The Berith Circuit: Transmutation of Will

Introduction

Explanation for Scientists

The Berith Circuit uses three qubits. Q0 represents the base element, while Q1 is the transmuted gold.

Q2 represents the battle strength that powers the transmutation process. The Rz(/3) on Q0 adjusts its phase to introduce instability,

and the Ry(/4) on Q2 adds force. A CX gate between Q0 and Q1 triggers the transmutation, while a CZ gate from Q1 to Q2 infuses strength.

The resulting measurement distribution shows a preference for the transformation to succeed, with rarer outcomes representing partial failure.

Applications

- Alchemical simulations
- Metaphors for value creation and transformation
- Simulations of physical and mental change processes
- Controlled energy and force applications in quantum systems
- Simulations for success/failure-based processes
