Hunger is a bigger challenge than Kovid-19: We all need to work together to fill the stomachs of people living below the poverty line: Shri Amiben Modi of Shri Seva Foundation in Ahmedabad distributed 3 lakh 70 thousand food kits to quench the hunger: Hungry NRI Shri Sandeep Mehta In addition to assistance provided free financial and legal guidance



Dubai: Mr Sandeep Mehta, a Dubai-based NRI, says hunger is a bigger challenge in the country than Kovid-19. Distributed food kits to the needy and also paid for 2500 food kits. Also in Ahmedabad, Ms. Amiben Modi of Shri Seva Foundation distributed 3 lakh 70 thousand food kits to alleviate the hunger.

He added, "I would like to describe my experience as an NRI on how we can serve the needy at home. To provide free

guidance on health management and tax savings to NRIs living in Dubai via email, with no courier charges." Providing legal guidance, arranging for free medical services through consulate, giving ten per cent relief in rent of property owned by me, purchasing PPE kits from wholesalers and providing them to the people of Gujarat at reduced prices, distribution of funds raised to help local service organizations Provide guidance for.

Besides, the work of giving individual donation of Rs. 50,000 each to NGOs in Ahmedabad, Surat and Rajkot for food distribution is under process, said Mr. Sandeep Mehta.

Regarding the services rendered to the Gujarati community in the UAE during the last 75 days, Mr. Mehta said that Ahmedabad distributed food kits through Shri Seva as well as Rs. 1 lakh to 2500 food kits to Gujaratis living in UAE as well as Indians Distributed 15 thousand food kits. Distributed food rations and groceries to the needy people living in Sharjah and Dubai who have lost their jobs. Medical checkup of Gujarati as well as non-Gujarati people was done in collaboration with Seva Mission. He wrote a letter to Gujarat Chief Minister Vijay Rupani and Union Minister Hardeep Puri requesting them to increase the flight of Vande Bharat Mission so that those stranded in Sharjah and Dubai could go home due to Kovid-19. Made efforts. Provided legal guidance. Guided the young generation on positive thinking. Also held discussions with local consulate staff to resolve the issues of Gujaratis. They prefer to help the needy instead of using Facebook as a WhatsApp.

Due to this service campaign run by Mr. Mehta, about 20 thousand Gujaratis living in UAE have been helped. Among those who have helped in this service work are Jain leader Mr. Chetanbhai Karani, Patel Samaj Leader Mr. Bharatbhai Naroda, Gujarati Community Leader Mr. Jawaharbhai Mehta. , Gujarati and Rajasthani community leader Shri Nimishabhai Makwana, Jain community leader Shri Rajubhai Kothari, Shri Dilipbhai Soni of Soni Samaj, Shri Ketanbhai Shah, son of late Bharatbhai Shah, Diamond community member Shri Tarunbhai Bhodia, among others.

He has also raised the issue of malnutrition and the health issues caused by it. He has also worked to raise the red light against the society.
