She was a military Medic Specialist E-4 Petty Officer who served onboard with her military friends. She worked closely with her colleagues to provide medical care for wounded soldiers, and assisted medical doctors when necessary for advanced medical care and/or operations. She worked closely with her team to ensure medical equipment is ready at all times, and equipment is working properly without repairing problems. Including ongoing medical treatments for wounded soldiers as well as administering medications, and physical rehabilitation treatment to ensure wounded soldiers are progressively getting better.

She really feels great about serving her country and believes veterans should be appreciated and supported by communities. She gets involved with her family to support organizations to help veterans with their families at local communities. She strongly believes high schools should promote more ROTC programs because high schools get government funds to operate.

The ALR105 chapter raised \$6347 during therein Suicide Prevention ride with monetary contribution for the VA Palo Alto Hospital. Including \$100 for Tongan Relief Fund, \$720 for Berkeley Half Marathon, \$1080 for Oakland Marathon, \$100 for Ukrainian Relief Fund, and \$289.56 for Post 105 Dinner Dance. Through November 11, 1918, or any time from December 7, 1941, to date, who served honorably, as set forth in Article IV, Section 1, of the National Constitution of The American Legion, or who died subsequent to their honorable discharge from such service shall be eligible.
