Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth (Colossians 3:2 ESV)

Last month while going through the book of Philippians, we looked at Philippians 4:8. One of the things that we talked about was how this would be an excellent passage for us to all memorize. Our thoughts, positive or negative, whether they are based on reality or fiction, have an amazing way of playing themselves out in our lives. So much of what we think about is just wrong. It is not based on reality. Or it is based on our own skewed views of reality that taint everything that we see and do. Did the dog chew your slipper because he was bored, had been left alone too long, and did what dogs do when they are bored? Or does the dog hate you and want to destroy your life? Did your car battery die because it is losing its ability to hold a charge and it's time to get a new one, or is it because your life is horrible and anything that can go wrong will? One response will help us see the issue, deal with the issue, and put the issue behind us with new slippers or a new battery. The negative response, which is not based on reality, has a tendency to breed more negative responses to the many other challenges that we are going to face throughout our day and life. Negativity breeds negativity. It is infectious. Positive thinking people face all the same challenges as negative thinking people. The difference is in the response. We cannot control when tires are going to deflate, batteries are going to die, or people are going to be nasty. What we can control is what we think about and how we respond when these things happen.

One day while in seminary I found that my battery had unexpectedly died. I got pretty frustrated because this was either going to make me miss a meeting or be really late to one. I had no way to jump my car and none of my neighbors were home to help me out. Frustration was building. I called AAA. 15 agonizing minutes later a small pickup pulled into my driveway and out of it popped a gentleman who attended the church where I was serving as an interim at the time. Turns out that he had really been wrestling with some faith issues, but did not want to talk to me at the church because his family was always around. Also, he was not comfortable picking up the phone and calling me (although I wish he would have). Because we "just happened" to be in the same place at the same time, he figured he might as well tell me what was on his mind. He was blessed by the Bible verses that God laid on my heart to share with him. I was blessed because this inconvenience, which was so frustrating to me before he got there, reminded me that God is in control. I do not know if God actually caused my battery to fail in that moment, or if he simply lined things up so that when it did fail he would make sure that the person that I was supposed to minister to showed up to help me. But what I do know is that there was a point to it. God had ordained that moment. Before the beginning of time the Lord planned his response to my dead battery. He knew that good would come from that. It was not my plan. It was his. Thankfully, my plans were ruined. God's plans never are. "Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the LORD that will stand" (Proverbs 19:21, ESV).

God may have a plan for our next inconvenience. In fact, he might even cause it. If we take our eyes off ourselves and put them on him instead, we might be able to see how he is moving in our lives and the lives of those around us. Today I cannot remember what meeting I was late for or who it was even with when the battery died. Evidently it was not as important as I thought it was. But I do remember that God met with me and a fellow brother in Christ in my driveway and subtly changed both of our lives as a result. If I had set my mind on things above, as opposed to the base things right in front of me, and if I remembered all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28 ESV), I would have saved myself a lot of needless frustration and angst. Amen?
