From Quilts for Kids founder, Linda Arye

Quilts were sent to Indonesia in January to an area where many were killed by volcanic eruption. The kids received a loaf of bread with their comfort quilt. This project was in conjunction with the local Rotaract Club, a community or college-based club sponsored by a Rotary Club. Linda Arye, a Rotarian in Pennsylvania, made the connection through her club to help these orphaned children to give them a quilt of their own.
