The newsletter veteran story this month is about Ronald Soucy who served in the U.S. Army with honorable services discharge. He completed his basic training at Fort Dix, New Jersey and stationed at Fort Brag, North Carolina. He was a Specialist 4 ranking soldier and served in the artillery battalion with heavy artillery equipment. He was in training with his comrades for eight weeks with heavy artillery equipment. He worked closely with his comrades to ensure the artillery equipment was working properly before firing, and targeting enemy lines during combat zones.

He is very proud of serving his country and the military did not impact his life much, and did what he had to join and get out there to work. He learned many different things during his honorary military services, and would like more support for veterans with recognition. He joined the workforce quickly thereafter his military service. He said, "His time in the military taught him how to work as a team!"
