McCormack has said within the three men met to discuss PEPs in the weeks before the secret appointment, Morrison flagged that he could overrule Pin and make the final decision. Now, McCormack has confirmed that Morrison did not mention this would involve seeking special vice-regal authorization to effectively become a co-minister in the portfolio. How it happened: Medibank hack came via a single login

Insiders say hackers exploited a basic flaw in Medibank's security. It's part of a dramatic surge in attacks that's forcing authorities to step up the hunt for cybercriminals offshore.

In private briefings to other companies, Medibank has revealed the source of its information. It says that the company has tracked cybercriminals to visit the Institute of Medicine in the United States.

The criminal researchers found the signs

of a cyber attack on the company's website, as well as, by October 6, showed that the Australian Health Directorate (AHD) decided to act on some suspicious activity that was playing out on the Medibank website, "planned the company's response."

As it turns out, Medibank staff were worried about the possibility of a cyber attack and wondering who to make of it. The next day, the company's security team contacted the Australian Health Directorate and made a statement to the market acknowledging the attack. The company also contacted the FBI at the time to request critical information had

President Paul Christensen made him Kristina make a brief statement to the media. "Our intelligence points to a group of loosely affiliated cybercriminals, who are likely responsible for the attacks on our website in countries across the world," he said.

Medibank also says that it is operating as a business with affiliates and associates, and that it is not a public company.

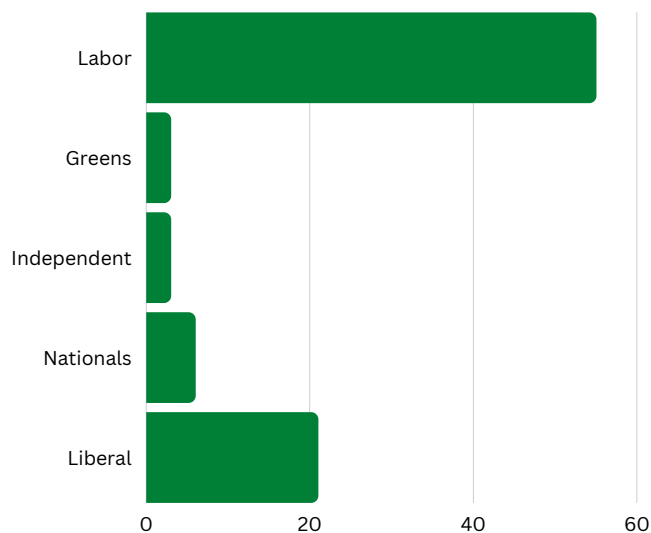

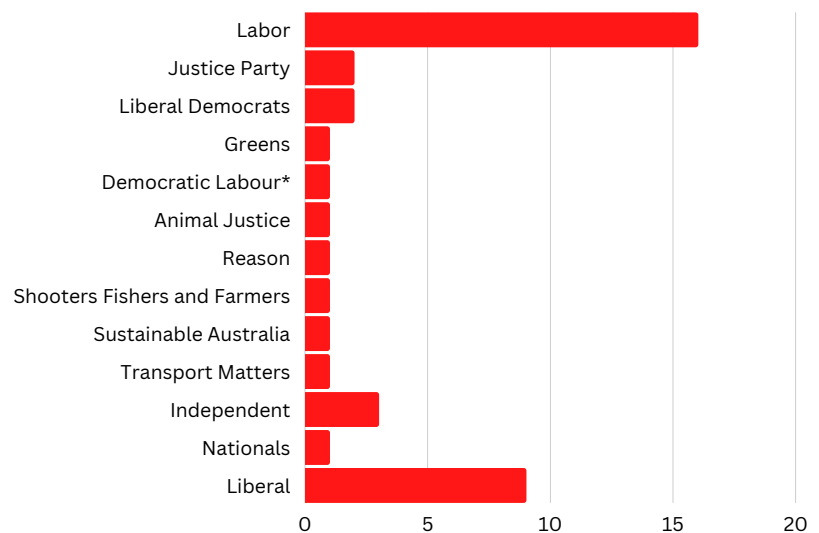


The Victorian Election will be held on November 26, to elect all 88 members of the Legislative Assembly and All 40 members of the Legislative Council.

In the Legislative Assembly Labor holds a firm Majority with 55 seats.



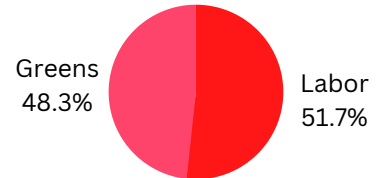
In the Legislative Council Labor does not hold a majority and has had to negotiate with the huge crossbench

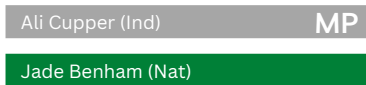

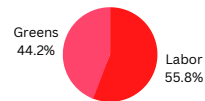
Lidia Thorpe won the seat for the Greens off Labor in a 2017 by-election. She then lost at the 2018 election to Labor's Kat Theophanous.

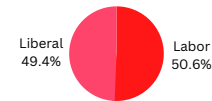

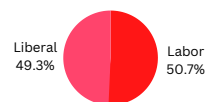

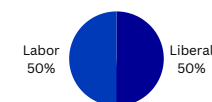

Political Parties

Animal Justice Party



The Animal Justice Party is a left wing party that focuses on Animal Welfare and Climate Change. They have one upper house seat.

Greens
