# **Annual Meeting of the Gasconade Valley Baptist Association**

Gasconade Valley Baptist Camp

Sunday September 29, 2024

The 149th Annual Meeting of the Gasconade Valley Baptist Association met at the Gasconade Valley Baptist Camp in Bland on Sunday, September 29, 2024. Thirteen pastors, twenty-three executive board members, twenty-two messengers, and twenty-three guests were present. A total of eighty-one people were in attendance, representing twenty-one churches.

At 3:00 pm, Moderator David Krueger called the meeting to order. Director of Missions, Trent Young, welcomed everyone and announced that the association will be starting the 150th year. Trent gave appreciation to the people in the association who work in the camp and churches, he then led a prayer. Trent and Dana Young sang a song and then Terrlyne Stockton led a congregational hymn, with Dana Young playing the piano.

The memorial committee, Tim Redmond and Terrlyne Stockton, read the names of those who had passed away in the association during the previous year.

Pastor Bill Rogers from Liberty Road Church delivered the annual message from 2 Corinthians 5:11-21.

Clerk, Megan Wood, moved that the messengers are seated as elected by the churches. Perry Wolfe seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Clerk, Megan Wood, presented a motion to adopt the agenda as printed in the book of reports; Perry Wolfe seconded the motion, and it carried.

The clerk's report by Megan Wood was presented in the book of reports.

Treasurer, Denise Jarvis, explained the treasurer's report and the overspends that were listed due to unforeseen circumstances. All the mattresses were replaced and were funded through donations and the camp improvement fund. The budget should not be affected next year.

Beth Sieg spoke for the children's camp and said there were many new campers and seven decisions were made. She has a written report.

Scott John was not present but had a written church security report. Trent Young shared there will be a church security and safety training at the camp.

Kerry and Avis High, evangelism directors, shared that there were two people saved in the tent during the State Fair Ministry. They have a written report.

Kim Sparks shared about GriefShare. There have been three, thirteen-week sessions in two years. A Surviving the Holidays group will be meeting on November 9 at First Belle.

The Ministry wives report was printed in the book of reports. Dana Young is thankful for all the help she receives.

Dana Young also shared about the upcoming mission opportunities, and they are listed in the book of reports, however, some mission experiences were also shared. There was a group that went to the Voice of the Martyrs, and they will be going again in January 2025. Tom Green shared about the trip they went on this past January and more about the Voice of the Martyrs organization. Wayne Heet shared about the Hannibal LaGrange Mission Trip and all the fun that is had. The first week of June 2025 will be the 30<sup>th</sup> year for GVBA to take volunteer groups to work at HLGU. Trent has applied for summer missionaries for next summer through Texas Baptist Collegiate Ministries. He really appreciated the work of summer missionary Caleb Beall who stayed this past summer. Trent and Dana are hoping to take another group to Poland again and are willing to present their recent experience to the churches.

Michelle Warth shared her experiences about her trip to Ethiopia with Be There Ministries. They were able to provide shoes, education for adult males and children, and support to young single mothers. She also has a report in the book of reports.



Music director, Terrlyne Stockton, shared there recently was an association sing at Pilot Knob which had the largest gathering. The next association sing will be in March; still looking for a location.

Mary Moore shared about Operation Christmas Child and dates of opportunities that are available for volunteers, these are printed in the book of reports. Last year the association collected 1976 boxes at the drop-off location in Belle.

Pastoral Ministries Director, David Krueger, would like to start a new study on “what it means to have a biblical worldview”. He has a report in the book of reports.

Prayer Coordinator, Debbie Green, shared that there are four prayer rallies a year. This year she wants to ask churches what their needs are in community, area, and ministry. She led a prayer specifically for Israel, hurricane victims, and our nation. She has a printed report in the book of report.

Russ Walje shared the trustees report which was handed out separate from the book of reports. Future plans are to create a memorial trail for Phil and Gail Rector and build a pond. A picture of the plans is included in the book of reports.

There was no report for WMU.

Youth Camp Director, Tonia Sousa was not in attendance, but Chris Slocum shared about youth camp. Volunteers for camp are welcome whenever they are able to help. There was one declaration of salvation. There is a report in the book of reports.

Motion presented and carried that all reports be accepted as given.

Bruce Wade from Missouri University of Science and Technology Baptist Student Union was present. He had a report in the book of reports. Despite having many students graduate last spring, they are having a larger attendance this fall.

David Krueger reported that the Missouri State Tech Lighthouse Christian Fellowship numbers are down due to graduation. More churches are needed to help provide food for meetings.

Kenny Vawter from Missouri Baptist Children's home did not give a report, as he arrived after ministry recognition.

