The newsletter veteran story this month is about our honorary military services comrade John Albertson who served in the U.S. Army. He was an E-5 Sergeant who worked in the motor pool to supervise vehicle repairs, and to ensure vehicles are ready for the battlegrounds transportation. He was deployed to Munich Germany and returned to Ford Hood, Texas where he completed his military services and retired. His platoon works closely with the supply center to order and provide appropriate vehicle parts to properly repairs combat vehicles. He works closely with Medivac vehicles to transport injured soldiers from the battlefield, and making sure combat vehicles are prepared with proper equipment to target the enemy.

His military service really helped him learn how to make decisions in life, and believes in helping veterans within communities. He believes in military services and strongly feels American citizens have to serve their country, and because it is your duty to become a citizen in your country by defending it. He is very proud and grateful for serving his country and feels he successfully completed his mission in the military.

American Legion Riders Chapter 105 has participated in many missions supporting veterans and their families, and participated in more than 6 missions and rifle firing details. The ALR105 rode more than 565 miles and donated more than 69 volunteer hours since last month. Including an escort ride scheduled for the National Commander in California on December 10 and 11. The new ALR105 President, Andrew Trapani, will take over his new position role. The ALR105 chapter raised \$3700 during therein Suicide Prevention ride with monetary contribution for the VA Palo Alto Hospital. Also, raised \$410 and donated therein monetary contribution to Wreaths Across America.
