REPORT BY:	 Board Member Stan Maupin, Building Project Stan deferred to Commander Smith regarding the report. Commander Smith's report: The contract with Republic needed to be renegotiated because it had expired. The new contract stipulates that in case there is eminent domain against the post, the post won't have to pay back the \$250,000 it received from Republic. Also, the new contract provides for a payment of \$75,000 to the post for each of two six-month extensions in case they are needed. Our lawyer's fees will be between \$12,000 and \$15,000 for the negotiations. Layout changes because of 50' easement the city wants: Rental units for veterans remain at 20%, but will be fewer in number. We can use the 50' easement for parking but no permanent structures can be built on it.
