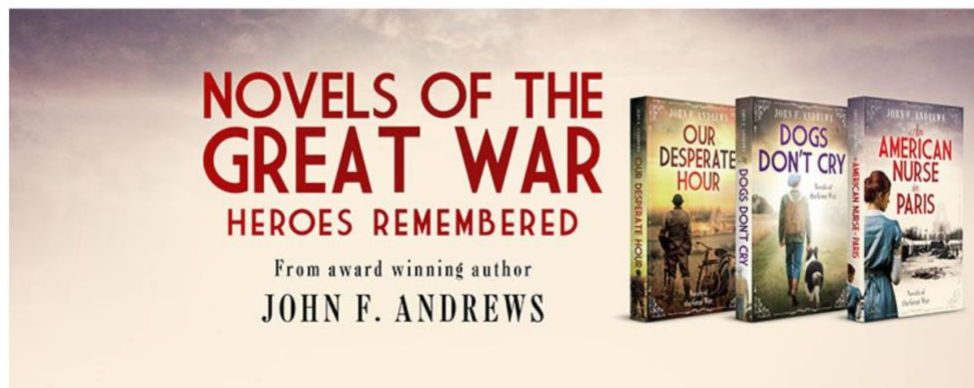
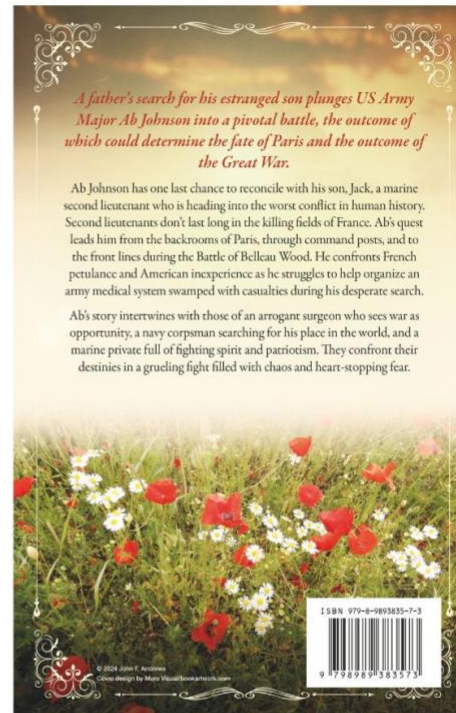
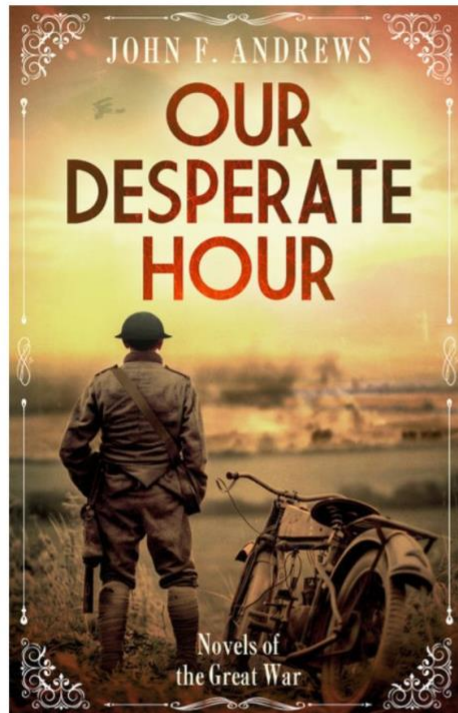

This is a remarkable book. Although a fictional account of the Marine Corps' baptism to the Great War, it reads like a war diary of the participants. Some characters are fictional, some are real people. However, the author has provided a vivid account in a highly readable style of the interactions of these personalities in a time of crisis. The two chapters on the aid station in Lucy le Bocage are a truly stunning account of the brutal realities of war up close and personal. Andrews takes the reader into the action and makes you feel as if you were there, experiencing the horrific scenes of war along with his characters. His descriptions of wounds and the effects of

There are many comparisons to be made to both fiction and non-fiction works based on WWI, but nothing stands out so much as Remarque's classic title ALL QUIET ON THE WESTERN FRONT. It also makes an interesting comparison to Andrews's book, as Remarque's work comes from the perspective of a German soldier. The similarities between the American soldier's experience in Andrews' book and that of Paul Baumer, the German soldier who is Remarque's protagonist, are uncanny. Both authors vividly describe the raw destruction of artillery and its effects on soldiers, the difficulty getting enough food, sleep, and supplies, the dirty, cramped, confused fighting, and the randomness of who lives and dies. Where they differ is that Andrews includes a bit more of the heroics, whereas Remarque refuses to move away from the gritty and pragmatic realism it is focused upon. Andrews' offering has more of a Hollywood blockbuster feel, while Remarque's work is better suited to an arthouse production.

Ab Johnson has one last chance to reconcile with his son, Jack, a marine second lieutenant who is heading into the worst conflict in human history. Second lieutenants don't last long in the killing fields of France. Ab volunteered to rejoin the army and come to France for a liaison job far from the fighting, only to be transferred to the Paris Medical Group. His quest leads him from the backrooms of Paris, through command posts, and to the front lines during the Battle of Belleau Wood. He confronts French petulance and American inexperience as he struggles to help organize an army medical system swamped with casualties during his desperate search.

Ab's story intertwines with three others: an arrogant surgeon who sees war as opportunity; a navy corpsman searching for his place in the world; and a marine private full of fighting spirit and patriotism. They confront their destinies in a grueling fight filled with chaos and heart-stopping fear. Each joined the war effort for his own reasons—now all they hope for is to survive.
