Proceedings of the 150th Annual Meeting of the Gasconade Valley Baptist Association Faith Baptist Church, Belle Sunday, September 28, 2025

Session 1

The 150th annual meeting of the Gasconade Valley Baptist Association met at Faith Baptist Church in Belle on Sunday, September 28, 2025. There was a total of eighty-eight people present including: eleven pastors, twenty-seven executive board members, twenty-five messengers, and twenty-five guests.

At 3:00 pm, moderator Roger Jett called the meeting to order.

Director of Missions, Trent Young, recognized pastor Tim Redmond and Faith Baptist Church for hosting the meeting. The MBC state executive director sent a plaque recognizing the 150th celebration and congressman, Bob Onder, sent a letter of congratulations for reaching the milestone. The association exists to help the churches. The churches exist to find the lost and develop the saved. Trent shared a video the Chris Slocum family put together about New City Catechism which trains theology of the Bible. Trent had a written report.

Terryllyne Stockton led a congregational hymn with Barbara Branson accompanying her on piano.

Shelba Knight from the memorial committee read the names of those who had passed away in the association during the year. Dana Young played *Amazing Grace* on the piano. The names were printed in the book of reports.

Pastor Jim Chilton from Liberty Baptist Church, in Owensville gave the message. We need to be praying for one another and that the message resonates throughout our lives.

Terryllyne led a congregational hymn with Barbara accompanying her.

Clerk Megan Wood made a motion to seat the messengers as elected by the churches. Sam Crowder gave the second. Megan gave a motion to adopt the agenda as printed in the book of reports. Roy Newman gave the second.

The clerk's report was presented in the book of reports.

Treasurer, Denise Jarvis, had a written report showing figures through August.

A motion was made by Perry Wolfe to accept the clerk and treasurer reports and seconded by Linda Myeburger.

Children's camp director, Beth Sieg, had a written report and shared that there were 56 campers. Six decisions were made.

Evangelism directors, Kerry and Avis High, had a written report. Kerry shared that twelve adults and five children worked the Baptist tent at the State Fair and five people received Jesus as their Savior.

Hannibal- LaGrange University mission trip leaders, Wayne and Valerie Heet were not present but had a written report. Roger Jett shared there are projects at HLG that anyone can do.

Ministry Wives director, Dana Young, had a written report. She mentioned that there are new pastors including: Noble Hower at First Belle, Mike Anderson at Broadway in St. James, David Lewis at First Linn, and Jacob Giedinghagen Youth Director at First Owensville. There are also retiring pastors including: Danny Jarvis from Crossroads, Doug Lane from Mt. Zion, and Russell Walje from Pilot Knob.

Dana had a written report for mission opportunities. The summer missionaries, Madi-Lynne and Jessa, were a blessing to the association over the summer. Upcoming mission trips include Operation Christmas Child and Voice of the Martyrs.

Music leader, Terryllyne Stockton, did not have a written report but shared that her time as director will be over. She encouraged all churches to send at least two people to the associational sings.

Operation Christmas Child leader, Mary Moore, had a written report. There are upcoming opportunities to help with the mission. Samaritan's Purse changed its focus to "It's All About Jesus".

Pastoral Ministries director, David Krueger, had a printed report. He reminded the group that October is pastor appreciation month, and August is calling out the called month.

Prayer director, Debbie Green, was not in attendance but had a written report.

The trustees had a written report. Russell Walje, trustee chair, shared that they repurposed some sheds, completed a family cabin, drilled a new well, and cut three miles of trails. He also shared that they have come up with a list of projects they want to complete over the next five years to include: build a worship chapel and lake, do a kitchen remodel, find a camp manager, add three more family cabins, and build a dual sided multi-purpose cabin. There are also smaller opportunities individuals and churches can complete.

WMU and Women's Ministry director, Juliana Rhea had a written report. WMU is now sending materials three months at a time. There is a new book out called, "Meet Annie and Lottie" that explains the start of our mission offerings.

Youth Director, Chris Slocum, had a written report. He shared that next year, Russell Walje will be the camp director. Over sixty kids attended youth camp, many of them were not a part of our churches or even heard of Jesus. There were a dozen students who made a commitment to faith.

Dan Mckinney of the audit committee would like church treasurers to fill out the audit as soon as possible.

Kenny Vawter, from Missouri Baptist Children's Home did not have a written report but was present. The children's home had nineteen salvations and baptisms last year. There are new ministries including inhome visits in Kansas City and St. Louis to share Jesus.