Terry Robertson shared the new budget, which is presented in the book of reports.

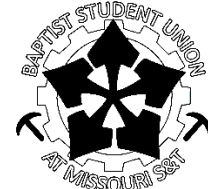

## **Church Security Report**

We are excited to be presenting the Church Security course at the GVBA Campground on October 12<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 AM. The instructors will be Kenny Kilmer and Scott John. Both of us have been civilian law enforcement officers in Missouri for 10 years and have military backgrounds pertinent to the instruction of this course.

This will be an all day event with classroom instruction, classroom hands-on exercises, and live fire drills at the shooting range. This will be a course for everyone, including those who choose not to carry a firearm, as security teams will also need people trained in advanced first aid.

The morning session will include classroom instruction, advanced first aid hands-on exercises, and role playing. The afternoon session will be for those wanting to stay for the firearms portion of training. This will not be for those just learning to handle a firearm.

Observers are permitted but those participating should have experience handling a handgun. Those who intend to shoot must bring:

- Concealable firearm (no old school cowboy revolver style guns. Should be conventional firearm)
- Minimum of 2 magazines for weapon
- MUST have a quality holster that securely holds firearm (flimsy nylon holsters are not recommended)
- Hearing protection (recommend electronic style hearing protection that allows to listen to instruction)
- Eye protection
- 150 rounds of ammunition
- Appropriate outdoor clothing for forecasted weather
- Range gear such as towel, sunscreen, water, etc.

Topics of training will include:

- Why have security teams in a church? Is it biblical?
- What church security teams should plan for and the #1 incident to prepare for
- Security concepts for door greeters
- Advanced first aid considerations and what to have at the church in your "Response Bag"
- Basic firearms fundamentals & malfunction drills
- Basic room clearing tactics & weapon retention
- Basic firearms qualification course

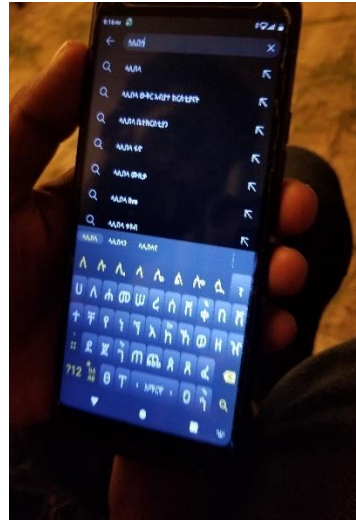

We had a team of 4 determined women. In Luke 18 God talks about the persistent woman - imagine having 4. We conducted Bible studies, passed out 62 pairs of shoes, passed out Amharic bibles and also digital Amharic bibles. We were able to buy a stove for one of the five homes we have for street kids.

