- The American Legion Riders Chapter 105 membership and colleagues shared herein following progressive activities. American Legion Riders Chapter 105 has participated in many missions supporting veterans and their families, and participated in more than 188 missions and rifle firing details. The ALR105 rode more than 44,077 miles and donated more than 4,111 volunteer hours since last month in January 2023. Including an escort ride scheduled for the National Commander in California on December 10 and 11. The new ALR105 President, Andrew Trapani, will take over his new position role. The ALR105 chapter raised \$6347 during therein Suicide Prevention ride with monetary contribution for the VA Palo Alto Hospital. Also, raised \$410 and donated therein monetary contribution to Wreaths Across America. Including \$100 for Tongan Relief Fund, \$720 for Berkeley Half Marathon, \$1080 for Oakland Marathon, \$100 for Ukrainian Relief Fund, and \$289.56 for Post 105 Dinner Dance. As well as a successful escort for therein 2022 National Wreaths Across America to Golden Gate National Cemetery. Including community resources to support 2022 Seamans Memorial Cruise, and escorting services for ALA President and Operation Surf. The Post 105 Riders participated in the Berkeley ½ marathon directing local traffic control. - The SAL Unit 105 Commander, Andrew Trapani reported previously another new member joined and elevated their membership numbers to 17. The AL California Department identifies SAL Unit 105 with 80% membership retention versus their membership goal. The SAL Unit 105 participated in 137 Final Hours Detail missions during rifle-firing details to honor our veterans, and with 105 participants and more details are scheduled for next month. The SAL Unit 105 donated \$100 for the Veterans Day Celebration and they contributed 577 hours of volunteering time with 6508 miles. They continue to partner with ALR for missions when necessary. We are constantly looking for new qualified members, and not only can Patriots join but veterans can also join the Sons of The American Legion. The following are eligibility qualifications for SAL Unit 105: A male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons of members of The American Legion, and such male descendants of veterans who died in service during the period of April 6, 1917. Through November 11, 1918, or any time from December 7, 1941, to date, who served honorably, as set forth in Article IV, Section 1, of the National Constitution of The American Legion, or who died subsequent to their honorable discharge from such service shall be eligible.
- The AL Auxiliary Unit 105 President, Carol Rael continues to meet with their unit in-person at Post-105 on the second Wednesday @ 6pm. Unit 105 continues as a team to fulfill the mission of the Auxiliary and thereby the Legion's mission. Officer Elections were held in May 2022 with following results: President Carol Rael, 1st Vice President Pauline Robinson, 2nd Vice President Peggy Toye, Secretary Diane Day and Treasurer Brenda Ternullo. ALA participated in Blue Star Moms, Wreaths Across America on December 17th, as well as Toys for Vets wrapping gifts that had been donated for the children/grandchildren of VA patients. ALA also fulfilled a VA patient wishlist and delivered the presents of December 6th. On December 23rd ALA attended the Veterans Christmas Luncheon at San Mateo Elks, hosting a table which gave out information on Unit 105. Unit 105/District 26 raised over \$2,100. of toys/donations for Toys for Vets to avoid a toy shortfall. RED (Remember Everyone Deployed) T-shirt sales are available for \$25. each. - The Governor Gavin Newsome and his administration announced \$50 million available funding support, and to help establish CVHI (California Veterans Health Initiative). To help avoid and/or limit suicide for veterans statewide to support veterans and their families. The CVHI program will provide resources for veterans with early intervention, and delivering innovative approaches with direct services to help veterans and their families. - The American Legion members in California can get thereby storm relief funding support by applying for assistance at the NEF (National Emergency Fund). The national funding support can provide up to \$3,000 for impacted legionnaires by the storm, and up to \$10,000 for American Legion posts for storm repairs. The recent stormy weather in California has impacted many veterans and their families, and some people died. - The VA also tries to keep veterans updated with new regulations aligned with eligible veteran benefits.
