



- Noncompliance is contagious. When we express our values boldly and publicly, we remind others that they're not alone.
- Wear your resistance on your sleeve, be it with buttons, T-shirts, or signs in your window.
- Host a weekly pop-up protest at your corner. Make signs, play music, get cars to honk, dance with passersby. Build community through collective, grassroots protest.
- Join the Visibility Brigade movement and spell out a message on a bridge or overpass near you, or put resistance stickers around the neighborhood.

4. (MORE) POWER TO THE PEOPLE

- This imperfect democracy is our inheritance, to be protected and bettered for generations to come. Sustaining it is our right and our responsibility.
- Reach out to your representatives and demand that they stand up for us (5calls.org). Call your senators like you do your laundry: at least once a week.
- Spend wisely and locally. Boycott (or reduce your reliance on) corporations that support authoritarianism. (We're looking at you, Amazon!)
- Donate to, and canvass for, candidates who reject Big Money and stand up to fascism.
- Come to the next protest or rally!



- Building a community means looking out for all our neighbors, especially the most vulnerable. This regime's vision of the world is cruel and selfish, but we're building a better world that reflects our interconnectedness.
- Create and sustain communities of care and mutual aid wherever you can. Help communal fridge, or send funds to support families whose relatives have been taken by ICE.
- Interrupt ICE abductions by joining a rapid-response group in your neighborhood. Use your constitutional right to record and document ICE activity. Print and distribute ICE-watch zines.

- Fascism depends on isolation. The more we can connect with one another IRL, the more resilient we become.
- So talk to your neighbors. Talk a lot. Even if it's about the weather, or Bad Bunny's new album, or the new spot down the block. But also: make it a point to talk to people about this dictatorial administration's abuses of power, its cruelty, corruption, and greed.
- Invite people to take action together. Write postcards to voters. Raise money for a worthy cause, or fold zines like this one.
- Silence becomes tacit consent, and now is the time for us all to be loud.
