



The Commonwealth of World Chinatowns

The Commonwealth of World Chinatowns (CWC) is a platform inspired by the histories of Chinatowns in Penang and Singapore. It explores the multicultural contexts of these two cities and their historical connections to China, Asia and the wider world. The project emphasises the exchange of knowledge, languages, science and the arts, highlighting the relationship between modernity and postcolonial transitions. Its goal is to develop initiatives through a global network of Chinatowns and beyond, fostering multi-ethnic and intercultural learning while expanding the frontiers of human knowledge.

"Double Vision" is a representation of the two Chinatowns located in Singapore and Penang. It is a recording of the visual history through the depiction of the buildings that can be found in the two sites. Visual sources of these buildings were obtained online - primarily from tourism websites, travel blogs, Google Map Streetview and images Internet strangers uploaded on Google Map. Three panels from viewer's right were composed based on the buildings located in the Chinatown in Singapore and those on the left were of Penang.

Chua Say Hua

A graduate from the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts in 1992 with a Diploma in Fine Arts, he went on to receive his Bachelor's degree in Fine Arts (High Distinction) in 1994 from the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology, Australia. In 1997, he obtained his Postgraduate Certificate in Fine Arts from Goldsmiths College, University of London.

Say Hua won many art awards including the Most Promising Young Artist award by the Philippe Charriol Foundation in 1993, Juror's Prize awarded by Philip Morris Group of Companies Singapore Art Awards in 1995, and the first prize in Expressions in Art by Singapore Telecoms in 2001. He was awarded The Young Artist Award by the National Arts Council of Singapore in 2001 for his outstanding achievements and contributions to visual arts.


In 2014, he received the Silver Award for the Established Artist Category with his ink-and-pigment abstract piece titled *Wall of Inscriptions*.

Hong Sek Chern

Explores various themes within urban settings in her paintings. She focuses on exploring Chinese ink painting to discover new possibilities with the traditional medium. A Diploma in Fine Art graduate from the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts in 1995 Sek Chern has also received her Master of Fine Arts from Goldsmiths College, University of London.

Sek Chern has held seven solo exhibitions in Singapore and participated in group exhibitions held locally and overseas. She was recipient of the Young Artist Award from the National Arts Council, Singapore in 2000. Sek Chern was selected to participate in the President Young Artist Show organised by the Singapore Art Museum in 2001.

She represented Singapore at the 25th Sao Paolo Biennale in 2002 and the 5th International Ink Painting Biennial of Shenzhen in 2006.


Stella Kon's one-woman play, *Emily of Emerald Hill*, took audiences by storm when it first appeared forty years ago.

The play won top prize in the 1983 Singapore Playwriting competition, but Singapore directors were initially hesitant to take on the challenges of one actor representing many characters on stage. Malaysian director Chin San Sooi took the first plunge in 1984 with actress Leow Puay Tin, followed in Singapore the next year by Max Le Blond with Margaret Chan who stepped forward bravely though she was pregnant at the time.

Audiences in Singapore and Malaysia gave "Emily" a rapturous welcome. They saw in her their own mothers, grandmother, aunts; a universal woman firmly rooted in a local context, speaking in local accents of heartaches with which all could identify.

The play was acted in Mandarin, translated into Icelandic and Kannada, and played by a man (the immortal Ivan Heng.) It has been seen, by some counts, up to a thousand times, in various countries including Britain, China, and America.

Dinner with Emily has been specially written by Stella Kon, to allow music to express feelings more deeply than can the spoken word. Desmond Moey's melodies highlight the tumultuous emotions. As in the stage play, each singer may take multiple roles, to fill out the key scenes of Emily's life and times.