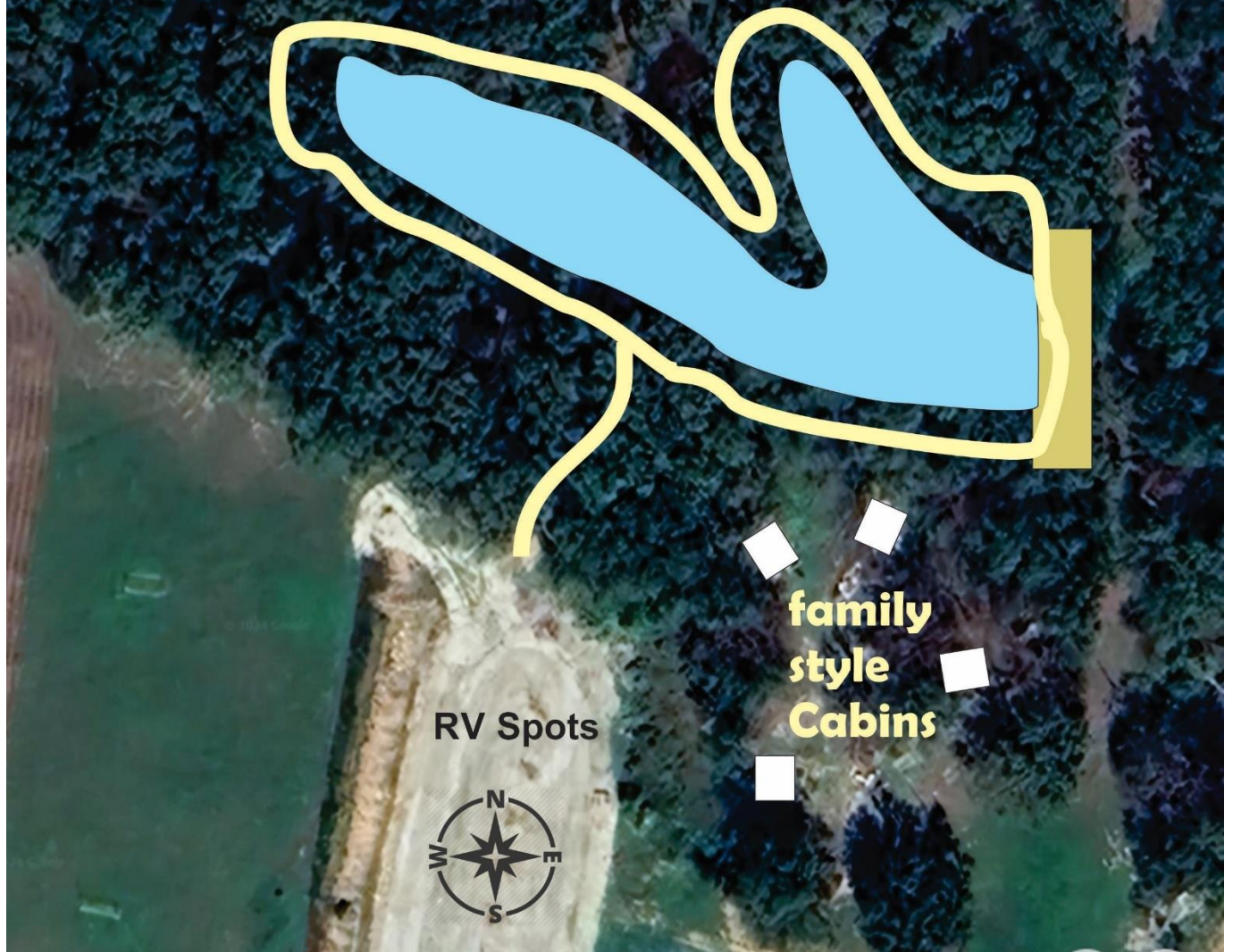
We were also able to do much needed landscaping around the outdoor amphitheater and the demolition of four old cabins located on the north side of the campgrounds.

