AUTHOR – PUBLISHER AGREEMENT

Corpus Juris: The Law Journal (henceforth referred to as the 'JOURNAL') is an open access, peer-reviewed Journal published under the aegis of Adv. Sunil Chauhan (hereinafter referred to as the 'PUBLISHER').

By submitting the Manuscript to the Journal, the Author of the submission (the Manuscript) agrees to the terms of this Agreement.

If the manuscript has been accepted for publication, the author must sign this Agreement Form after reading the Explanatory Notes attached below and send in the signed forms, in electronic format (PDF), to the Editorial Board, together with a final approval for the publication of the Manuscript.

In order to ensure the widest dissemination and protection of the material published in the Journal, the Journal asks its Authors to assign copyright in their Manuscripts, including abstracts, to the Journal and Publisher. This enables the Journal and its Publisher to ensure Copyright protection against infringement and to disseminate the manuscript, and the Journal, as widely as possible.

1. In consideration of the terms of the Agreement set out below, and upon acceptance of the Manuscript for publication in the Journal, [insert the full names of the author]

hereinafter referred to as ‘the Manuscript’ by the Author to be published in ‘Corpus Juris: The Law Journal.’

The assignment provides the Journal as well as its Publisher the sole right and responsibility to publish the Manuscript, including the right to sub-license publishing or distribution rights to the Manuscript as may be appropriate, in both printed and electronic form; the Manuscript may be published in printed, online, microfiche or in other media formats. The Author agrees that the Journal and its Publisher may publish the Manuscript, including the Author’s full name, title, name of the affiliated institute(s), telephone and email address and that the Journal may sell or distribute it, on its own, or with other related material.

2. In consideration of this Assignment, the Journal and its Publisher hereby undertake to prepare and publish the Manuscript named in paragraph 1 in the Journal, subject only to its right to refuse publication as provided in paragraph 4 or if there are other reasonable grounds; in which case, the Journal and its Publisher revert and assign to the Author any and all copyright and other rights in the Manuscript otherwise assigned to it under this Agreement. The Journal and its Publisher further undertake that the name of the Author will always be clearly associated with the Manuscript.
3. The Editorial Board of the Journal and its Publisher are empowered to make such editorial changes as may be necessary to make the Manuscript suitable for publication. Every effort will be made to consult the Author if substantive changes are required.
4. The Author warrants that the Manuscript is the Author’s original work, it has not been published before either in full or in part and is not currently under consideration for publication elsewhere; and that the Manuscript contains no libellous or unlawful statements and that it in no way infringes the rights of others, nor it is in breach of any Indian law, and if it is found otherwise, the Author undertakes to indemnify the Journal

and its Publisher in such event. The Author further undertakes that, as the owner of the copyright, he/she is entitled to make this assignment.

5. By way of this Agreement, the Author also confirms that all views contained in the Manuscript are of the Author's and the Publisher or the Journal cannot be held responsible in any manner for the same.

AUTHOR-PUBLISHER AGREEMENT: EXPLANATORY NOTES

While the Copyright will vest with the Journal and its Publisher, the Author retains the right to use the Manuscript in the following ways, as long as the Author does not sell it in ways that would conflict directly with the Journal or its Publishers efforts to disseminate it. In all cases, acknowledgement in the form of a full citation must be given to the journal as the original source of publication, together with a link to the journal webpage and/or DOI as soon as they are available.

1. The Author is free to post the manuscript version of the Manuscript on their personal, their institute's, company's or funding agency's website and/or in an online repository as long as the Author gives acknowledgement (by inserting a citation) to the version as published in the Journal and a link is inserted to the published Manuscript on the website of Corpus Juris: The Law Journal. (For example "The final publication is available at Corpus Juris: The Law Journal through **<https://corpusjuris.co.in/publications>**");
2. The Author may use the Manuscript, in whole or in part, as the basis for their spoken presentations.

It is the Journal's policy to acquire copyright for all contributions for the following reasons:

- a. the ownership of copyright by the Journal helps ensure the maximum international protection against infringement and/or plagiarism;
- b. requests for permission to reproduce manuscripts in books, course packs, etc. can be handled centrally, relieving authors of time consuming administrative burden;
- c. the demand for research literature in electronic form can be met efficiently, with proper safeguards for authors, Editorial Board, and Journal owners.

Sunil Chauhan is the ultimate custodian of academic quality and integrity, and will ensure that this will be done only in exceptional circumstances and on reasonable grounds. In such circumstances the Manuscript will be returned to the Author together with all rights in it.

Corpus Juris: The Law Journal publishes all its Manuscripts under an open access CC BY-NC-ND 4.0 License. This allows the Academic community, as well as the general public, to gain unlimited, free and immediate access to scholarly articles, and to reuse the content freely provided by giving proper attribution to the Authors. In order to cover the costs of providing our high quality publishing service and free access to readers, Authors pay a one-time Manuscript Processing Charge (hereinafter referred to as MPC) for manuscripts accepted after double blind peer-review. There are no charges for rejected articles, no submission charges, and no surcharges based on the length of an article, figures or supplementary data. The MPC paid by the Author includes but is not limited to the following:

1. Article Production:	Type-setting, formatting, professional language editing, and production in PDF format.
2. Article Hosting and Dissemination:	Journal Indexing, Impact Factor Assessments, Website Hosting, Development and Maintenance, Graphic Designing, etc.
3. Journal Administration:	Managing the website of the Journal, Promotion of the website amongst the academic community and management of the Editorial Board.
4. Rewards:	In order to appreciate the important work done by our Panel of Reviewers, the Journal provides them with MPC discounts and waivers. The Journal also provides need-based discounts and waivers to deserving authors

who otherwise do not have the means to get
their manuscripts published.

These MPC's may not be construed in any manner as publishing charges, and are only charged in order to keep the Journal open-access.