Troy Sousa shared that the Lighthouse at State Tech has twenty students regularly attending Bible studies. He asked that each church provide a bag of groceries from a list provided for "grocery bingo". Last year grocery bingo served 120 students.

Matt Wheeler shared that First Hermann has started Celebrate Recovery and are having fifteen to forty people per meeting. Celebrate Recovery serves those who have a habit, hurt, or hang up.

Roy Newman made the motion to accept all reports and Perry Wolfe gave the second.

Session Two

Juliana Rhea requests a onetime \$200 be added to WMU budget. Motion made by Rowena Uptergrove and seconded by Sally Borzillo. Motion passes.

Terry Robertson, budget committee, had a proposal for the budget printed in the book of reports. The budget will increase two and one-quarter percent from the previous year. The WMU proposed amount will change back to the current \$400 due to the passing of the request by Juliana Rhea. The motion comes from the finance committee and is approved.

Director of Missions, Trent Young, shared the calendar for the 2025-2026 year, which is printed in the book of reports.

Roger Jett directed our attention to his list of moderator appointments printed in the book of reports. Roger also read the Resolution in Recognition of the 150th Anniversary of Gasconade Valley Baptist Association printed in the book of reports.

Barbara Branson, on behalf of the nomination committee, asked for approval for the nominees for the 2025-2026 associational year. Nominees were accepted and are listed in the book of reports.

Chris Slocum presented the report for the Time, Place, and Preacher Committee.

Pastor Tim Redmond gave the closing prayer.

The motion to adjourn was given by James Uptergrove and seconded by Jim Lehnhoff.

Trustee's Report for 2025 Annual Meeting

It has been a busy year since our last annual meeting. I wanted to remind everyone again just what God has done over the course of one year.

Since last year's meeting, we have completed the following: the repurposing of two sheds, building five low end challenge courses, cutting a three mile trail through the property, the completion of a family cabin, drilling a new well which has greatly increased water pressure throughout the camp, landscaping improvements, and the planting of several new trees. We have also improved cabins with new mattresses and bed frames for leaders.

The Lord continues to pour out his love and blessings toward camp. Trent asked the Trustees to seek God's will regarding a five-year plan. We met in August and came up with what we felt God was leading us toward.

Major Projects for the next 5 years

#1-Worship Chapel. After much discussion and prayer, we felt the camp is in need of a separate worship area. The dining hall has served the camp for decades as a cafeteria, recreational area and worship center. However, we feel a Chapel would provide a better atmosphere and reverence for worship. It would also provide associational churches the opportunity to gather for fellowship and special worship services.

#2-A Lake. We believe a lake below the amphitheater would provide beauty and many opportunities for families and groups to gather for outdoor services, weddings, camp devotions, and fishing enthusiasts.

#3-Kitchen remodel. It has been suggested that our kitchen is in need of some upgrading and reorganizing.

#4-A Camp Manager. With all the improvements to our campus and the desire to reach more people with the gospel, a camp manager is something our Association needs to consider. The increase in scheduling and maintaining our camp is a heavy burden for Trent and Dana. We are seeking God's leadership as to a person or persons who could help with this added responsibility.

#5-Add 3 more Family Cabins. We want to provide families and pastors with the opportunity to get away for a weekend and enjoy what our camp has to offer.

#6-Dual sided Multi-purpose cabin. This cabin will be constructed in much the same way as our existing cabins, but it will have a common area with a small kitchenette, so churches can have weekend youth, college, or adult retreats and discipleship conferences.

The order in which these ministry goals take place may vary, but the trustees feel these improvements will provide our Association with tremendous opportunities to reach more people with the love of Christ.

Short Term Projects

We have some additional needs that churches or individuals could sign up to do that would greatly improve our camp.

- 1. Clear off areas for primitive camping spots.
- 2. Complete siding on old cabins.
- 3. Add shelves in the kitchen and north end of the dining hall.
- 4. Add more low ropes elements
- 5. Canopy over Gaga Ball pit.
- 6. Stop water under bathroom addition.
- 7. Build playground equipment.
- 8. Transform storage shed by Gaga ball pit into a snack shack and nurse's station.
- 9. Add a disc golf course.
- 10. Add additional lighting around camp.
- 11. Build 8 new beds and add railing plus stain.
- 12. Purchase a new freezer.
- 13. Longer shower curtains for boys shower.

If anyone would like to donate funds toward any of these projects or assist in constructing them, please contact Trent and Dana.


