

Who is Your Lord?

Part 1: Core Q&A with Evidence (Guided Reading)

Q1: Who is your Lord?

- Answer: My Lord is Allah, the One who created me, provides for me, and takes care of me.

- Evidence: رَبُّكُمْ اللَّهُ الَّذِي خَلَقَ السَّمَاوَاتِ وَالْأَرْضَ

Rabbukumullāh alladhī khalaqa as-samāwāti wal-arḍ

“Your Lord is Allah, who created the heavens and the earth.” [Sūrah Yūnus 10:3]

Q2: Who created you and gave you life?

- Answer: Allah created me, gave me life, and to Him is my return.

- Evidence: اللَّهُ خَالِقُ كُلِّ شَيْءٍ

Allāhu khāliqu kulli shay’

“Allah is the Creator of everything.” [Sūrah al-Zumar 39:62]

Q3: Who provides you food, drink, and everything you need?

- Answer: Allah provides me with everything, because He is ar-Razzāq (The Provider).

- Evidence: إِنَّ اللَّهَ هُوَ الرَّزَّاقُ ذُو الْقُوَّةِ الْمَتِينُ

Inna Allāha huwa ar-Razzāqu dhū al-quwwati al-matīn

“Indeed, Allah is the Provider, the Possessor of Power, the Strong.” [Sūrah adh-Dhāriyāt 51:58]

Q4: Who protects you when you are afraid or in danger?

- Answer: Allah protects me, and no one can protect except Him.

- Evidence: اللَّهُ خَيْرَ حَافِظًا

“Allah is the best protector.” [Sūrah Yūsuf 12:64]

Q5: Who do you worship and pray to?

- Answer: I worship Allah alone, and I do not call upon anyone besides Him.

Evidence: **وَأَعْبُدُوا اللَّهَ وَلَا تُشْرِكُوا بِهِ شَيْئًا**

Wa’budū Allāha walā tushrikū bihi shay’an

Worship Allah and do not associate anything with Him.”) [Sūrah an-Nisā’ 4:36]

Part 4: Names of Allah (Discussion & Memorization)

- الرزاق (ar-Razzāq — The Provider)
- الحفيظ (al-Ḥafīẓ — The Protector)

Direction:

Read & Repeat — Child reads each Name in Arabic and English three times aloud with the parent/teacher.

Meaning Practice — Child explains in their own words:

- “ar-Razzāq means Allah gives food, drink, and everything I need.”
- “al-Ḥafīẓ means Allah protects me and keeps me safe.”

Connect to Life — Child writes or says one example for each Name:

- “Allah is ar-Razzāq because He gave me breakfast today.”
- “Allah is al-Ḥafīẓ because He kept me safe when I crossed the road.”

Memorization Check — By the end of the week, the child should be able to:

- Have memorized the Name in Arabic and English.
- Give at least one personal example of how that Name applies in their life.

Part 5: Review & Practice

- **Daily Review:** Parent/teacher asks the 5 core questions in random order. Child answers in full sentences, including Qur’an evidence.
- **End-of-Week Review:**
 - Fill in at least two āyāt from memory (writing).
 - Recite the two Names of Allah with meaning.
 - Give one personal example of each Name in daily life.
