

# REVIEW FROM MAR 3 STARTING STRONG APPELLATE ROLE OF COUNTY BOARDS

- Like most elected bodies, the county board of education hears and decides certain appeals.
- Unique to county boards is that they hear appeals from other local entities, school
  districts and charter schools authorized by district in the county.
- Matters brought before a county board on appeal consist of:
  - Student Expulsions from local districts
  - 2. Interdistrict transfer denials by local districts

# **COMPARING DEFINITIONS**

#### **Trustee Handbook**

Community Engagement (Ambassadorship)

The county board, at its discretion, may also hold board workshops and community forums on matters within their scope of representation. The county board may also decide to participate in local and regional organizations and events, in alignment with county superintendent, to represent and advocate for the interests of students served by the county office.

#### Advocacy

Entirely appropriate for county board to express support for [public education policies and standards that benefit county offices on behalf of students and communities we serve.

### **Dictionary**

#### Ambassador

Someone who represents and promotes a specific educational program, organization, or cause to a wider audience, engaging with students, parents, and community leaders to foster education and outreach

#### Advocate

Someone who supports students by promoting and justifying their educational rights, needs, and interests, by working with students, parents, educational institutions and legislative partners to ensure students receive necessary resources and accommodations



## COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AS AMBASSADORS

**Community Engagement or "Ambassadorship"** The county board, at its discretion, may also hold board workshops and community forums on matters within their scope of representation. The county board may also decide to participate in local and regional organizations and events, in alignment with county superintendent, to represent and advocate for the interests of students served by the county office.

Serving on county board committees


We recognize that community engagement activities will look different across counties depending on size, geography, and demographics



# **ADVOCACY**

**Advocacy** Entirely appropriate for county board to express support for public education policies and standards that benefit county offices on behalf of students and communities we serve.

### **4 Levels of Advocacy for Trustees**



**State** – Leveraging relationships with state representatives and attending town halls to build support for programs or initiatives

Community – Engage county broadly on topics relevant to their schools, students and needs

**Schools** – Gather insights from staff, students, and community to understand challenges and successes

**Board** – Use community insights and individual passions to set the board meeting agendas by bringing up issues and asking questions during board meetings.

#### Recommendations

#### **Board Meeting Agendas**

- Create item on agenda for future topics in meeting
- Meet with board president or tenured members

#### **School & Community Engagement**

- Attend district board meetings to share what county board does
- Build relationships with K12 trustees
- Engaging with county on relevant topics

#### State

- Setting meeting with your state rep and staff to build relationships
- Attend local legislative action days



# **ACCBE ADVOCACY COMMITTEE**

ACCBE has formed Advocacy Committee that will meet monthly to reviewing proposed legislation that impacts county offices and the students we serve.

#### **ADVOCACY COMMITTEE CHARGE**

Advisory Committee of the ACCBE Board

Join and attend subcommittee meetings

Monitor and analyze legislation and policies relevant to county offices

Recommend positions for to the Board to take publicly on legislation

Engage in the Legislative process

Educate Stakeholder and Communication

Build Coalitions with trustees and boards across the state

Develop ACCBE's annual advocacy agenda



# **ACCBE ADVOCACY COMMITTEE**

The Committee has met with Derick Lennox, Senior Director of Governmental Relations & Legal Affairs at California County Superintendents (CCS) to brief the Committee on CCS's 2025 legislative agenda.

#### **SUPPORTED BILLS**

**AB** 1224

(Valencia)

allows for substitute teachers to serve up to 60 days continuously in a classroom opposed to the current 30 day limit (20 for SPED).

**AB 927** 

(Sharp-Collins)

extending time for conducting Williams schools inspections

AB 959 (Hadwick)

allows County Offices of Education to offer administrative credential internships
