The newsletter veteran story this month is about Joe Sobocan who served in the U.S. Army with honorable services. He was a Specialist 5 ranking veteran as a Radar Operator with the Nike Hercules Missiles Unit within 4 years of services. He stationed at Fort Barry during the Vietnam War and Korean War. He worked closely with his comrades to ensure missiles are ready at all times and targeting enemies with accuracy. His operating crewmembers were responsible for preparing missiles efficiently during the erection process, and ready to fire under guidance of the command officer. His crew team worked under supervision of the control unit officer in command.

He is a member of VFW (Veterans of Foreign Wars) Post 69 and happy of serving his country with honors. He works closely with his veteran friends to help local communities with projects for veterans and their families.
