Veteran Spotlight

Meet Leo Burns, a 20-year Legionnaire and this issue's veteran in the spotlight. Leo managed to pack a lot of experience and knowledge into his two years of service yet he can't speak about much of it.

To cut costs as a college student at University of San Francisco (USF), he switched from day student to evening which made him eligible for the draft in September 1959. This led to basic training at Fort Ord, Headquarters Company. Soon thereafter, he trained as a personnel specialist and administrative specialist.

Due to his college experience, he was one of ten selected for interviews by a colonel to join a Special Unit which would require extensive security background investigation and not likely serving in the contiguous U.S.

He was one of only two who passed that clearance and was headed to Headquarters Army Security Agency Pacific (ASA-Pac), located at Helamano Military Reservation, Oahu. Initially serving as an E-2 Private, he quickly rose to Private First Class and then E-4 by the end of 1960.

One of Leo's distinctions was his skill as a marksman. While at USF, he had the honor of wearing the rare patch for the Pershing Rifle Drill Team. While in the service, he was a sharpshooter with .38 and .45 pistol.

Leo made an impression while working in personnel. His security clearance changed from Top Secret to Top Secret Crypto in 1960 due to his ability handling proficiency testing for cryptography-encoding & decoding information to secure confidentiality. While serving under his second the colonel, he was managing & reviewing documents which would eventually land on President Eisenhower's desk and was assigned as a secret courier for the colonel earning him a Good Conduct Medal and a letter of commendation from Headquarters of ASA-Pac. To this day due to the sensitive knowledge he holds, much of Leo's military record remains redacted.

Though he can't speak in detail about his service, he understood the gravity of his work and remains very proud of the faith the military entrusted in him at such a young age. **H**is time in the service wasn't all serious. He played baseball and basketball and enjoyed occasional flights to Johnson Island (an emergency airfield enroute to Guam, 800 miles southeast of Kona) courtesy of his cousin who was a Port Captain for the U.S. Navy in Guam.

Leo's family is steeped in public service. His grandfather was a detective for the Oakland Civilian Police for the Army Air Corps, his father served as a Lieutenant in the San Francisco Fire Department, and an uncle in the Coast Guard was stationed at Port Chicago.

Once he finished active duty, there were no Reserve openings in ASA so he joined Supply Company 91st Division, Pinetree Unit, stationed at the Presidio in San Francisco. In civilian life, he worked at Wells Fargo Bank in the Trust Dept., re-enrolled to finish his college education and served in the U.S. Postal Service as a ramp inspector at San Francisco International Airport until his retirement in 2004.

Leo lobbied for deaf education as an advocate for his son, Michael, which eventually led to Michael being integrated into regular classroom settings and more help and options for other students. Both he and his wife, lovce, of 60 years (an Auxiliary

member) contribute what time and efforts they can to our Post. P105 is fortunate to have such dedicated, civic-minded members such as them. Leo, we honor your service to our country, our Post, and our greater community. - P. Toye
