- \geq The SAL Unit 105 Commander, Andrew Trapani reported 11 members in their unit and will continue to help veterans and their families when necessary. The SAL Unit 105 worked closely with ALR Post 105 and Auxiliary Unit 105 to coordinate free COVID-19 testing activities at our post. He also shared what makes a person eligible to become a SAL member because somebody at therein COVID-19 testing event asked him. The following are eligibility qualifications: A male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons of members of The American Legion, and such male descendants of veterans who died in service during the period of April 6, 1917. Through November 11, 1918, or any time from December 7, 1941, to date, who served honorably, as set forth in Article IV, Section 1, of the National Constitution of The American Legion, or who died subsequent to their honorable discharge from such service, shall be eligible for membership in the Sons of The American Legion.
