Happy new year to all of you!

We all hope that 2019 will bring more happiness and joy to you all. We are all advocating for the thousands of Federal employees who are furlough due to

partial federal shutdown and hope that the stalemate will end soon.

Apparently the federal and state landscapes do not seem to be improving, making it more difficult for our patients to access affordable health care — including eliminating penalties for not having insurance, public charge issues, and many changes coming in the new year, including to the reimbursements by federal, state and county regulators. However, we also welcome our new governor's proposal for a "single payer" system in California that will give access to health care for all Californians.

MCCN is pleased to receive one year grant from HRSA to increase patients receiving substance abuse disorder, behavioral health expansion and medication-assisted treatment (MAT). This will enable MCCN to add more staff and give access to the patients who are struggling with various substance abuse and behavioral health issues.
