MADE FOR THIS How Fight Like A Girl

Genesis 21:9

9 And Sarah saw the son of Hagar the Egyptian, which she had born unto Abraham, mocking.10 Wherefore she said unto Abraham, Cast out this bondwoman and her son: for the son of this bondwoman shall not be heir with my son, even with Isaac.

2 Samuel 21:8-10

10 Rizpah daughter of Aiah took sackcloth and spread it out for herself on a rock. From the beginning of the harvest till the rain poured down from the heavens on the bodies, she did not let the birds touch them by day or the wild animals by night.

Rizpah took sackcloth and made the rock beneath her son's body her bed and protected their bodies both day and night from the elements and animals that were set to prey on the dead bodies. While she didn't have the authority to take the bodies of her sons to give them a proper burial, she wasn't going to let anyone or anything take them either. Talk about protection. It is estimated that she was there from five to ten months. Rizpah fought like a girl to **protect** her sons.





FIGHT FOR HONOR - ESTHER

There was a hit put out on Esther and her people. Haman communicated the execution plan to Esther and Esther went into action. She put together a strategy for everyone to fast for three days and nights. Because of the weight of this cause, Esther used her influence with her maidens and they also joined the fast.
