The newsletter veteran story this month is about our honorary comrade Petty Officer 3<sup>rd</sup> Class Jerry Coffey who served in the U.S. Navy. He served with honorable military services from 1964 to 1970 and joined the U.S. Navy on his own free willingness to avoid the draft. He adapted to his military life without any problems and his brother served in the U.S. Army as well. He started his regiment training at Hunter's Point in the Bay Area and went to Vietnam with his comrades. He worked closely with friendly comrades to fire back at their enemies during combat at the battleground and helping U.S. Marines soldiers for backup.

His military experience was good and he managed to handle it well, and sometimes, people would ask him, "Did you kill anyone?" He said, "If you have to ask for the price, and you can't afford it." He believes there is no veteran that has been to actual combat can say, "They did not fear for their lives at some point." Because it is their commitment of serving their country with honorable military services. He is proud of serving his country and will do it again, and will continue to help veterans in local communities when necessary.

- **RED ALERT UPDATE!** Our Post 105 is now opening for indoor business meetings when things are starting to reopen in San Mateo County during their reopening celebration on **Tuesday, June 15, 2021**. Including our post membership general meetings starting last month with an installation of new officers, and our new **Post 105 Commander, Mr. George Smith**. The Department of Public Health in San Mateo County will align their health and safety guidelines with the State of California. The business capacity and distancing restrictions are released for most businesses, and indoor events and/or business gatherings will have vaccination or negative test requirements for participants. - The **SAL Unit 105** Commander, Andrew Trapani reported previously another new member joined and elevated their membership to **13 total members**. Also, five members were transferred from Post 28 and helped elevated the post membership and ALR membership as well. The SAL Unit 105 participated and worked closely with ALR Post 105 and Auxiliary Unit 105 to coordinate activities for therein **Rummage Sale – 4 participants with 30 volunteer hours**. - The **American Recovery Plan** will cancel many VA copayments for medical care and/or prescriptions. If you're a veteran receiving health care through the VA Hospital, and you may be eligible for copayment debts to be cancelled and/or receive copayment refunds. It applies to veterans receiving patient statements in January 2021 with copayments regarding services on or after April 6, 2020 – veterans may be eligible for refund. The VA will not pursue collection for payments at this time and veterans can continue copayments if they want. It's been reported that **80%** are with significant symptoms of depression, **45%** with moderate levels of anxiety, and **17%** with severe anxiety. These high levels of mental health issues can lead into high levels of substance abuse and severe drug use with harmful levels of alcohol drinking. Availability for vaccinations are **good without appointments** at more clinics in Menlo Park and Palo Alto, and aligned with therein federal legislation! Please call at (650) 496-2535 and schedule between 8 AM to 6 PM for those who fall within this category. Local counties in San Francisco Bay Area **are offering free vaccinations** for veteran families.
- The veterans may be eligible for health care benefits aligned with the **National Defense Authorization Act** provisions for Fiscal Year 2021 (**Public Law 116-283**). Regarding thereby Agent Orange tactical herbicide with toxic substance used by the military during the Vietnam War, and Gulf War with military operations in the Middle East.
