Compared with Beginning of the Year Planning, we note that

- In 2023, we have spent close to three times of the annual budget (\$27K vs \$11K), the majority of the spending come from donation related travel and activities.
- In 2023, we have made three more times of cash donation to more than ten non profit compared with the budgeting (\$20K vs \$6.5K). We firmly believe that as the second year of FF operation, we need to be proactive and active to have our brand known by the universities, hospitals, and local educational/cultural groups.
- Financial performance of the investment portfolio has been strong in 2023, with S&P 500 index at 18% and BRK.B at 15%. To fund the larger donations, FF decided to sell about \$10K worth of S&P index given its 18% annual growth rate, without draining the corpse of the fund assets.