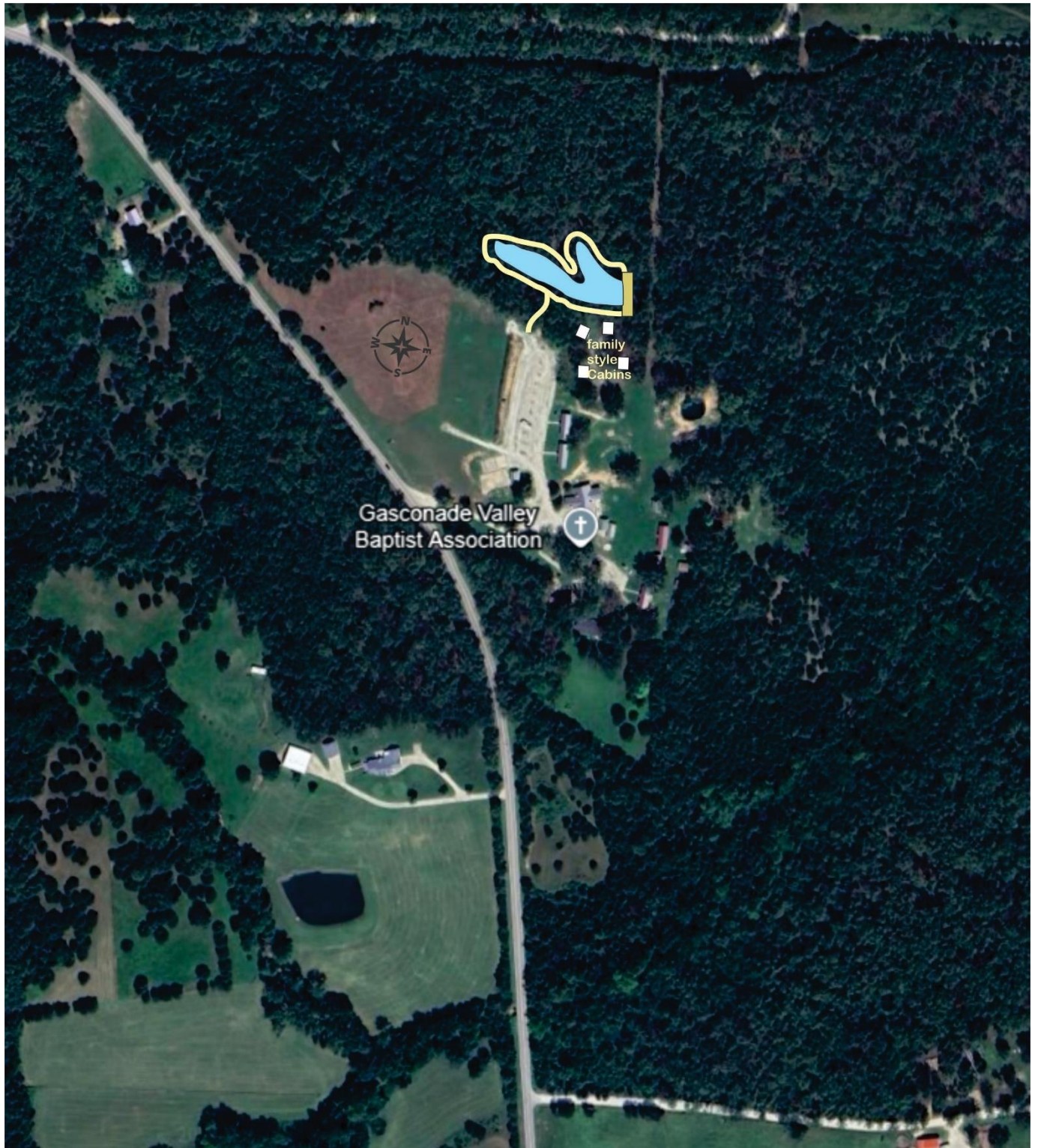

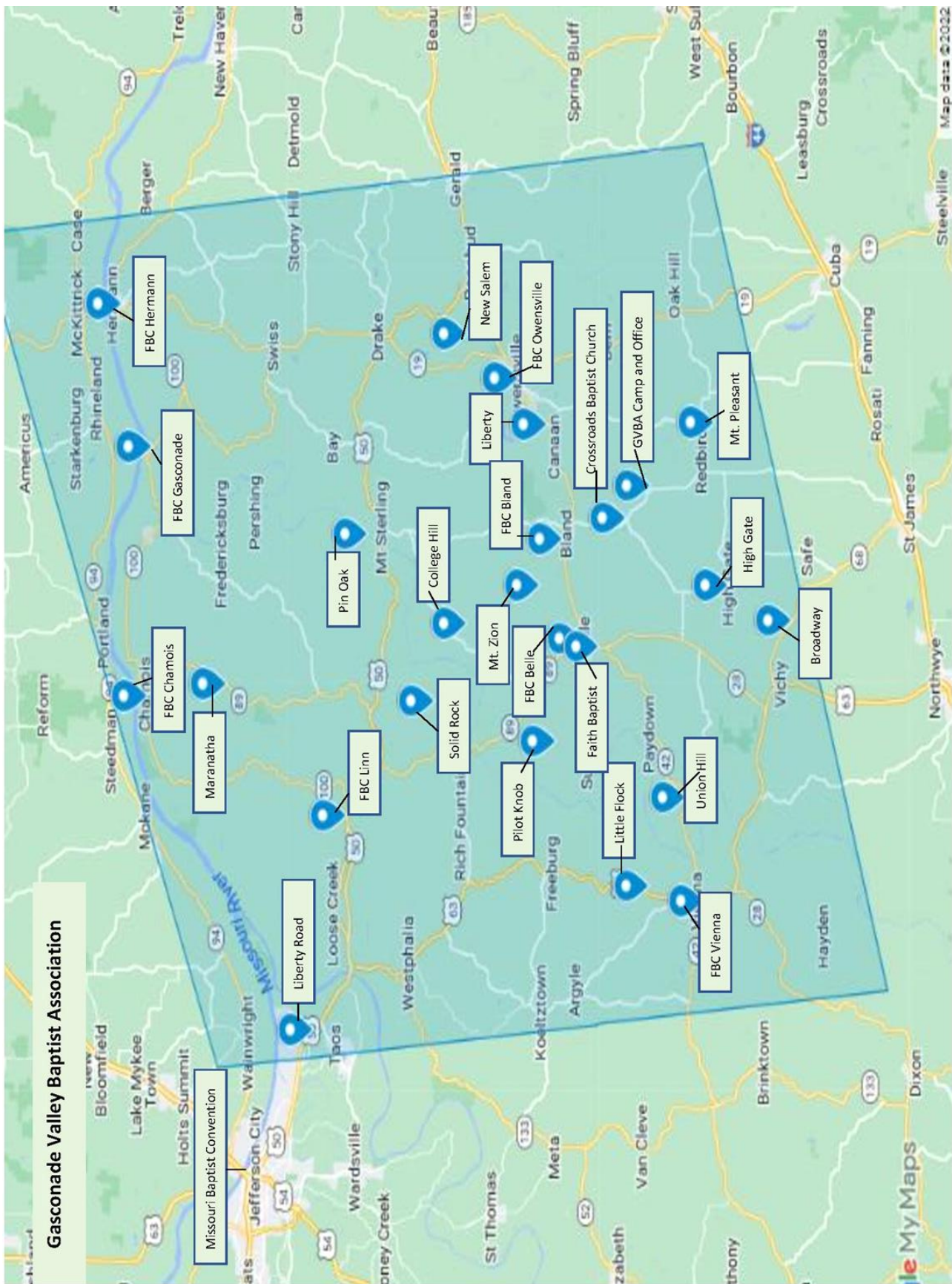
