


MARK YOUR CALENDARS!

Quilt Show Dates: Friday, 15 May 2026 and Sat, 16 May 2026

We are so grateful to all of the subchairs from last year that have volunteered to continue in their roles!! Without them, the show just would not happen! As with every year, however, we do need some new helpers:

- 1. **Hoffman Installation** -this is a one morning commitment on the Wednesday before the show. We need at least two people who can climb up and down ladders to hang the Hoffman Exhibit. Brenda Moore will coordinate getting the trunks, as usual, but we need some able bodies to actually hang it. Finding someone to do this seems to be a problem every year as many of our members are getting older. Safety must come first! If we don't get any volunteers, maybe we need to consider not having the Hoffman at our show. We know that our members and guests really enjoy it but the issue of putting it up still remains.
- 2. **Show Designer**-Melody has been designing our show for many years but is ready to teach someone(s) to do it so that she can retire. This is a commitment that usually takes up the week before the show after all the entries are submitted. Several people have helped out in the past so we're hoping some of you may be ready to step up to be the co-subchair and eventually take over the job.
- 3. **Basket Raffle** Burma needs someone to assist in taking in the basket raffle items, setting up the baskets, wrapping them and then transporting them to the show.
- 4. **Opportunity Quilt Ticket Sales** Susan Allers needs someone to assist with the ticket distribution, scheduling who is taking the quilt out to display, collecting stubs/money, etc.

PLEASE consider volunteering for one of these positions if you are not already serving as a subchair. There will be someone else to show you the ropes, you won't be on your own! It really does take a village to put on the quilt show! We are trying to make sure that we have two people filling each subchair position so that there is no gap if someone gets sick or has other issues to deal with. (Best Press substitute)


To Make 19 ounces:

- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp essential oil (if desired for scent

- 1 drop food coloring per gallon of water (if desired)




