The Bune Circuit: Treasury of the Dead

Explanation for Children

Imagine three dragon heads: one that talks, one that remembers, one that can fly.

Explanation for Scientists

The circuit uses three qubits: Q0 (human mind), Q1 (dog instinct), Q2 (griffin transcendence).

All enter Hadamard superposition, then receive rotations: Rz(/4) on Q1 (grave flavor), Ry(/6) on Q2 (dignified rise).

A Toffoli gate activates Q2 only when Q0 and Q1 are both 1--resurrection requires mental and instinctive alignment.

Q0 receives an S gate (phase gravitas), and Q2 is refined through Z.
