



Safety Report by Ralph Huy
Subject: Where The Rubber Meets The Runway

When we land an aircraft the first thing we expect to touch down is the tires. In a fixed gear airplane this is nearly always the case however in a retractable this may not be the case. We have to remember to extend the landing gear at some time before landing. There are various checklists and reminders for this however sometimes just putting the gear handle down doesn't do the job. Then we need to know the emergency procedure for the aircraft we are flying. The emergency procedure for a Cherokee Arrow will not work in a Piper Comanche — I saw the results of this once. On preflight we should look at the tires wheels and brakes for inflation, damage, wear, and any other discrepancy. It is always a good idea to roll the airplane to look at the whole tire not just the top especially if it has wheel-pants. Another important thing to look at is the strut inflation. Flying a retractable aircraft with a flat strut can lead to the landing gear jamming in the wheel-well. Flat struts on fixed gear aircraft can lead to damaged firewalls and gear mounts.

Remember the superior pilot uses their superior knowledge and judgment to avoid having to demonstrate their superior skill

Castle Air Museum Update



The Castle Air Museum's latest acquisition is a "shape" for a Mark-17 Thermonuclear Bomb. The bomb, one of the first Teller-Ulam deliverable "Supers," comes in at just under 25 feet long, just over 5 feet in diameter, and weighing 41,000 pounds (about the same as 4-1/2 average African elephants!). The only plane capable of carrying it was the B-36 bomber which had 336 spark plugs, 4 ignitors, and a wingspan of 230 feet or three-quarters of a football field! The [Castle Air Museum](#) is located about a mile west of the [Castle Airport](#) ramp.
