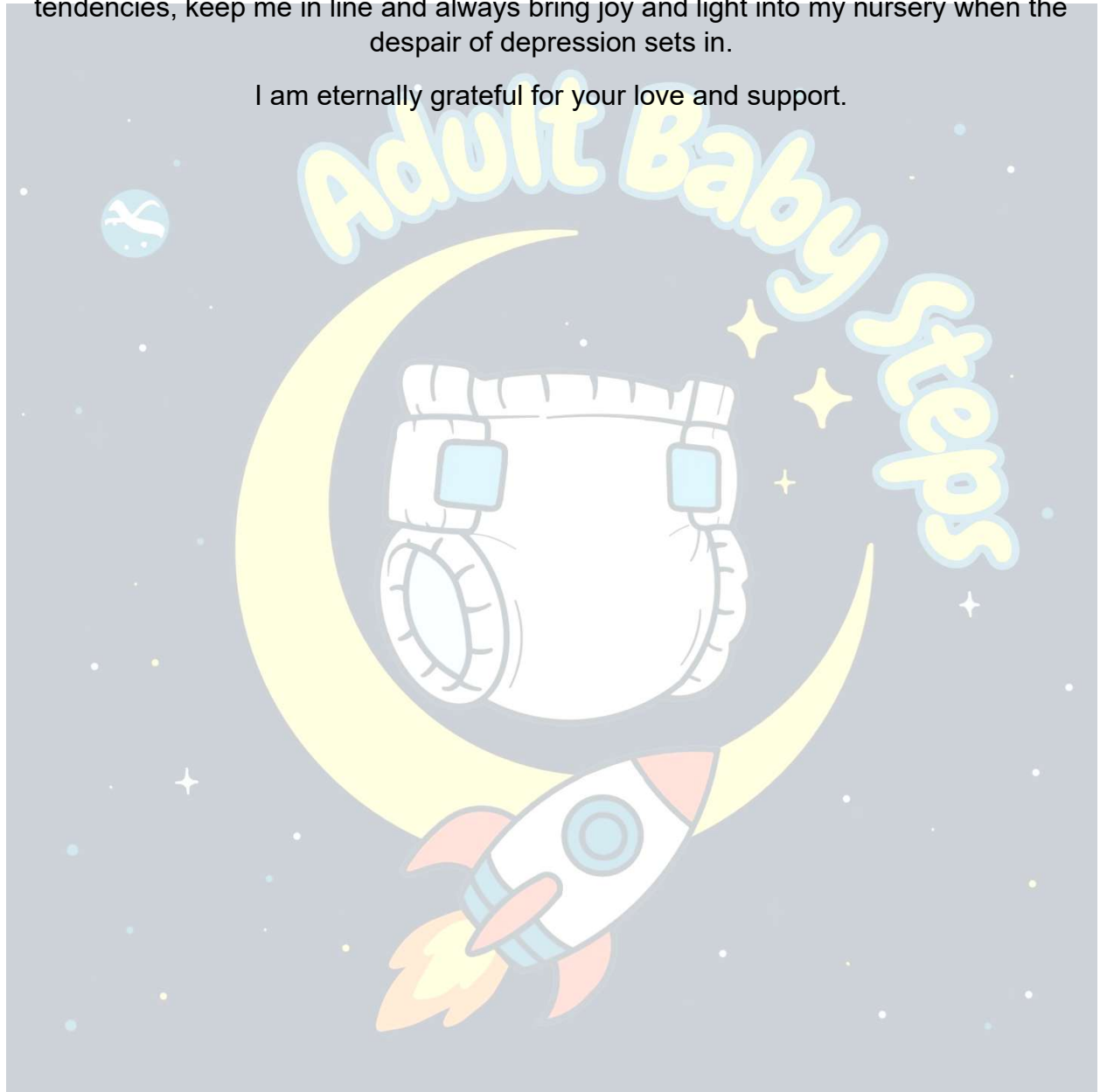
