

Chesterfield has had it out for the Shoda family since William arrived at the mines. William's rise from being a low-life Hunk and miner, along with his association with African-Americans at Club 52, among other personal issues, has intensified his hatred for the Shodas.

30's. The oldest of the group yet the most immature and the biggest drinker.


ANTON 20's. The first to be there to help William and the most outspoken about poor conditions in the mines.

SEASON 1



Life is hard for the Shodas, especially in the beginning as children are born and not all survive. Mary, the only girl, is responsible for helping with her brothers.

By saving every penny they earned, Veda is able to buy land with a little house in Bluewell where the family builds Ruby's house and Club 52, a dinner club where stars are born and long-standing grievances play out.

Along the way, the family battles cultural prejudices, the KKK, mistreatment of immigrant coal miners, and the growing danger from Mary's ex-mother-in-law, Martha.

Their endurance and spirit are tested against overwhelming difficulties of the times.



SEASON 2

William passes and Veda continues as the inspirational head of the family.

Mary and Georgie run Club 52 despite the constant threats from the KKK, one of the Boarders being murdered, and Chesterfield's repeated attempts at trying to bring down their successful nightclub.

Mary juggles managing Club 52, holding close to her children and looking after family. She finds true love with Vinnie, but the constant struggle against their enemies takes a terrible toll in the hills and hollows of West Virginia.

SEASON 3

It is I956 and Club 52 is known as the place to go in Mercer County for entertainment and fun. After a hugely successful talent show highlights Eleanor as well as other well-known locals, opposing forces of the Shodas and Chesterfield get ready to have it out later that night. When the battle in the hills is over, both sides count their losses and look for revenge.

Mary is arrested for attempted murder and goes on the run, but eventually returns to fight for her children. She finds an unexpected ally in her ex, CL, who will no longer do Martha's bidding. The stakes are high as the final battle plays out.
