



Grey Street House O/O n30



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
This was designed to be a generic version of the type of narrow houses seen in Chesapeake City, MD and elsewhere throughout the US, particularly in coal country. There is no specific prototype and, as usual, you are highly encouraged to do something else with it. Additionally, there is no Grey Street in Chesapeake City.

Make this kit something special.



BUILDING



1. Bracing (shown in green) Cross sections shown on top.




2. Paint – All parts as required
3. Stripwood – Cut and glue corner pieces (shown in purple) Cross sections on top



4. Trim the stripwood to line up with the roof
5. Assemble



6. Examine roof pieces to decide how large you want them. I intentionally left them long and wide so you can figure out what you want to do. On the test model, I did not modify the top roof, but cut the lower roof to make it more narrow.
7. Shingle roof pieces except roof cap. The width of the tarpaper should be cut to 11/16 inch. If you are unfamiliar with how to do this, go to Jason Jensen Trains on Youtube and look for episode 010.
8. Apply roof pieces and roof cap



9. Apply door, windows and smoke jack as desired along with curtains and window blinds.
