Minutes of the regular meeting of the Community Center & Playground District #3, Calcasieu Parish, Vinton, LA held in the meeting room of the Community Center on February 12, 2025, at 5:30 PM. After full compliance with all regulations as to notice otherwise and respect to conveying of said meeting with the following present:

On a motion by Ms. Eastwood, seconded by Mr. Durio, and carried unanimously, the Board approved the minutes as presented for the January 8, 2025, regular board meeting. No public comment.

- Mr. Henderson was not present; Mrs. Labby presented the financial statements for the month. Ms. Eastwood
 made a motion to approve the bills as presented, seconded by Mr. Durio, and carried unanimously. No public
 comment. Ms. Eastwood made a motion to approve the wire transfer to Hancock Whitney, seconded by Mrs.
 Conner, and carried unanimously. No public comment.
- II. Mr. Bruchhaus was given the floor to give an update regarding the property for sale to the east side of the Community Center. The Board thanked Mr. Bruchhaus for his time but did not make a motion to proceed with further negotiations. Mr. Bruchhaus will inform the real estate agent that the District will not seek an appraisal without a contract and does not wish to submit another offer. No motion made. No public comment.
- III. The next item on the agenda was Sports Committee Update. Mrs. Courville gave an update on the upcoming baseball & softball season. Mrs. Clair Renfrow, of the committee, entered the meeting during this discussion.

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A meeting will be scheduled between the committee and the Sports Director. No further comments or action taken.

IV. On a motion by Ms. Eastwood, seconded by Mrs. Conner, and carried; the Board entered into an agreement with Langley, Williams, & Company, LLC, to provide the District with auditing services for the year ended December 31, 2024. No public comment.

On a motion by Ms. Eastwood, seconded by Mrs. Conner, and carried; the Board entered into an agreement with Langley, Williams, & Company, LLC, to perform for the District specified procedures on the control and compliance areas identified in the Louisiana Legislative Auditor's Statewide Agreed Upon Procedures for the fiscal period ended December 31, 2024. No public comment.

V. Mrs. Labby was given the floor to present purchases for approval.

a. Blood Pressure Kiosks:

Mrs. Labby presented the Board with different brands and models that she received quotes on. The Board discussed that some of the units require a monthly subscription package. Mrs. Labby explained that those machines offer mobile apps with data tracking for the users' readings. The quotes on those models are listed below:

f. No public comment on purchases.

Mr. Harbert acknowledged there was no other business on the agenda and asked if there was any other public comment or anything that wanted to be brought up. Mr. Jarreau, a fitness instructor for Ward 7 Community Center, said that he would like to speak. He stated that he asked for an increase in pay per class in December and was turned down. Mr. Jarreau and Mr. Benoit had a lengthy discussion with the Board regarding the Pilates class and why they feel a higher rate of pay is deserved. Mrs. Conner stated that she would call the other Districts in the area to get their prices and whether they have assistants or not. The discussion got out of control when Mrs. Labby tried to speak. Mr. Harbert said if there was no more business to handle, the board would get back with them next month. He asked Mr. Jarreau and Mr. Benoit to please be at the next board meeting, and they would give them answers that night.

There being no further business, Ms. Eastwood made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Mr. Durio; and carried unanimously. No public comment.
