The newsletter story this month is about our honorary veteran comrade Sergeant E5 Michael Marks who served in the U.S. Army from 1969 to 1971. He was drafted during therein time for military services and his military life was a big change for himself. His military service was in Fishhook at the Cambodian Border, and invaded Cambodia along with his comrades. He was a Radio Operator to relay message information with others and call upon artillery strikes. He feels that his emotions affected him and almost at a loss of his performance along with his comrades on the battlefield. He was struggling with his transitional life back into the civilian society, and PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder) was making it worse thereafter his honorary military services.

Sergeant Michael Marks feels proud of serving his country during his military career services! He dislikes the government and the military for making him do something that he was not meant to do in his life. He believes therein government and the military took away everything precious to him, and feels we were on the wrong side of the battlefield. He believes the war was unnecessary and he would continue to help veterans and their families when necessary in our communities.

- **COVID-19 PREVENTION RED ALERT:** Our AL Post 105 continues to remain closed until further notice with a vaccine under distribution. The three identified CDC (Centers for Disease Control) and Prevention healthy standards have been proven to stop therein COVID-19 virus effectively. It's consistent with local, state, and federal health guidelines – just follow herein **three protective** healthy standards: **1) Wear Face Covering Masks, 2) Maintain Social Physical Distance, and 3) Wash Your Hands.**
- Our Post 105 Commander, Romie Bassetto and therein comprehensive DDA/Development Agreement (“Agreement”) has been signed appropriately by all involved parties and moving forward for next steps, and the development status letter was sent to our post membership. American Legion Riders Chapter 105 has participated in **14missions** supporting our deceased veterans by participating on Firing Details during the month of March 2021. We have driven **1249 miles** and **donated 180 volunteer hours**. - The **SAL Unit 105** Commander, Andrew Trapani reported 11 members in their unit and will continue to help veterans and their families when necessary. The SAL Unit 105 worked closely with ALR Post 105 and Auxiliary Unit 105 to coordinate free COVID-19 testing activities at our post. He also shared what makes a person eligible to become a SAL member because somebody at therein COVID-19 testing event asked him. The following are eligibility qualifications: A male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons of members of The American Legion, and such male descendants of veterans who died in service during the period of April 6, 1917. Through November 11, 1918, or any time from December 7, 1941, to date, who served honorably, as set forth in Article IV, Section 1, of the National Constitution of The American Legion, or who died subsequent to their honorable discharge from such service, shall be eligible for membership in the Sons of The American Legion.
- The **Auxiliary Unit 105** President, Carol Rael continues to meet monthly via Zoom with her team. Auxiliary U105 members strive to assist our community despite the pandemic restrictions. Panelists selected an additional 2021 Girls State Delegate from Sequoia High School and assisted U585 with their selection for Aragon High. VA&R Deputy Arlene delivered District 26's 45 collective Spring Gift Bags to residents at VA-Menlo Park Bldg. 331-- including Post 105's donation of Girl Scouts cookies and face masks from Unit 105. U105 is collaborating with (thus far) Units 585 (San Carlos), 472 (eUnit), 238 (Pacifica), and Troop 61829 for the gift bags.
- The **American Recovery Plan** will cancel many VA copayments for medical care and/or prescriptions. If you're a veteran receiving health care through the VA Hospital, and you may be eligible for copayment debts to be cancelled and/or receive copayment refunds. These high levels of mental health issues can lead into high levels of substance abuse and severe drug use with harmful levels of alcohol drinking.
