John Robinson had a ladder stolen and since it is less than \$200, Commander Smith can authorize replacing it. The remainder of the insurance payment will go to losses the Post sustained in the break-in. 			

	Tee shirt sales	• R.E.D. Remember Everyone Deployed. Long sleeve tee shirts are for sale for \$30. All proceeds go to support our veterans community. We received \$1,367.50 for the short sleeve R.E.D. shirts we sold. We reinvested \$647.00 for the long sleeve shirts. This is an AL/ALA venture with a 50/50 split.
