FHSAA DOGSO (Denial of Obvious Goal-Scoring Opportunity) scenarios reflecting the updated disciplinary actions:

#### 1. Scenario:

An attacking player outside the penalty area has a clear goal-scoring opportunity and is tripped by the last defender who tried to tackle the ball away.

Referee Action: Red Card / DFK (Direct Free Kick).

# 2. Scenario:

An attacking player inside the penalty area has a clear goal-scoring opportunity and is tripped by the last defender who tried to tackle the ball away.

**Referee Action: Yellow Card** / PK (Penalty Kick) — "Double Jeopardy" rule applies as the defender made an attempt to play the ball.

#### 3. Scenario:

An attacking player outside the penalty area has a clear goal-scoring opportunity and is pulled down by the last defender who made no attempt to play the ball.

Referee Action: Red Card / DFK (Direct Free Kick).

## 4. Scenario:

An attacking player inside the penalty area has a clear goal-scoring opportunity and is pulled down by the last defender who made no attempt to play the ball.

Referee Action: Red Card / PK.

### 5. **Scenario**:

An attacking player outside the penalty area has a clear goal-scoring opportunity and is viciously taken down by the last defender who made no attempt to play the ball.

Referee Action: Red Card / DFK (Direct Free Kick) + (Serious Foul Play).

## 6. Scenario:

An attacking player is denied a certain goal because the defender deliberately swatted down his shot just outside the goal-line with his hand.

**Referee Action: Red Card** / PK (Denying a Goal by Handling the Ball).

**Reminder**: If an opponent commits a violent foul, whether inside or outside the box, the player shall receive a **Red Card** for Serious Foul Play.