# Phil & Gail Rector Prayer Journey





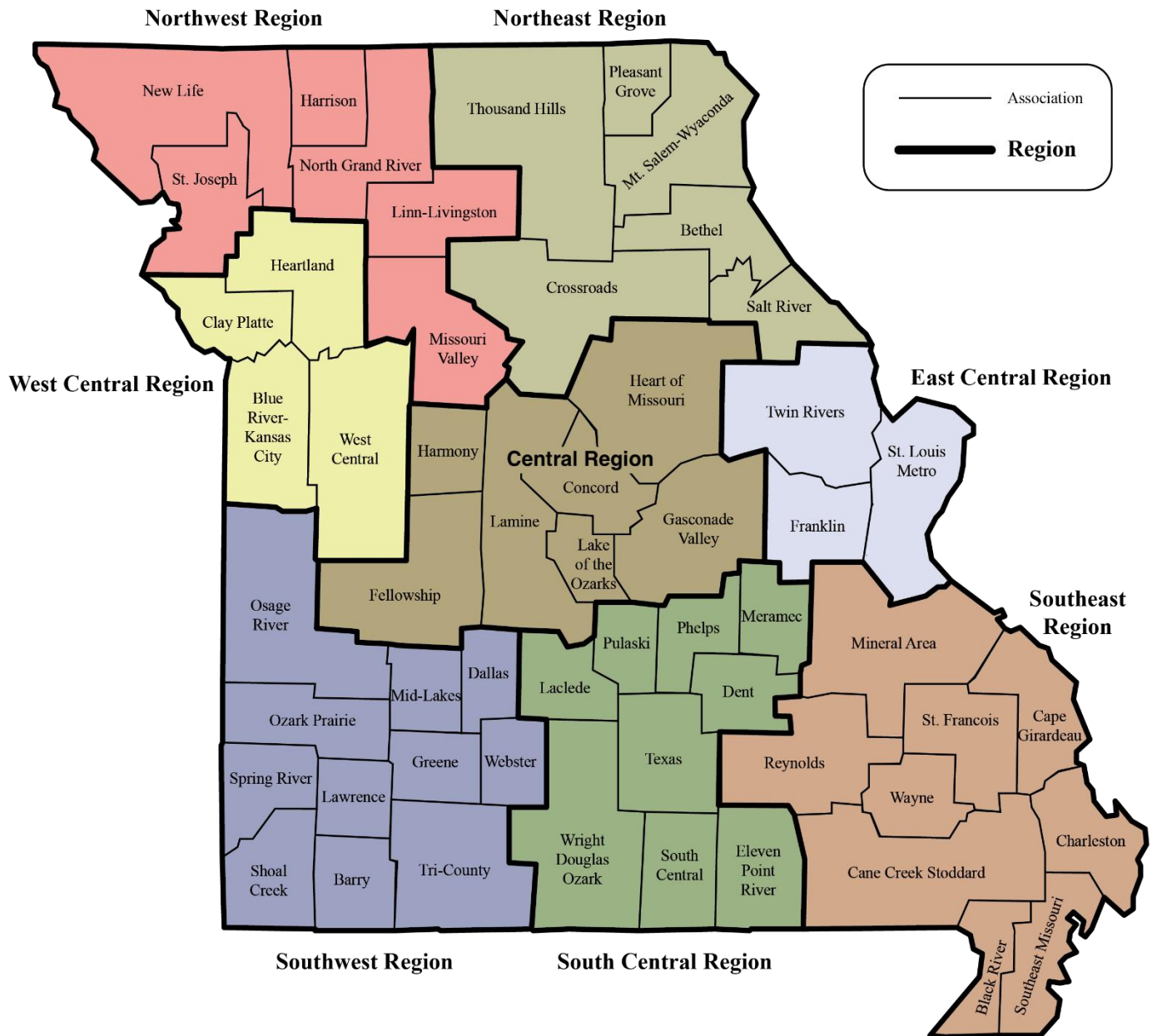
