Before my surgery, I delivered 24 quilts to the Gainesville office of UMChildren's Home. Today I delivered 20 more quilts to DFCS who is the other half of the Foster Care Program in Hall County. This will be an ongoing opportunity for us to comfort kids who are in need of some love. So keep those quilts coming in.

We are also working on adding another workshop/delivery to a different portion of our geography. More about that later. There will be many ways for you to participate.

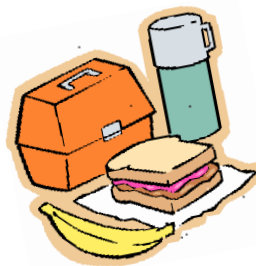
