Growing up in Detroit, she watched her father run his own TV repair business, operating daily from the shop attached to their home. He was sought after for his excellence, always delivering more than expected. Additionally, her uncle—one of the first in Detroit to open a unisex barbershop—built a space so glamorous that everyone called him "Mr. Hollywood." It was their work ethic and ability to serve and build something lasting that shaped Linda's understanding of what it means to take ownership of your craft.

The male figures weren't the only family members who inspired Linda. Later in life, her mother reinforced this entrepreneurial spirit in a different way—by going to college in her 50s. "She showed me that growth has no expiration date. That courage to step into learning at any stage of life sparked something in me, leading me to embrace my own path of transformation," she said.

As Linda sat in her home studio crafting hats, she found herself doing more than design. "I was listening, encouraging, and connecting with the women who came to me," she said. Each hat carried a deeper meaning, tied to the mindset we wear in life. "Some of my clients came in celebrating victories, others facing struggles, but all of them had a story. The more I listened, the more I realized the symbolic power of hats—not just as fashion but as a metaphor for identity, resilience, and the way we show up in the world."

That moment of realization was more than inspiration; it was divine. "I believe it was something God placed in my heart to see, leading me to develop my first talk Shifting Your Mindset: Cultivate, Embrace, and Demonstrate Resiliency," said Linda. It was the bridge between her creative work and her greater purpose—empowering women to embrace their brilliance and resilience.

Linda hadn't set out to disrupt an industry, yet her journey naturally led her there. When she first began sharing the history of hats, people gravitated toward the storytelling. They weren't just learning about vintage styles—they were hearing about the perseverance of women in the 1920s and 1940s who faced adversity yet became iconic designers. Somehow, these two worlds merged: history, empowerment, and personal growth.

She wasn't just running a business; she was creating a movement. Hat Moments, which started as presentations
