Since Republic Urban has taken over the project as a 100% below-market value endeavor, progress has started. Our building is now six stories with the Post on the first & second floors. There will be 137 one-, two- and three-bedroom units on the fourth to sixth floors.

All units are below-market value with preference going first to Veterans, second to public safety personnel, and third to teachers until all units are filled.

Post 105 is ready to submit our SB 330 Preliminary Application form to Redwood City to start the approval process. Parking is the last thing we have to solidify; more to follow on that in my monthly reports.

Veteran Spotlight

Many of you have seen Chandara "Shawn" Vinoukkun at After the fall of Cambodia to the veteran events or at our Post but don't know his story. Herewith is a condensed telling of his military service and his journey to America.

Chandara was born into a large family in 1950. At age 20, Chandara volunteered to serve with the Cambodian military during the Vietnam War era, 1970-1975. As with most veterans, he's committed to memory where and when he served-the first Brigade, 4th Battalion first Company, first platoon and first squad Paratrooper Special Forces. "In 1971, our fourth Battalion was sent to to Phouc Tuy long Hai South Vietnam to be trained by the United States Green Berets Special Forces;" while training, the Green Berets took his 4th Battalion on two missions along the Ho Chi Minh trails.

Recalling his month of military training, Chandara was sent to various combat zones against the North Vietnam Army (NVA/Viet Cong) in Cambodia. On his fifth mission at National Highway 7 which leads to Central South Vietnam, he was severely wounded- sustaining multiple gunshot wounds. After his recovery, he continued his combat service for another four years against the NVA/Viet Cong and the Khmer Rouge (communist political group that ruled Cambodia). In hindsight, he marvels that he survived four years of combat yet ten members of his immediate family were murdered by the Khmer Rouge Regime. "War doesn't go away from my mind; I can't eradicated it so I just learned to live with it. Not a day goes by that I don't think of my lost family; it is so painful for me always."

Khmer Rouge Regime, "that was the last time I saw my immediate family." Chandara managed to escape to Thailand on April 17, 1975 with only the clothes on his

back and became a refugee for 18 months. Hence, the reason there are no pictures of him in his youth. While at the refugee camp, he worked picking corn or playing music for up to \$1.00 per day.

Through the sponsorship of the Presbyterian Church in San Diego, non-English speaker Chandara arrived in the USA on November 6, 1976 but found a part-time painting job and started learning English through ESL classes. Within seven months time, he moved to Tacoma, WA and then relocated to the Bay Area in 1979. With his proficient English, he was employed as a school bus driver for the Palo Alto Unified School District and then transferred to Landscape Athletics Department until his retirement in 2015 after 35 years of service with the District.

He married his wife Married to Priscilla 1990, raised their son, and now has a college-age granddaughter. He has a surviving sister who lives in SI; two of his brothers -- one of whom he sponsored to come to the U.S. with the other who remained in Cambodia--passed away 13 years ago. He remains pained by the loss of his family but strives to carry on.

Chandara is proud of his military service and joined the Steve Warren Memorial Ch. 464 Vietnam Veterans of America in 2019 as an Associate Member. He also belongs to the Khmer Republic Veterans in Long Beach, CA. Through Vietnam Veterans of America's Gary Higgins (profile in vol. 2 newsletter), Chandara learns about P105 events. That is how we at P105 are acquainted with Chandara and appreciate his support of our Post events. P105 will always welcome those who served.
