Checklists

Recently, I had occasion to view a checklist which had been prepared by a fairly new instructor for the flying club. There was an item which gave me some heartburn, something which doesn't happen all that much at my age these days. The young man had graciously offered to review and re-produce the checklists in the club airplanes, a thankless task which is most welcome in a volunteer organization such as the club. Some of the items on the checklist I usually decide if I like them or not, or whether I want to do them or not.

Checklists, yes, even checklists, are advisory in nature. The pilot-in-command is, by law, the sole person responsible for the safety of the flight of ANY aircraft flying under FAA rules. In fact, the law provides that if a pilot-in-command thinks a course of action is safer than one mandated by law, he/she is expected to take that course of action. The item which engendered the heartburn was: Before Takeoff Checklist: Switch Tanks.

Y'know, I thought we'd hashed that out years before. I thought there had been enough people killed that such matters had been long ago settled. For those that do not understand the problem, in the case of water in the fuel, IF there is water in the fuel, there is likely enough gas ahead of it to get you off the runway and 300 feet in the air before it hits the engine and causes engine failure, an event that can ruin your entire day, which is reason enough to start, runup, and takeoff on the same fuel tank, (normally the fullest tank). Even more disturbing, are flight schools now teaching students, and particularly flight instructors, that switching tanks just prior to takeoff is a good idea? I hope not.

Next time you look at a checklist, ask yourself if the items make sense.

Fly safe.

LVAA...50th Anniversary Interesting historical tidbits from the LVAA Newsletter and Meeting Minutes

LVAA's oldest newsletter on record is dated January 15, 1975... The cost of membership dues was \$2.50.

In February 1976, The Compass Rose was painted by a few dedicated LVAA members...

In April 1976 LVAA developed and sponsored an Aviation Explorer Post for the youth of the valley (Age 15-21), 39 prospective youths attended the orientation meeting. LVAA is 72 members strong and growing.

Newsletter dated June 1976, an article of about a Livermore resident who wrote a letter to the Editor of Independent News, the writer questioned the plan for a future of Livermore Airport and whether Livermore really needs an airport, "...most Livermore Airport traffic is recreational.....the noise from this air traffic disturbs the quiet of thousands of Livermore residents." (Nothing has changed!)

Newsletter dated Oct 1976, fuel at LVK cost .77 cents and .83 cents...

The First Annual LVAA Holiday event was held in December 15, 1976. It was a bbq Christmas meeting and members were required to bring their hamburgers, hot dogs, utensils, and side dishes to share. The exchange gifts were grab bags worth \$1 or less. LVAA reports membership is now 100+ and growing.

Newsletter dated July 20, 1977, noted that the cost of T-hangars in Dec 1965 was \$44. In July 1977, hangars cost increased from \$65 to \$70. LVK fuel is now up to .81 cents and \$0.86 cents.

In 1979, The Wall Planning Chart at the Terminal was underway and on display. The First Annual Installation Dinner was planned for January 1980. LVAA dues was \$4.00

In August 1980, LVAA planned to install benches at the Terminal building. LVAA Membership grew to 160 by December 1980.
