As the first President of the new ACE TMC, I've had to rely on my experience previously as a Club President to build procedures and protocols for my new club.

What lessons did you learn from previous leadership positions?

Building relationships are vital in any leadership position, everything you need from the people you lead comes naturally after relationships are built. Being calm, flexible, and adaptable in the face of any unexpected changes is the best trait of any leader.
