

Ingredients to Avoid in Cleaning Products

CHEMICAL	FOUND IN	HEALTH EFFECTS
Glycol Ethers (Most common type is 2-butoxyethanol)	Grease-cutters and window cleaners (Simple Green, Formula 409, Windex, etc.)	Liver cancer in lab animalsExposure by inhalation & skinCan go through rubber gloves
Alkylphenol Ethoxylates (Nonylphenol and Octylphenol; Nonoxynol)	Laundry detergents (may see them listed as "nonionic surfectants), cleaning products, paint, hair care products, pesticides	 Mimics estrogen Shown to multiply breast cancer cells in lab tests May disrupt immune system Bioaccumulates
Dye	All-purpose cleaners, window cleaners, toilet bowl cleaners, laundry detergent	Term used to hide chemical info; no sure what ingredients it contains
Ethanolamines: Monoethanolamine (MEA), Triethanolamine (TEA), Diethanolamine (DEA)	De-greasing formulas (Fantastik, Formula 409, Easy Off, etc.), laundry detergents	 Possible contamination with nitrosamines (carcinogens) Can trigger asthma attacks, even in those w/o asthma
Fragrance	Multi-purpose cleaners, floor cleaners, laundry detergent, dryer sheets, window cleaners, dish soap, dusting sprays	 Endocrine disruption Can be made up of hundreds, if not thousands of chemicals
Quaternary Ammonium Compounds (Benzalkonium Chloride)	Disinfecting sprays (Pine-Sol Cleaner & Anti-bacterial and Fantastik), fabric softeners and laundry detergents (Purex brand), oven cleaners, drain clog removers	 Can cause asthma and allergic reactions Can cause severe skin burns and eye damage
Synthetic Musk	Soap, cosmetics, laundry detergent, dryer sheets	 Enhances the effects of other toxic chemicals in products Bioaccumulates
Chlorinated Phenol	Toilet bowl cleaners	Toxic to the respiratory system
Diethylene Glycol	Window cleaners	Depresses the nervous system
Butyl Cellosolve	All-purpose and window cleaners	May damage liver, kidneys, bone marrow, and nervous system
Bleach	(Will be labeled "with bleach") Chlorine bleach, countertop sprays, toilet bowl cleaners	 Can cause irritation in the eyes, mouth, lungs, and skin Can be fatal if swallowed Is corrosive internally & externally
Ammonia	Window cleaners, metal polishers, stainless steel and brass polishes, some all-purpose cleaners (especially those labeled "Tough on Grease")	 Moderate risk for respiratory concerns Can cause dangerous, even deadly fumes, especially when mixed with bleach products
