		REPORT BY:	1 <sup>st</sup> Vice Tom Day Membership. There are 434 members. We have 22 early bird renewals. One member is eligible for a 60-year membership certificate and 4 members are eligible for a 50-year membership certificate. We would like to plan special recognition for these five members of Post 105. Commander Smith agreed that something should be planned.	
			Commander George Smith He is waiting to hear back from the man who is fixing the ceiling in the hall about the feasibility of using sheetrock to smooth out the area that needs repair. Bob Meade is also working on this.

<b>NEW BUSINESS</b>			Commander George Smith He asked Romie Bassetto to look into reinstalling the ADT security system that was previously removed.	
			Commander Smith addressed a problem brought to the floor by a member who did not receive notification of the 4 <sup>th</sup> of July BBQ because of no internet or cell phone access. George said they are working on getting minutes mailed to people who are without electronic access.	
			Commander Smith said we do not have POW-MIA table. To furnish the items for the table would cost about \$80. He would like to see the table placed in the foyer.	
			Commander Smith brought up the idea of having a Coffee Wednesday in the dining room at the post. People could come and have a cup of coffee between 8 and 11 in the morning and visit with the commander or any of the officers who happen to be there. Peggy Toye has a connection with Panera bread and could furnish breads. George said a coffee maker that uses individual coffee pods could be purchased and that would cut down on the mess.

		mailboxes that could be used for dropping off flags. The Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts might decorate the boxes for us.
